

Lakefront condos in Sanford?

Rami Yosefian wants to build 8-story complex on courthouse parking lot

SANFORD - In the debate on how best to revitalize Sanford's downtown, developer Rami Yosefian unveiled a new twist - a \$22 million, eight-story luxury condominium plan for the city's lakefront.

Yosefian presented the plan to business and community leaders at the Downtown Business Association meeting. He told the group he was bullish on Sanford's potential and believed his proposal would give a spark redevelopment in downtown.

"People ask me why I buy property in Sanford," Yosefian said. "I own property in Winter Park, in Apopka, and in Orlando, but none of them are going to be worth what the (property) in Sanford is going to be worth." The project would be located on the

east side of the Seminole County Courthouse on 2.7 acres of city land currently used for parking. The plan calls for a three-story interior parking garage with a capacity for 550 vehic



Schools in Seminole County were open for less than two weeks before a school bus became involved in an accident. Early Thursday morning, on U.S. Highway 17-92 in front of Regatta Shores Apartments on the Lake Monroe lakefront, a vehicle struck a school bus. The accident was minor however and there were apparently no injuries reported. Sanford police said the bus was stopped at the Regatta Shores apartments to pick up students, when a 1997 Mercury, heading in the same direction, failed to stop in time causing it to strike the rear of the bus. The driver of the car, Lorayne Ryan Lee of Sanford, was charged with careless driving. There were approximately 16 students in the school bus at the time of the collision. All of them, although delayed for a time, were bussed to their school and did not require medical attention. The school bus was en route to Hamilton Elementary School. Morning rush hour traffic was detoured.

Police arrest suspect in Service Merchandise robbery

SANFORD — Police arrested Adria Michelle Brown, 24, of Willow Avenue, Sanford, for rob-bing the Service Merchandise. According to the arrest

report, officers responded Wednesday morning to a robbery in progress call at 111 Towne Center Circle. The subjects had reportedly left the area in a gray Oldsmobile, and were traveling east on SR-46, followed by a witness who was informing police of the direction of travel.

A female store employee told

police she had seen a black male Oldsmobile told police the car and female enter the store, the female with a purse that appeared to be empty. When the couple left, she said the purse seemed to be full of merchandise. She approached the female and asked to see what was in her purse but the woman reportedly pushed her away and fled out the door.

When the two got into the vehicle, the woman dropped the purse containing the merchandise. Approximately \$140 worth of items were in the purse, as well as a wallet which identified the woman.

crashed between two slabs of concrete at the intersection of 12th Street and Pecan Avenue. The driver, identified as Brown, and two passengers fled from the car and ran off on foot.

Brown was apprehended shortly after the accident near 13th Street and Southwest Road. She was taken into custody and transported to the Seminole County Jail, where she is being held on \$4,000 bond.



DEAR CONCERNED MOM: You describe an accident waiting to happen. Your ex and sister are ignorant about the safety of your child, so it is up to you to see that he is kept out of harm's way.

Do not allow him to visit either of them until you are confident he can swim. Even then, insist that your ex have the pool fenced, and your sister keep the gate closed and locked when your son is visiting - unless an adult is present at the pool. Until your son is older and

the children of our seniors.

You have NOT become your parent's parent. You do NOT have autonomy when it comes to decisions about your parents' lives. What you do have is the obligation to assist your parent in making informed, appropriate choices. This means when your parent needs help with anything from finances to daily care, you gather information and then discuss the choices with your parents. Then, as a family, you arrive at decisions - but your parents have the final say.

Even people who have memory problems, such as earlystage dementia or Alzheimer's disease, retain some ability to provide input into decisions regarding their care and living arrangements.

For those with aging parents, my message is that you AND your parent should start visiting independent and assisted-living homes, rehabilitation centers and nursing homes. Gather as much information as possible. Sit down with Mom or Dad and discuss scenarios that "could" happen - such as memory loss, hip fracture, etc. Helping your parents make choices in advance will prevent decisions made from panic, instead of

logic.

Our biggest fear is of the unknown. Our seniors have earned the right not to worry,

"What will happen if I can't take care of myself anymore?" They deserve the right to make that choice for themselves. **ADVOCATE FOR OUR** SENIORS

DEAR ADVOCATE: 1 agree. Mentally competent seniors have the right to choose where they live, where they get medical treatment and how they spend their money.

They may have slowed down a bit - and frustrate their adult children - but they are functional adults who deserve to be respected.



afternoon. The specific facts of the case remain sealed in court files, but in general, the gang Rivera allegedly headed was involved in violent crimes and illegal drug sales.

'Our investigators say Rivera slips around quickly," Sheriff's Office spokesman Steve Olson said Thursday. "The address we have on him is his mother's on-Elm Street in Casselberry."

Circuit Court Judge Kenneth Lester signed the warrant on the charges and the bond for Rivera, who will be 20 on Nov. 1. He was described as a white male with brown eyes and brown hair, 5-foot-10, 150 pounds. He lists his occupation as a self-employed cleaner.



If he hasn't already seen one, your husband should be examined by a neurologist, who will investigate other causes of posttraumatic dizziness. For example, symptoms similar to your husband's could be the result of a disorder, seizure transient

ischemic attacks (small strokes that cause no permanent damage) and circulatory deficiency to the brain. The specialist will probably order an MRI scan of the brain, a test that will give more information than is ordinarily available by CT scanning. Also, the neurologist will be able to offer advice about treatment and counsel your husband about ways to cope with his neurological impairment. DEAR DR. GOTT: My 67-year-

old husband was diagnosed two months ago with renal cell carcinoma. Is there treatment? What is the prognosis?

DEAR READER: Renal cell carcinoma, often called hypernephroma, is a malignant kidney tumor, more common in men, that accounts for about 2 percent of adult cancers. It is a very dangerous growth because it is highly malignant, is rarely discovered in its early stages, and metastasizes (spreads) rapidly, especially to lungs. The cause is unknown.

Patients with this affliction usually have blood in the urine, followed by fever and flank pain. Once the diagnosis has been

established by biopsy, the tumor is "staged" -- meaning that its precise location and extent are determined --- by CT scanning.

Surgical removal of the affected kidney (and the surrounding structures) is the preferred therapy for renal cell carcinoma that has not spread. This leads to a reasonable chance for cure of localized disease.

Unfortunately, metastatic cancer is almost impossible to cure, because the malignant kidney cells do not ordinarily respond to radiation or chemotherapy. Thus, metastatic renal cell carcinoma has a grim prognosis. Therapy is comfort-oriented: Pain and other complications of the disease are treated as they appear. ORLANDO - This Sunday's ArenaBowl XIV in the TD Waterhouse Centre will feature a rivalry that has been one of the league's most evenly matched of the last four years.

The fact that almost every match-up between the Orlando Predators and Nashville Kats has had playoff implications, coupled with Orlando head coach Jay Gruden's ties to the Kats (he is Nashville's former offensive coordinator), have turned this into a growing and heated rivalry.

Nashville swept the series in 1997 and took the first game of the 1998 campaign before the Predators rolled off three straight wins, including a 58-43 triumph in the 1998 playoffs. The Kats got revenge late in the 1999 season by beating Orlando, 51-41. Earlier this year, the Predators drubbed the Kats 71-54 in Nashville in May, but the Kats once again took the lead in the all-time series 5-to-4 by coming from behind to beat Orlando on the road in July.

Last Sunday, Connell Maynor threw for five touchdowns and ran for two others as the Predators (13-3) earned their third consecutive trip to the ArenaBowl with a 56-44 victory against the Arizona Rattlers.

Maynor's 7-yard scramble into the end zone with 43 seconds remaining clinched a berth in the title game.

Clif Dell had two of Orlando's five TD receptions, scoring on catches of 37 and 38 yards to
