The Seminole Expressway has announced the closure of several roads for construction of the six-mile Seminole Expressway Project 2 beginning Friday, March 17. These will be PERMANENT closures: Revier Road at Country Club Road, Bungalow Boulevard just east of Revier Road, and 23rd Street at Revier Road.

The closures result from the construction of the northern portion of the Central Florida Greenway to connect the highway from I-4 just south of the Seminole Town Center Mall.

Lake Howell student dies in car crash

WINTER PARK — Students at Lake Howell High School canceled each other the day before spring break when they learned another classmate had died.

Joshua Sweeney, a 16-year-old Lake Howell High School sophomore, died at 10:30 a.m. Thursday morning from injuries suffered about 17 hours earlier, after he pulled his sport utility vehicle in front of a garbage truck.

It is the third time this school year a Lake Howell High School student has died from injuries suffered in a traffic accident.

In addition, Joshua is the second Seminole County student

who has died as many weeks in a traffic accident. Both accidents were nearly identical.

Two weeks ago Friday, Seminole High School senior Ryan McCool, 18, was killed when he pulled in front of a dump truck on State Road 46 near Sanford.

"Parents kiss their kids good-bye in the morning, and they assume they'll be home at night," said School Board member Larry Furlong. "I'm not sure if any parent, student or teacher is ever prepared to learn that someone isn't coming home."

Furlong said he is not sure what steps schools can take to try to help students avoid traffic accidents, other than mock DUI crashes and similar steps.

Firefighters to get detection devises

SANFORD — Seminole County's EMS/Fire/Rescue is asking for \$270,000 to add a strengthening strut to the vertical stabilizer of its new Air Rescue 3 helicopter and for the purchase of thermal imagers — helmet mounted infrared detection devices.

"The thermal imagers are high tech breakthroughs that can save lives — those of our fire fighting and medical personnel and those of residents," Maloy said Friday. The County Commissioners will authorize the purchase when they meet Tuesday.

Renovated theater will host a mini-season this summer

done so much to help us get this done."

The main season will begin in September, and last through April 2001. The season will include three plays and three concerts.

Nearly \$2 million in public and private funds have been used toward the resto-

ration of the theater, located at 201 Magnolia Avenue.

Members of the non-profit Kitz Community Theatre Inc. have gathered \$175,000 in public grants and \$400,000 in private funds to renovate the theater.

The theater, also previously known as

the Milane Theatre, was constructed in 1921. It housed a state-of-the-art theater with a 100-by-60-foot stage.

The downstairs area will have a total of 331 chairs when the theater opens. Another 441 padded, folding benches will be placed in the upstairs balcony area until additional theater chairs are purchased.

Programming at the theater will include touring stage productions, children's theater, film series, music performances, meetings and training sessions.

Doctors gave Flannagan 'zero chance'

SANFORD — Dana Flannagan was thrown 80 feet from her car in a traffic accident, and doctors initially said she had little chance of survival.

The 22-year-old remained in a coma for six days, and was in the hospital for almost three weeks. But on Friday, Flannagan returned from Orlando Regional Medical Center to her Sanford home on West 5th Street, where she lives with her parents Dixie and Joe Flannagan.

"They told us at the Intensive Care Unit that night she had zero chance of survival, zero," said Dixie Flannagan. "But, she's a fighter. How she survived, I do not know, other than God."



Five days a week she will undergo speech therapy, occupational therapy and physical therapy. Doctors do not know at this point See Homecoming, Page 11A

Jim Perry goes to court Monday

Seminole County's first black judge to be sworn in

Florida Gov. Jeb Bush has appointed Longwood resident Jim Perry to the 18th Judicial Court.

Perry's selection for the bench is significant locally because he will be the first black judge in Seminole County. He'll be sworn in at 9:30 a.m. at Courthouse E of the Seminole County Courthouse. There will be a formal investiture — open

to the public — at 4 p.m. on March 31 at Seminole Community College.

A well-respected attorney with offices in Orlando, Perry's selection is notable for one other reason — he's a Democrat, while the governor comes from the first family of the Republican party.

"I was watching a basketball game on TV the night the governor called," Perry said. "He told me the appointment was mine. He said party affiliation was not important to him. Neither was race. I thanked him for having the courage to choose me."

Perry, 56, leaves the Orlando law firm of Perry & Hicks to enter the judicial field. He

knows most of his fellow judges and has tried cases in their courts.

"I am not a stranger," he said. "My appointment has been received with respect and kindness."

Being the first black judge in Seminole County is "very significant," said Perry.

"It is 2000 and it has taken a long time," he said. "But I'm hardly the Jackie Robinson of Florida judicial life. There are other black judges. There just haven't been any here."

The judge said that he eagerly awaits serving in the judicial system.

"I'm totally aware of the enormity of job. Gov. Bush has See Perry, Page 11A

What scares me most about driving is drive in crashes. We used to take drives for fun. Now, when we drive it's fun only if we survive. Road rage is an interest, a man begged someone to catch him last week. That, and pay for the gas.

The only people I know who can afford to pay for gas are the

Please don't feed the 'gators

The alligators are back. Now that the days are warmer, they can be seen sunning themselves on Lake Monroe, many near the Sanford shoreline. At times, only the two snouts can be seen. At other times, the entire top portion of the gator is visible, basking in the warmth of the Florida sun.

These comments are not intended for people who have lived in gator land for many years. Rather, they are intended for visitors and newcomers. Also, as a reminder for residents to tell their out-of-town guests about one of our wildlife attractions.

First of all, and most importantly — don't feed the gators. Youngsters have a tendency to toss bread crumbs or hamburger leftovers at the gators trying to draw them closer to shore or get some form of movement out of them. Of course, there are adults who try to do the same. This is not only dangerous, it's illegal. People can be, and have been arrested for feeding alligators.

Wildlife officials will tell you that alligators who receive food tossed from the shore or a boat quickly learn to depend on humans to supply food. Then, when they see a human, perhaps wading in the water or holding an arm or leg over the side of a boat, they approach quickly, often unseen, and attempt to grab what they perceive as food. It could be an arm or a leg or even a child or pet.

Several years ago, a 15-foot alligator had to be physically removed from Lake Monroe by game and wildlife officials. This particular gator, nicknamed "Old Sam" had been a sight on the lakefront for many years. He could always be seen sunning himself in the boat marina area.


Yet people began to toss food morsels at him. It wasn't long before he came toward a person sitting on the breakwall and appeared ready to attack. All Old Sam wanted was food. Alligators don't know the difference. If it was not common in the water, it must be food.

It cost Old Sam his life, and the Sanford area lost one of its own.

It's a sight to behold, especially in the early morning hours of sunlight. Seeing anywhere from one to one dozen alligators appearing to float on the lake's surface, is something you want your visitors to see.

Many are even surprised to see people windsurfing on the lake — often falling in relatively near a gator. Others fish from small boats nearby. They aren't concerned. In most cases, the alligators are more frightened by humans than we are of them. The only thing that will eliminate this fright is the thought of food.

Enjoy our Lake Monroe alligators — but whatever you do — DON'T FEED THEM.

Hedrick offers options for commuter rail

To the editor:

Lately, there have always been locally elected officials who have taken up the cause for public transit when it most needs it; the latest example is U.S. Rep. John Mica, who is recommending the existing rail lines between Volusia and Osceola counties through Orlando be used for a commuter rail operation and utilize existing available federal monies for this purpose. He is to be commended for this bold stand, and even more so for trying to persuade former opponents of light rail, such as the Winter Park City Commission, to change their stand and support this plan. Likewise, there have been officials in Volusia County who have been very enthusiastic about commuter rail recently.

As the organization who almost 20 years ago proposed

using the CSX tracks for a similar metropolitan Orlando system, we have some suggestions to build upon the current endeavor, in no particular order:

- This system should be built in conjunction with the other proposal to have commuter rail run into Lake County and any other proposal which helps build a feasible areawide system.

- Regarding the route into Lake County, our organization is already backing a proposal to restore the old CSX rail line between Tavares and Leesburg as part of the Orlando-Gainesville higher-speed rail passenger service; the commuter system could easily share the new track to run service even deeper into Lake County.

- Regarding routes north into Volusia County, our organization likewise is pushing a proposal to restore the old FEC rail line which ran roughly from near Deltona through Osteen to around Edgewater as part of the Orlando-New Smyrna Beach-Daytona Beach-Jacksonville higher speed rail passenger ser-

vice, so not only could you have commuter service to Deltona on the existing track but also to Daytona over the new track.

- In the south, the system should be extended to run either to Haines City, Winter Haven or Lakeland, where the service can be linked to proposed commuter service out of Tampa.

- There currently exists a rail line running from East by the south end of Orlando International Airport over to the OUC power plants; this line could be easily adapted to commuter service and provide a direct rail-air link in our broader community.

- Within our existing communities, bus service needs to be dramatically expanded to interlink with the rail systems as well as provide more frequent service, say at least every 15 minutes during rush hours and more frequently than currently run off peak. LYNC, for example, would need over 200 additional buses. VOTRAN would need more service as well, not to mention other communities, such as Winter

Haven, who just established a transit system.

- To expand the bus system as well as do the rail operation likely will require additional dollars from both the state and local governments, which should either come from monies previously designated to build more and wider highways (preferred since you can't build your way out of traffic congestion and urban sprawl), surplus funds or additional taxes/fees, but from somewhere it will have to be paid.

The elected officials and citizens of our area are being given another golden opportunity to solve one of the most pressing problems in the area; there may not be other opportunities for large amounts of federal aid to help in this endeavor. Citizens need to let their elected officials know that this time there should not be roadblocks thrown in the path of these trains and we need to move full steam ahead.



Gore vs. Bush: A prediction of what's to come

Here's my preview of the battle between Al Gore and George W. Bush.

Gore will try to scare the voters, especially women and old people.

Women will be the easiest to scare. Gore will tell them that the next president could well appoint a majority of the nine-seat U.S. Supreme Court. If Bush gets to fill those seats with strict constructionists, that will mean an overturn of Roe vs. Wade — an end to abortion rights.

Next will come the old people. Gore will call Bush's plan to privatize Social Security a threat to the system itself. In the darkest possible tones, he will warn seniors that a program built by Franklin Roosevelt, and opposed from the very outset by Republicans, now stands in dire danger.

He will not stop there. More than threatening our rights and entitlements, Gore will say, the Republicans

threaten our basic quality of life, both economic and cultural.

A prime target will be the big Bush tax cut. Slashing federal revenues, Gore will warn, threatens to explode the budgetary discipline of the Clinton-Gore years. It will jeopardize the country's economic growth, drive up interest rates, and diminish the working family's 401(k). Savings and wealth, the hallmark of late 20th century American life, will morph back to the paycheck-to-paycheck world of the first Bush presidency.

Gore's final forecast of fear will concern human rights. Let the candidate of Ralph Reed, Pat Robertson and Jerry Falwell into the White House and we invite a government of, by and for the religious right. No bedroom, bar room or boardroom will be safe. A new theocracy, modeled on Salem and Iehorah, will emerge in this land of the free.

If the Gore message will council fear, the Bush voice will speak of hope. Change, in this Texas governor's vocabulary, will sound a positive note. Bush's first reform will deal with the White House itself. He will scrub the stain of Bill Clinton from the floors, walls and desks of the Oval Office, showing it the same reverence his father and Ronald Reagan once did.

His second, government-wide reform will deal with the lumbering liberal establishment. Education will be the epicenter. Bush will promise to detonate the country's education system by cracking the iron grip of the teachers unions.

No more will parents be mandated by law to enroll their children in school, limited by finance to the public schools. Under a Bush administration, the kids of working- and middle-class families will have a monetary edge on the education establishment. They will get the leverage to spend their education dollars where they want. In George W. Bush's lexicon, "school choice" will rival abortion "choice" as an election-eve


battle cry. Pushing the reform agenda even wider will be Bush's unrelenting drive for a giant tax cut. The money belongs to the people, he will argue, not the government. Far from giving away federal dollars, Bush will say, he is letting taxpayers keep, save and invest more of their own!

Lastly, in a son's tribute to his father, the Texas governor will demand a rebuilding of America's military strength. He will score Clinton for jeopardizing the country's security by extending US commitments but failing to bolster our armed forces.

It will be a tough contest, with each campaign exploiting the points that work, discarding those that don't. The victor will be the candidate, whether Gore or Bush, who wins the minds and hearts of those voters who see truth in both their pitches.

The Way We Were: Sadie Hawkins Day

Many of you who attended Seminole High School will remember the fun we had each leap year on Sadie Hawkins Day. In fact, some sponsoring groups thought it was such a big success that they held the event on other years, too. The Celery Fed of Feb. 27, 1941, states that "We done had so much fun last year, the Celery Fed staff is gonna run it again this time." The Student Council was also helping to organize it.

In case you don't remember the origin of Sadie Hawkins Day, it came from a story line in the comic strip "Lil' Abner" by Al Capp. These characters lived in Dogpatch, Ky. Sadie

Hawkins was unable to get a husband in the usual way, so her father decided to hold a race. The contestants were all of the eligible bachelors of Dogpatch; the man whom Sadie caught was to be her husband. It was evidently a success, so every Feb. 29, the hillbillies held a Sadie Hawkins Day to give their unfortunate daughters a chance to marry.

Seminole High School latched onto this idea, which was a good reason to have a day of fun. The main event was "The Race" with Marryin' Sam there to hitch the girls with their catch. Other events

of the day included a pie eating contest and tug of war pitting the seniors and sophomores against the juniors and freshmen. Classes and clubs would have booths of various types which helped them raise money. Then there was the Girl Break Dance that night.

I remember that there was a teacher walk out in February 1968 so Sadie Hawkins Day was postponed until March 29 that year.

And the Girls Future Teacher Club, of which I was sponsor, sold cold drinks at both the 1964 and 1968 events.

The articles in the 1941 Celery Fed telling about Sadie Hawkins Day were written in what the author considered to be a hillbilly dialect; instead of punishing you with this, I will translate into ordinary English.

Sadie Hawkins Day Rules
This Celery Fed listed rules for Sadie Hawkins Day which was to be held Feb. 28, 1941. Some of these were:

1. Every student comes to school dressed as various Lil' Abner characters. Everyone not dressed as a hick will be punished.
2. All people able to grow beards, please do so.
3. All girls who are fast enough to catch one of the handsome males must make it

official by presenting him to a teacher to receive a certificate.

4. After this official introduction, said gal gives said boy a bouquet of vegetables to wear on his lapel.

5. All you strong gals drag your man to the dance in the gym for only 25 cents.

6. All gentlemen who run too fast for the fair ones to please come to the dance because we want you there.

7. Everyone is allowed to chew his favorite brand; freshmen are limited to bubblegum.

8. No cursing will be tolerated and no spitting where there ain't spittoons.

9. The most important is to mind your manners and try to be the boy or girl your mother thinks you are.

Other Events of the Day:
In a column entitled "Dear Abby" there was further information.

The class periods would be shortened to 45 minutes each with only one lunch period.

In addition to the other activities, there would be a program in the auditorium.

Herman Middleton, Edward Marshall, Mary Lodge and Mary Alice Temple were to present a play "Plink and Patches" and the Pippin sisters (Gladys and Elizabeth) would sing a duet. Nell Stewart was to shine in a hillbilly dance with back up dancers Lois Caldwell, Helen Hitchcock, Marcia Proctor, Elizabeth Whigham, Lucille Hall, and Dot Kader. "Basin Street Blues"

would be sung by Norma Wolfer.

The question that was asked the girls was "What kind of a boy do you want to catch during the race?"

Ermie Daudney: "I want to catch a crazy cute little boy that just turned 17."

Nell Stewart: "A good looking brunet who is a good dancer."

Dorothy Kader: "I'm not particular, although a blond about 5'10" tall would fill the bill if he doesn't run too fast."

Elizabeth Whigham: "A blond boy who has Chemistry first period."

Natalie True: "A brunette who was a full back on the football team."

The boys were asked "What kind of a girl do you want to catch you?"

Mack Cleveland: "A crazy cute girl who hasn't much sense and who would be a lot of fun at the dance."

Bill Barnum: "A blonde who recently changed to Biology from Mrs. Furt."

Clifford Practice: "Anybody who is sucker enough to catch me."

1952 Sadie Hawkins Day

I was a sophomore at SHS during the 1952 Leap Year; that year there was a contest during the day to select Daisy Mae and Lil' Abner with the winners being Lucia Goff and Hank McLaulin. Roger Harris, faculty member, was marrying Sam Who Hardin won the pie eating contest with Jimmie Fox coming in second. The juniors and freshmen won the tug of war and several on both sides got pulled through the mud puddle.

The girl break dance was held in the gym that year. A note in my diary states that the last dance was a square dance which lasted about 20 minutes; I kept ending up with some fellow I didn't know who would swing me round and round until I got dizzy. I thought it would never end!

The dance and the entire day was loads of fun!

Census 2000 begins gathering information in Seminole County

But sheriff warns citizens to watch out for scam artists

The United States Census Bureau has started the 2000 Census in our area. The Seminole County Sheriff's Office urges all residents to cooperate with this vital process, because the information collected will be beneficial to us all.

However, there may be some unscrupulous people who may try to take advantage of this process by posing as Census takers. For this reason, the Census Bureau and the Sheriff's Office present the following information and safety tips to remind residents to be on alert and report all suspicious activity.

THE AUTHORIZED CENSUS TAKER WILL:

- Wear identification cards indicating they are Census Enumerators.

- Be working seven days a week and may work into the evening hours in order to talk with residents who are working all day.

- Have identifying placards on their vehicles when parked in neighborhoods. If they can not make contact with the resident, a calling card will be left at the door.

- Be interviewing businesses as well as private residences.

THE AUTHORIZED CENSUS TAKER WILL NOT:

- Demand entry into your

home.

- Tell you, "You are required by Federal Law and MUST answer my questions."

- Ask for your Social Security number.

- Ask for your credit card numbers.

- Ask for your bank account numbers.

When approached by a Census Enumerator, be alert to the above facts. If you doubt the validity of the Census Taker, you can call the U.S. Census Bureau Office located at 1614 W. Airport Blvd., Sanford, at 407-322-9629 any time.

You can also call the Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Unit at 407-665-6677 for additional information on this advisory.

whether she will fully recover from head injuries suffered in the accident.

In addition, she also suffered a broken left leg, six broken ribs, a punctured right lung, and severe skin abrasions to her back. Doctors had to place 152 stitches in her head following the accident.

"She's come a long way," Rauerman said. "We're just glad she's home. She's really loved by a lot of people, and well liked. She came home a little bit early, but she's a fighter."

Having undergone about six hours of therapy per day in order to come home, Flannagan appeared remarkably strong as she made her way into the peace of the family living room.

"This is a celebration," Dixie Flannagan said. "We're taking her home from the hospital with the balloons, flowers and teddy bears just like we did 22 years ago when she was born. She's alive, and that's all we care about."

On the night of the Feb. 21 accident, Flannagan had a green light as she proceeded through the intersection of 3rd Street and French Avenue at about 11 p.m. However, Sanford police said Terrence Green, 16, of 112 Castlebrewer Court in Sanford, ran a red light and struck Flannagan's car, causing her to

be ejected.

Sanford police attempted to stop Green for speeding prior to the accident. However, Green, who has a criminal history that includes kidnapping, sale of cocaine and two charges for possession of cocaine, eluded the officers.

Because the speeding infraction did not warrant a high speed chase, the emergency lights of the police vehicle were turned off. Officers notified dispatch that they had "shut down" their attempted traffic stop while at the same time giving the last known direction of travel, authorities said.

Green continued to travel at a high rate of speed and ran the traffic light at French and 3rd Street, striking Flannagan's car, police said.

Sanford police spokeswoman Cleo Cohen said officers do not engage in a high speed chase for a traffic infraction. She said high-speed chases should only occur if officers are trying to apprehend a suspect who has committed a forcible felony.

"People ask us if we are angry with the police, and the answer is no," Dixie Flannagan said. "People need to remember that this boy who did this is a criminal. He took our family, and he turned it upside down. Now, our focus is on putting our family back together again."

A computer dispatcher for Pacemeters Personnel, Flannagan is single, and does not have any children.

However, her 18-year-old sister Brandi Flannagan is due to give birth in two weeks to a girl.

"When Diana woke up from her coma she said 'If Brandi had the baby I'm going to kick her butt,'" Dixie Flannagan said. "I was like, 'oh my God, you remembered.' She said 'of course I remember.'

When Flannagan was ready to leave intensive care, she was transferred to the Hubbard House next to ORMC. Her parents have also been staying at the Hubbard House.

"There's a kitchen where the mommas go to console each other and to cry," Dixie Flannagan said. "We're so grateful to everything they did for us."

Medical bills have reached \$142,000. Insurance through Pacemeters Personnel pays for part of the bills. The company has also been providing transportation and other assistance to the Flannagan family.

The family has established a trust fund in Diana Flannagan's name at First Union.

"It's only money," Dixie Flannagan said. "We're going to find a way through this. We always do."

already being taken.

"With the rapid growth in the county there are more and more cars on the road everyday," Burkhardt said. "Maybe we should take steps to train kids better, and instill awareness of the need to pay attention on the road."

Chief Deputy Sheriff Steve Harriett said that school resource officers constantly remind student drivers about the dangers on the road. "We drive for survival in these times," Harriett said. "All of us have to be fully alert. We need what I call 360-degree perspective."

He said that adults who learned to drive years ago learned on smaller roads.

"Today, kids have to go out on 6 or 8-lane highways, they go on ramps and in busy streets

we didn't experience until we were much older and wiser," Harriett said. "There aren't safe driving programs and instruction at schools like there used to be. Driver's Ed was mandatory when I went to school."

Winter Springs police said Joshua, who was a member of the school's soccer team, probably never saw what hit him.

The garbage truck driver, Ricardo Rodriguez, 33, of Orlando, and witnesses told police Joshua was turning onto County Road 419 from Edgewater Avenue in Winter Springs. He stopped, but never looked left before pulling into the intersection, according to police.

Police said that it appears Rodriguez, who drives for Waste Management, Inc., was not going over the 35 mph speed limit. The truck had no

mechanical problems that would have contributed to the accident.

Joshua's death gave the day before spring break on Thursday a somber tone for students at Lake Howell. Sadly, the students have dealt with two previous fatal traffic accidents this school year.

When the school year was just beginning, Christopher Jean-Baptiste, a 15-year-old Lake Howell sophomore, and his 18-year-old brother Gabriel, who graduated from Lake Howell, died in an Aug. 21 car accident.

Then in December, Brandon Cleary, 15, died from injuries suffered when he was struck by a car while riding his bicycle.

obtained at basically no cost (military surplus) to the county and was refurbished with developer commitment moneys. The county's costs come from maintenance and for fuel. There was an additional cost of \$34,000

that would be split by the Sheriff's Office and Public Safety.

The helicopter has been in use since April 1999. The additional cost for the tail section of the helicopter came from an "unforeseen" Airworthiness

Directive from the Federal Aviation Agency.

Chief Deputy Sheriff Steve Harriett said that Air Rescue 3 has transported one or more patients to Orlando Regional Medical Center.

"A number of lives have been

saved," he said. "More lives and humans have been saved when the helicopter is used during dry spells and there is a threat of wild fires."

The thermal imagers, Schenck said, are devices that are used to prevent loss of lives and property.

Firefighters who are equipped with these devices are able to locate and rescue victims in little or no visibility fire/smoke situations and to determine if fire has extended into attics or wall spaces.

The imagers are expensive —

the \$270,000 to purchase 16 imagers, with extended warranty.

"Other counties and municipalities are ahead of us — they're using their imagers already," Maloy said.

Community gathers for Olde Lake Mary Days festival

The very first Olde Lake Mary Days festival was the brainchild of former Lake Mary Historical Commissioner Shari Brodie. Shari was also a member of the Lake Mary Community Improvement Association. The event was a way the group could work together for a community festival. Another part of the vision was the inclusion of all the non-profit organizations in Lake Mary.

Seven years later, the vision of a festival fostering "community unity" is still strong. The seventh annual Olde Lake Mary Days festival featured participation by local clubs, churches and schools.

One of the high points of this year's festival was the Civil War encampment. Company H of the 37th Alabama "Hardy's Brigade," pitched its tents and displayed its canon and their guns. Their clothes were all authentic from 1864 or authentic reproductions. An authentic reproduction is an original made with the same materials the originals were made from. For instance, to be an authentic reproduction, a button must be made from horn, mother-of-pearl, wood, tin or glass. They didn't have plastic buttons in 1864. Company H treated the audience to some authentic drills, including authentic rifle fire with their black powder guns. Joining the 37th Alabama was Civil War surgeon John Higgins. This weekend, he was a Confederate, but he also attends reenactment as a Union officer. His instruments are authentic Civil War medical instruments.

There were other demonstrations at Olde Lake Mary Days. David Wolfe set up his Native American lean-to and demonstrated flint knapping. Flint knapping is the art of making arrowheads by hand. George

C. Scott (the carver, not the actor) was once again in the Frank Evans Center demonstrating how to make flowers from wood. He also showed attendees how to weave with palmetto fronds.

For the first year, Olde Lake Mary Days was attended by the Easter Bunny and Smokey Bear. It was quite a coup, courtesy of Lake Mary Historical Commissioner Jan Blackwelder. Jan teaches American History at Lake Mary High School. She offered extra credit to students willing to dress up and entertain the visiting children during Olde Lake Mary Days. Jan's students also helped Lake Mary Historical Commissioner Harriet Boyd lead children in some of the games of yesteryear, including marbles and jump rope. There was even a display in the Frank Evans Center of Jan's students' genealogy scrapbooks.

Charlie C. Carlson also had a display at the Frank Evans Center. For those who have never heard of Charlie, he is the president of the Seminole County Historical Society and the author of several books, including "When Celery Was King," a book about early Sanford that's already in its fifth printing. Lately, Hollywood East has knocked on Charlie's door. He had a part in "The Blair Witch Project" and in the Sci-Fi Channel's mock documentary "Curse of the Blair Witch." With Charlie, as always, was his better half, wife Carlson.

This year's children's section at Olde Lake Mary Days was

one of the best ever, thanks to the Lake Mary CIA (Community Improvement Association).

They provided a moonwalk, a pony ride, a petting zoo and face painting.

Other groups at Olde Lake Mary Days included the Lake Mary Chapter of the AARP, the Lake Mary Woman's Club and the Lake Mary Seniors. The Seniors were selling some lovely handmade crafts for the event.

As always, local talent shone on the stage at Olde Lake Mary Days. The SCC Orchestra was delightful. So were the Stardust Girl Scouts, who performed dances and songs from around the world.

At the conclusion of the festival, Company H fired three final salutes into the air with their black powder rifles.

That was followed by a very solemn flag retirement ceremony, courtesy of Girl Scout Troops 1277, 146 and 1020.
