Solid Front Behind Roosevelt In Time **Of Present Stress** Is Urged By Group

WASHINGTON, Mar. 0.-(A.P.)-An appeal for national unity, unexampled in peace-time history, was explained yesterday in simultaneous proclamations by the governors of the states.

Acting at the suggestion of a eivie, political, and religious lenders and the heads of important national organizations, the gov-ernors asked for a solid front, in this time of trial, behind President Roosevelt and Americah inatitutions

Reports to the committee last night were that every governor had joined in the proclamation ex-cept where legal technicalities prohibited it.

The nation-wide appeal thu presented was the first public reult of an endeavor conducted under the chairmanship of Rear Admiral Richard E. Byrd to assure the President of united backing cisive action.
