A good cover crop protects sail rom wind and water erosin, helps to hold not in place, and holds rain water on the land for inter my by plants.

It prevents loss of nutrients by leaching, retarding downward movement of water and enabling the plants to take up a large por When the cover crop is plowed under at maturity, the nutrient lements are released for use by

the following crop.
Plowed under, a coverage crop dds organic matter to the soil. brings nutrient elements from beon the surface and deposits them where they can be used by other plants, helps to control weeds, and if the cover crop is an inoculated legame, adds appreciable nitrogen






