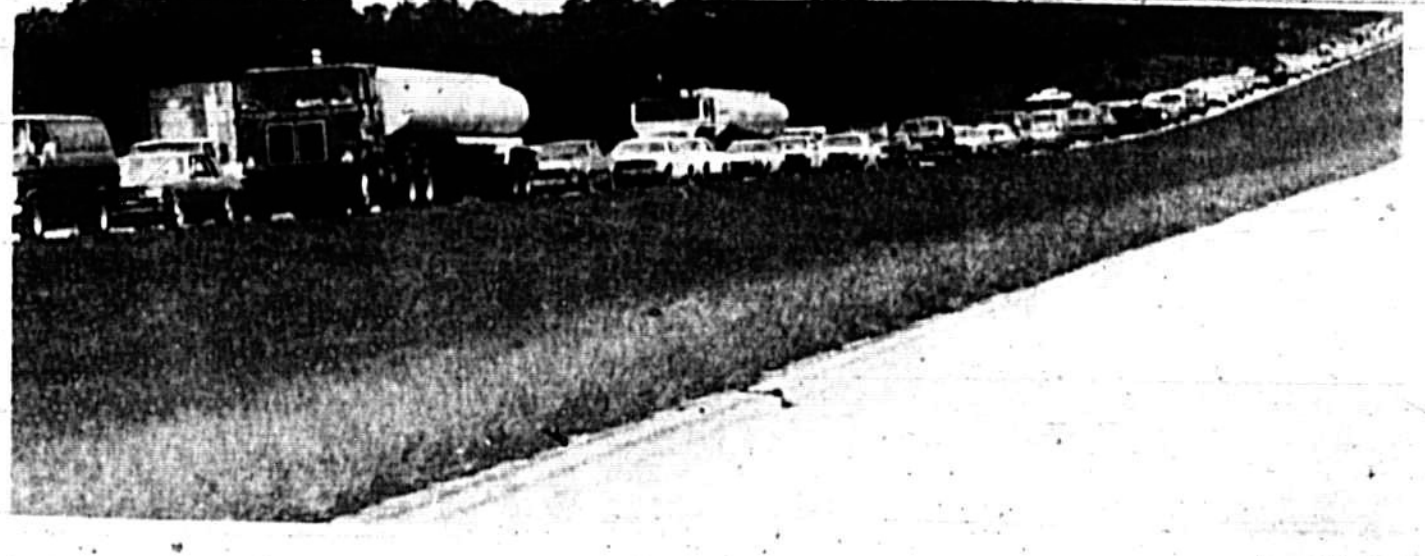

Florida Highway Patrolmen say the 2:50 p.m. collision occurred when the westbound Jeep, driven by Johnnie C. Beauchamp, shot across the divider into the eastbound lane, flipped over and slammed into an eastbound car driven by Margaret E. Strang, Oak Tree Lane, DeBary. Beauchamp was thrown from the Jeep. He was later pronounced dead at Florida Hospital-Altamonte. He was the 18th traffic fatality in Seminole County this year. Margaret Strang and Malcolm Strang, a passenger in the car, of the same address, were treated for minor injuries at Florida-Altamonte. Traffic was backed up along I-4 for several miles while patrolmen worked to clear the wreck.



Unemployment Rate Proves Contradictory

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The nation's unemployment rate edged down from 7.8 percent in May to 7.7 percent in June even though the recession-wiped-out-a-half-million jobs, the Labor Department reported today.

Officials said the apparent contradiction was explained by the fact that the total labor force shrank by 600,000 persons in June.

The unemployment rate is based on the number of persons who tell Labor Department surveyors they are seeking work but are unable to find it. When fewer people are seeking jobs, this reduces the unemployment rate.

Officials said the labor force decline followed a very sharp increase of 725,000 in the labor force for May. That, in turn, was caused by the fact that many high school and college youngsters began looking for jobs earlier in the year than they usually do.

"This influx of college students helped push up the unemployment rate from 7.7 percent in April to 7.8 percent in May, according to John Bregger, chief of the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Labor Secretary Ray Marshall has said the jobless rate could reach 8.5 percent early next year, and some private economists have predicted it will go to 9 percent.

"The employment side of today's report was not encouraging. The number of employed persons declined by 450,000 to 96.5 million, according to the department's survey of households.



Winter Springs Considers Paramedic Team

While the nation continues to suffer economic problems, the Central Florida economy remains strong, according to the "Business Barometer of Central Florida" compiled by the economics department of the University of Central Florida.

Economic indicators traditionally listed in the barometer hit an all time peak in the first quarter of 1980.

While national Real Gross National Product (total value of all goods and services adjusted for inflation) rose only 1.2 percent during this period and is expected to be down 7 percent to 8 percent in second quarter, Central Florida continues to show excellent growth.

Barometer showed first quarter 1980 up 7.8 percent over fourth quarter 1979. Of the eight indices comprising the barometer, only two, gasoline sales and the commercial-bank index, were negative.

Passengers arriving at the International Airport were up 22.2 percent, gross retail sales up 12.4 percent and industrial KWH usage up 23.2 percent over this period.

Additionally, building permits rose by 7.44 percent indicating a potential rebound in the building sector as interest rates continue to decline.

Seminole County's unemployment rate in May was 5.8 percent, according to Sterling Tuck, labor market analyst with the Florida State Employment Service. Tuck said the statistics for June are not yet available.

Rozansky's proposal to purchase a new \$20,000 rescue truck and an additional \$17,000 worth of equipment to bring the city's one rescue vehicle up to paramedic standards, and to hire a team of seven people to operate the two vehicles first must be approved by the city council, then by the general public.

If the idea is approved, Winter Springs residents no longer would have to rely on paramedic service from Herndon Ambulance Corp., which maintains paramedics units to serve the entire county.

All firemen hired by departments in the county are required to be state-certified Emergency Medical Technicians, according to Barbara Smith, coordinator of emergency medical services for Seminole County.

The Longwood Fire Department has an injured patient and provide most first aid to victims of accidents or illness, they are not allowed to administer drugs, or perform advanced techniques which can save the life of a heart attack victim, Smith said.

Paramedics, however, are allowed to administer drugs and carry advanced equipment in their rescue vehicles.

The Longwood Fire Department has one rescue truck manned by a paramedic. Several other city firefighters are either waiting to take the state test or are completing their training for certification.

"They're in a transition phase right now," Smith said.

Altamonte Springs has been running its paramedic program in Seminole County for a longer time, Smith said. Its two ambulances are manned by three paramedics while more are awaiting the state test.

Casselberry and the county are looking at switching over to paramedic crews, Smith said. Until they do, residents of unincorporated areas, Casselberry, Sanford and Oviedo will be served by city and county EMT units and Herndon Ambulance's three vehicles.

Smith explained Herndon has three rescue trucks stationed in Seminole. Two paramedic advanced care trucks are stationed at the homes of their paramedic operators, one in Sanford and one in Casselberry, she said.

Herndon has a third ambulance used for primary care rescues and transportation of patients located at Florida Hospital-Altamonte.

"According to Rozansky, the major cost of the proposed Winter Springs paramedic program is salaries for the seven additional state-certified paramedics, about \$13,000 a year each.

In addition to the salaries and the costs for the second rescue truck, Rozansky said Winter Springs will have to enlarge its Tuscawilla fire station, a move which will have to be made in another year whether there is a paramedic program or not because of new fire trucks expected to be needed in that section of the city.

The city council will get its first chance to consider the complete proposal Tuesday night at its regularly scheduled meeting. Rozansky said he was hoping the referendum would be ready in time for one of the early fall elections already scheduled.

Raze Buildings? Layer Says It's Unlikely

Seminole County Superintendent of Schools William P. Layer says it is unlikely any school buildings will be torn down, despite a state report which calls for the county to raze portions of three schools in this county.

"You just can't tear down buildings that are structurally sound. Some you couldn't replace with as well-built structures."

Layer said Monday the state recommendations for about \$32 million in remodeling and new construction at existing schools and construction of six schools over the next five years are realistic.

He said all the recommendations of the last five-year survey were completed, except for construction of one school and a few remodeling projects.

Wednesday, however, he added he "just doesn't pay any attention" to the state's suggestions for tearing down buildings.

"The board would be remiss if it followed these recommendations, that's all," he told the board last night.

In other action, the school board approved a policy amendment that will allow announced candidates for the office of president or vice president of the United States to participate in assemblies at county schools during school hours.

The original policy prohibited school groups from participating in events that are for the furtherance of any partisan political interest, but by a 3-2 vote school board members felt appearance of candidates for president or vice president would be educational and worthwhile.

Board members William J. Kroll and Allan F. Keeth voted against the amendment.

The amendment was proposed following the school district's denial of permission for Republican presidential candidate Ronald Reagan to speak at Lake Brantley High School earlier this year because the policy barred such appearances.

Board member Robert Feather originally proposed the amendment to encourage political participation and awareness among students. Board members Pat Telson and Roland Williams agreed that it was a good idea.

Before the final vote, Layer wanted the board to change the amendment to require parental permission for students to attend such assemblies, but Feather said that would create an excess of paperwork for school principals. The amendment, as approved, allows parents to have their children excused from such assemblies by written request.

School Board Attorney Ned Julian Jr. warned the board that it might run into First Amendment conflicts if it barred students from attending such assemblies just because they did not have parental permission.

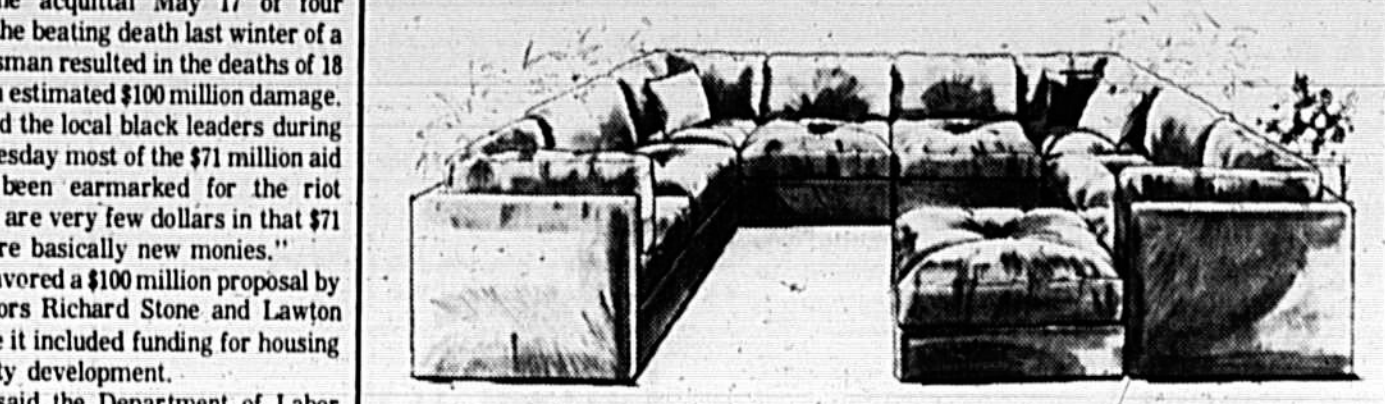

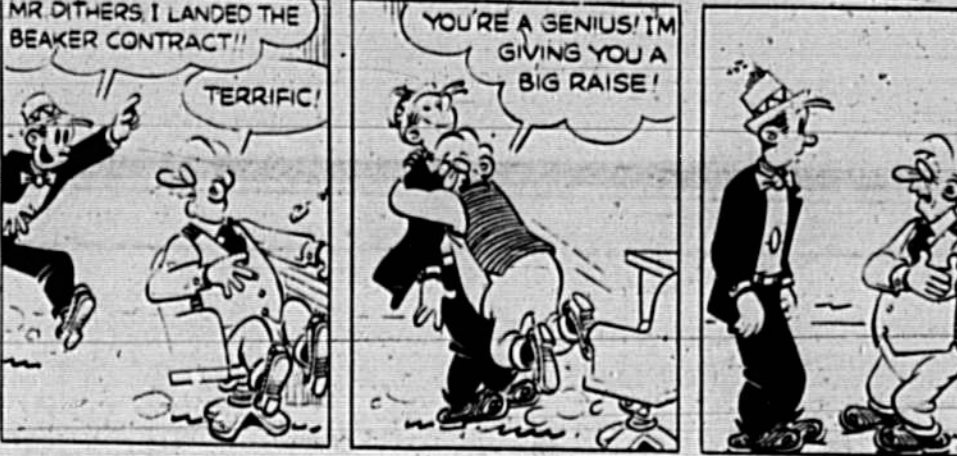

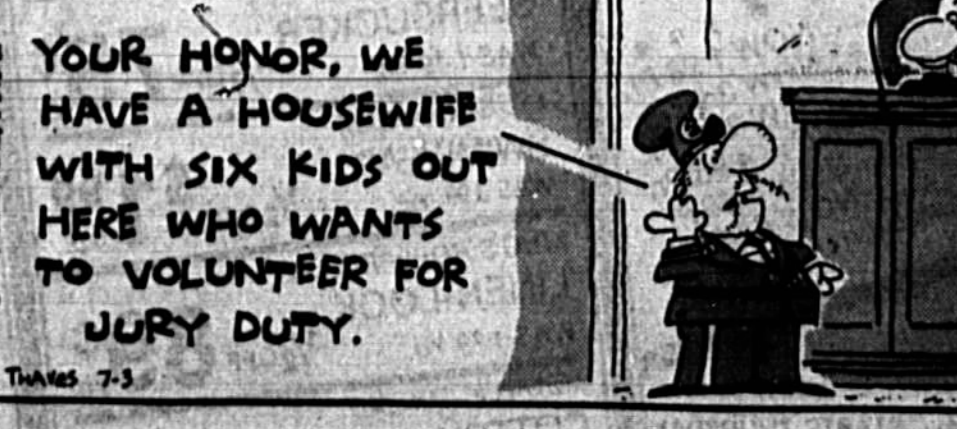
