Plans Are Taken To Establish Ireland As Airways Center

DUBLIN, June 7. (INS)—First steps have been taken in an ambitious scheme to make Ireland the European terminal of the great transatlantic air service.

Plans are already forward for the Galway terminal, which is expected to be in full operation in three years' time. When a trans-Atlantic ship will be at Galway, passengers would be transferred to the continent by air, into automobiles which will convey them to the aerodrome, where a fleet of fast airplanes will be awaiting them. Behind the new development is the Irish air transport company, of which Captain James C. Fitzmaurice, Atlantic aviator, and former head of the Free State Air Force, is chief director. The enterprise has capital of \$1,250,000.

Hoover Appears To Be Gaining Ground In His Fight On Act

WASHINGTON, June 7. (INS)—As a result of a victory in the farm relief battle, President Hoover today appeared to be gaining ground in the Senate on his recommendation for repeal of the national origins immigration law.

While the President frequently has declared he would not interfere with the legislative freedom of Congress, his associates have been waging vigorous campaigns in the Senate for elimination of the capstone plan from the farm bill and for repeal of the new immigration quotas, which go into effect July 1. The debenture fight has been won through the activity of administration leaders, though the vote may not come until next week. A different group, led by Senators Nye (R) of North Dakota, an insurgent, and Allen (R) of Kansas, a newcomer, has conducted the fight to carry out his immigration policy. They have met with extraordinary success, so much so that a former hope has been turned into a doubtful prospect in which either side may win. The advocates of the national origins plan however may defeat the President's wishes by filibustering.

Final Preparations Are Made For Flight

STOCKHOLM, June 7. (INS)—Final preparations for the scheduled transatlantic flight of Capt. Alphonse and Lieut. Axel Floren were being completed today and the airman expected that the weather will permit them to hop off about 6 o'clock on Saturday morning.
