Pointing out that Irving Berlin's patriotic song, "God Bless Amercia" sounds very much like a prayer in these troublous times, Rev. C. A. Calcote writing in the Christian Observer, wonders why God should bless America any more than He already has.

He has given us 75 percent of the world's oil, 60 perent of the world's wheat and cotton, 50 percent of the copper and tin, 40 percent of the lead, 66 percent of the world's banking business, practically ail the gold in the world, more automobiles, more water power and electricity than any other country in the world, more bathtubs, more talcum powder and more perfume, the best educational system in the world, and "so many conveniences and luxuries we are 'civilized' to death."

In the light of these figures one wonders what more we can ask from the Lord. It would seem to be about time that we did something for ourselves and turned our thoughts toward doing something for the Lord instead of asking for more. And yet this is what has actually happened. The Rev. Calcote points out that while the wealth of the American people has increased 75 percent their contributions to the churches have decreased 20 percent. But we ask God to bless America.




