From 1919 to 1925, at least 44 clinics were set up in 15 states to provide legal take-home narcotics - either free or at a cost of a few cents - to registered drug addicts.

The theory was that legal sale of narcotics would enable addicts to buy drugs at a reasonable cost instead of paying \$15 to \$30 a day to profiteering underworld traffickers. Thus it would save the addict from turning to crime to pay for his habit.

Instead, say many authorities. addicts swarmed to the "feeding stations," using fictitious names, counterfit registration cards and other devices to load their pockets with low-cost drugs which they sold to street peddlers to spread addiction. Towns with clinics soon found they were a magnet for thieves, boodlums and prostitutes. Asked if he favors a renewal of the free clinic experiment, Anslinger said grimly:




