Board suspends Midway teacher

SANFORD — The Seminole County School Board upheld Tuesday a recom-mendation to continue the dismissal process against a special education teacher charged with inappropriate treat-ment of a student.

The Board voted to suspend without pay Midway Elementary School feacher Geoffrey Fitch, 43, following allegations the educator physically abused an 11Geoffrey Fitch accused of physically abusing special needs student

year-old special-needs student. He was suspended with pay the day after the Aug. 16 incident.

During a three-week investigation conducted by the Seminole County Public Schools Office of Professional Standards,

Fitch admitted he "lost it" while disciplining a child for misbehaving in class.

During the investigation, Fitch stated ne yeved at and grabbed the fifth-grader after she kicked another student in the head. He said he wanted the student to be upset in order to understand what she had done wrong. When the student turned her head away from Fitch, the teacher admitted he grabbed her chin in order to make her face him.

A classroom assistant reported the inci-dent to Midway Principal Sharon Tanner, who in turn notified the Professional Standards Office. Fitch, who has taught in the school system since October, was immediately suspended with pay.

Papaya: Tropical treasure discovered by the Conquistadors

The papaya was first found by the Spanish Conquistadors in

Panama and Colombia, and later distributed to almost all tropical areas of the

world. The fruit is highly as one of the most delicate and delicious tropical fruits, it is also the source of papain a meat tenderizer. Papayas are planted in Central Florida for their tropical accent in the landscape and exotic fruits but low temperatures may injure the plants if not protected, recovery from cold damage is

very slow.

Papayas are not trees but giant herbaceous plants. The single trunk is grayish, marked with large leaf scars and made up of

The fruit is meion shaped and contains many round, black seeds covered with a jelly-like substance. At maturity the fruit color may be yellow, orange or red and can weight from a few ounces to more trun 10 pouncs.

In nature, sphinx moths pollinate the papaya flowers.

Climate And Soil

Papayas grow best under warm conditions, temperatures below 30 degrees will produce injury to the leaves and prolonged low temperatures will cause death of the plant.

Plants require rich soils with a pH between 5.5 and 6.5 and good drainage. Root rots will develop if water does not drain well from around the root zone.

Cultivation

Use seed that will produce a high number of fruit bearing plants. Seeds obtained from a fruit of unknown origin may

produce surprising results.

Papayas require heavy fertilization. In Florida, young plants should be fertilized at planting with 1/2 pound. of a 10-10-5 formula with 30 percent of the nitrogen from organic sources. The fertilizer should be applied every two weeks increasing gradually to 1 1/2 pounds when plants are 7 to 8 months old.

After that, once a month applications of fertilizer are adequate. Supplemental Irrigation must be used during dry periods since water deficiencies will reduce growth, flower abortion or fruit drop.

According to Beary's report, in a 1999 crash history of the top 25 intersections in Seminole County, Lake Mary made the list three times. The city's worst intersection was 1-4 and Lake Mary Boulevard with 67 injuries, two fatalities and property damage of about \$600,000. Of the top 25 locations in Seminole, Lake Mary had \$1.1 million of the \$5 million in property damage.

'We've had an increase in complaints throughout the city, not only on Lake Mary Boulevard" Belfiore said. "But,

the increase in traffic is happening all over the state, not only Lake Mary."

Belfiore said the growth in traffic has led to an increase in accidents. However, many of the accidents are fender benders caused by people not paying. attention to their driving.

"They're in a hurry to go somewhere fast," Belfiore said. "They are following too close and running red lights."

Belfiere said motorists should keep the distance of one carlength between the vehicle in front of them for every 10 miles per hour they are going. If a vehicle is going 40 mph, there should be a distance of four cars

between it and the car in front

Belfiore said another traffic problem is motorists stopping on railroad tracks.

"Motorists want to get that extra foot or two and they stop on the tracks," he said. "We are issuing citations for this. If they are stopped on the tracks, they get a ticket, which will cost about \$90."

Legally, motorists should stop at the stop bar on either side of the tracks, Belfiore said.

"We heavily enforce this." Belfiore said. "We to make sure people are safe. That's what we're there for."

DEAR DR. GOTT: My girlfriend, who swears that she has been monogamous, was recently diagnosed with venereal warts. Fortunately, I have absolutely no sign of infection on myself. Do I need to worry nonetheless?

DEAR READER: The human papillomavirus, the cause of venereal warts, often is associat-

ed with tiny, almost invisible skin infections, especially on the male genitalia. These infections, which can be missed

by casual inspection, eventually

grow into warts that are clearly evident.

However, patients with these small, early infections are contagious and can spread the virus ring sexual contact. Furthermore, the papillomavirus has been implicated as a cause of cervical cancer in women. Therefore, early detec-tion (and treatment) of both partners is of paramount importance.

Urologists now perform androscopy, a test to identify microscopiq warts in males who have been exposed to the pupillomavirus, even if the men are TOTALLY FREE OF SYMP-TOMS. During this painless test, the patient's penis, scrotum and rectal area are sprayed with dilute acetic acid. Shortly, thereafter, the sprayed skin is meticulously examined with a magnifying glass. Minuscule papillomavirus infections that had heretofore been invisible turn white from the spray. A TV (cit) (Riend Date - Dian Tex

Once such discolored areas have been identified, they can be biopsied or treated. The most common therapies for venereal warts are freezing, cautery (burning), excision and laser ablation; also, the application of certain medicines - such as podophyllin — is often effective. Because venereel warts are associated with a high rate of recurrence, men should use condoms until there is unequivocal proof (by androscopy) that the warts have been eradicated. Repeated examinations may be necessary. In my opinion, you should be examined by a urologist as soon as possible.

DEAR DR. GOTTI I'm old enough to remember when mineral oil was commonly used as a laxative in both children and adults. Now I see that many brands of both lotion and skin cream have a mineral-oil base. Has any research shown that the external use of mineral oil can block vitamins and miner-

DEAR READER: Any kind of oil makes a good laxative; mineral oil, castor oil and olive oil are favorites. However, olibased laxatives have fortunately lost their allure (remember when having a daily bowel movement was as important as going to church?) for two reasons: They have been largely superseded by more palatable, gentler products (such as Milk. of Magnesia), and oily laxatives lead to health problems.

These concerns include damage to the intestinal lining, habituation (chronic use leads to dependency on oils with resulting rebound constipation when they are discontinued) and vitamin deficiency. Mineral oil, in particular, can lead to nutritional imbalance because it binds oil-soluble vitamins (especially

A, D and E) in the intestine, thereby preventing their absorption into the body.

Mineral oil applied to the skin does not interfere with digestion and vitamin metabolism, however. Consequently, the answer to your question is: no. Research has repeatedly shown that topical use of oilbased dermatological preparations is completely harmless. 




