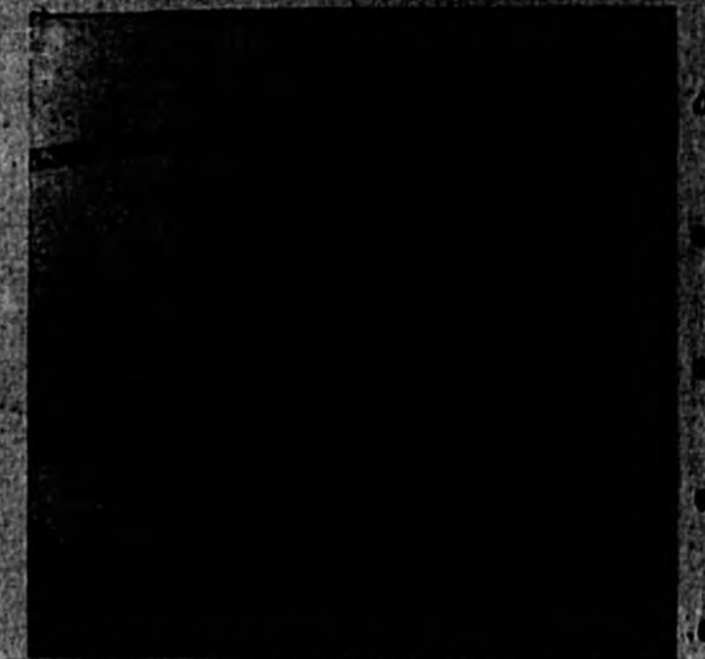

Soviet Discloses Destruction Of Two Enemy Groups Of About 30,000 Each Reich Reported Studying Peace Offer Would Be Made To England If Red Army Is Defeated

Destruction of three Red Army divisions (about 45,000 troops) shifted from the Far East to defend Moscow, was reported today by the Germans.

Russia declared officially today that Adolf Hitler's 37-day-old blitzkrieg is a "washout" with the conflict now settled down to an old-fashioned siege, and reported the destruction of two Nazi divisions (about 30,000 men) over the weekend.

Countering the Russian assertion, the German High Command reported the "battle of Smolensk," a phase of the German onslaught toward Moscow, was "drawing to a successful conclusion."

On the north front, the German news agency DNB said advancing Nazi columns had lunged within 45 miles of Leningrad.

Frankly, the German press warned readers that the campaign "can't be finished between dawn and dusk."

Pro-British circles in Turkey quoted a diplomat of an Axis satellite nation as outlining a purported Nazi plan to offer "peaceful peace" to Britain if the Germans pushed the Red Army east of the Ural Mountains.

Under the plan, it was said, the Germans would cease hostilities against Britain if Britain would recognize the Reich as the controlling power of Europe. The scheme also was said to propose the partitioning of European Russia by Germany, Turkey, Rumania and Poland.

Russia announced today a big naval victory over the German navy and declared that in land fighting along a gigantic and continuous front, the Red Army had taken the steam out of Hitler's invasion with sharp local counter-attacks.

"The blitzkrieg is a washout," the Russian press spokesman said.

The Soviet war bulletin reported that the Red Air Force operating with the Battle Fleet sank two enemy torpedo boats, a submarine, two tankers and a patrol vessel in a smashing Saturday assault.

On land, it said fighting raged yesterday in the sectors of Novol, before Leningrad; Smolensk, on the road to Moscow; and Eltonir, key bastion of the Ukraine's defenses.

Except for the fighting in the three vital gateways, the Russians said the eastern front was quiet. It is in these same areas that Hitler has thrown the weight of his Panzer divisions vainly against the Soviet defenders for almost two weeks.

The war dragged into its thirteenth day with the Germans still engaged in the Smolensk sector 250 miles west of Moscow. Confident Russians in the Baltic capital pressed that the German army occupied Paris in 35 days during the campaign in the west in 1940.

The Red Army's defense came from an American correspondent's warm praise of the "unwavering" DNB, the official German news agency, into the hands of the press. The DNB had pointed to a "victory" over the Red Army in the Baltic sector.

Lake Monroe At Highest Level In Six Years

Lake Monroe is at the highest level it has been in six years with an elevation of 4.88 feet above sea level. Ralph Lubinski of the City engineering department reported today on the basis of measurements taken Saturday.

Normal level of the lake is about two feet over sea level, and about five feet below the bulkhead at the foot of Park Avenue. At present Lake Monroe is only two and a half feet below the bulkhead, Mr. Lubinski said.

Thousands of acres of cattle land in the St. Johns River valley are inundated as the result of unusually heavy rains recently.

A continued rise in the level of the lake and river was forecast by Mr. Lubinski even without additional rains. If the rainy season continues, Mr. Lubinski said, the lake may overflow its bulkhead and flood thousands of acres.
