



## **Unemployment Rate Proves Contradictory**

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The nation's unemployment rate edged down from 7.8 percent in May to 7.7 percent in June even though the recession wiped out ahalf-million jobs, the Labor Department reported today.

Officials said the apparent contradiction was explained by the fact that the total labor force shrank by 600,000

The unemployment rate is based on the number of persons who tell Labor Department surveyors they are seeking work but are unable to find it. When fewer people are seeking jobs, this reduces the unemployment rate. Officials said the labor force decline followed a very sharp increase of 725,000 school and college youngsters began

### **Soviets Drop Condition**

## For Nuclear Arms Talks

BONN, West Germany (UPI) - The Soviet Union has dropped a major condition for negotiations on nuclear arms limitation in Europe and is ready to begin the talks despite the deliberate delay by the U.S. Senate in ratifying the SALT II treaty, Chancellor

Helmut Schmidt said today. The Soviet suggestion represented a major switch in Kremlin policy because Moscow no longer demanded the Western allies suspend or reverse their decision to deploy American missiles in Western Europe before entering talks, Schmidt said.

He said the Soviet offer has been conveyed President Carter and Carter has promised to study the suggestion carefully.

## Federal Reserve **Drops Credit Rules**

nounced today it will lift the rest of the anti-inflation controls it imposed on consumer credit and bank loans in March at the request of President Carter.

The board said "recent evidence indicates that the need for those extraordinary measures has ended." "In recent months, there has been apparent contraction in consumer borrowing, indications are that anticipatory and speculative demands for credit have subsided, and funds have

been in more ample supply." "While the special conditions necessitating the extraordinary credit restraints are no longer present," a news elease issued by the Federal Reserve said, "the board emphasized that its general goals of achieving restrained growth in money and credit aggregates are unchanged."

The board, on May 22, began the phase-out with a slicing of credit curbs, lowering its special deposit requirements to 7.5 percent from 15 percent, and modification of guidelines for restraining bank credit. Today, it announced plans to complete that phase-out, is

-Elimination of the remaining 7.5 percent special deposit equirements that apply to increases in covered consumer credit, effective for credit extended in June and thereafter. No special deposits will be required after the present deposit

-Elimination of the remaining 7.5 percent increases in covered assets of money market mutual funds in an action that covers assets beginning July 28. No special deposits will be

-Elimination of the remaining 5 percent marginal reserve requirement in managed liabilities of large banks and agencies, effective for liabilities beginning July 10 and reserves starting July 24. -Phase-out of the program under which banks and finance

institutions were asked to limit domestic loan growth to a range between 6 percent and 9 percent in 1980. On March 14, in conjunction with the president's antiinflation program, the Federal Reserve announced a crackdown on consumer and bank credit.

It required banks and other credit lenders to post 15 percent of any new credit extensions in a non-interest bearing account. The effect was to raise the cost of lending money in hopes of discouraging unnecessary borrowing. Banks and credit lenders, in turn, were permitted to restrict

During the Vietnam War, Hanoi's apologists in this country made great sport of ridiculing the domino theory. It was, they insisted, a paranoid fiction. The United States had only to withdraw, permit North Vietnam and South Vietnam to resolve their differences and peace would reign

Events, of course, have made a cruel mockery of such naivete. Hanoi's troops stand now about where the domino theorists said they would if Saigon lost the war. Laos is a vassal state, occupied and controlled by 50,000 North Vietnamese regulars. Cambodia is a smoking wasteland and an unwilling host to 200,000 invading Vietnamese

And, recently, the world watched as thousands of Vietnamese soldiers supported by tanks, heavy artillery and surface-to-air missiles crossed the frontier into Thailand in a series of attacks intended apparently to prevent Cambodian refugees from returning to their homeland.

Casualty reports are still being tabulated, but a fair guess is that the Vietnamese incursion into Thailand has cost hundreds of lives. Predictably, the toll among Cambodian refugees huddled in makeshift camps along the border is believed to general-election campaign. be particularly high.
