(Continued From Page One) The House passed the bill on Tuesday. These three carried their arguments in half-page advertisements in several Florida newspapers today.

The advertisement addressed to "Mr. Grower" said the new citrus bill would substitute a present commission with a "brand name" commission "not elected by you, but appointed by the governor on July 1, 1949."

"No limit has been provided on the amount this new commission may spend for its administrative expenses, permitting them to spend for salaries etc., all of the money collected for advertising purposes.

"The minimum juice content of grapefruit would be substantially increased, thereby delaying movement of our crop for a period of 30 days, to the great advantage of Texas and other competing areas.

"This bill would fix maturity standards by arbitrary calendar dates, there is great danger that the courts would find this illegal, and then we would have no state authority standards on our fruit until the Legislature meets again."

"Why is it necessary to regulate the quality of Florida canned citrus products, which have grown from 1,000,000 cases to 51,000,000 cases per year for 18 years?"

"It would cost at least \$1,000,000 to over-plant existing can labels in conformity with the proposed compulsory grade labeling."

"Scores of northern buyers have registered their complete disapproval of compulsory grade labeling, stating it would not be practical."

Hearing Set On FEC Expenditures

JACKSONVILLE, Apr. 19—(AP)—A petition was filed in federal court today asking permission to spend about \$1,500,000 for improvements of the bankrupt Florida East Coast railway.

Hearing was set for Friday before Judge Louis W. Strawn. The petition, filed by the Manhattan company and FEC trustees, asked \$700,000 for 1949 in addition to an authorization of \$85,000 every six months as provided by an order of Jan. 31, 1941; and \$800,000 for 36 miles of new track and appurtenances.

Before the court for more than a year, now is a petition asking payment of additional coupons on \$45,000,000 first and refunding bonds.

Only four semi-annual \$2.25 coupons have been paid since the FEC went into receivership in 1934.

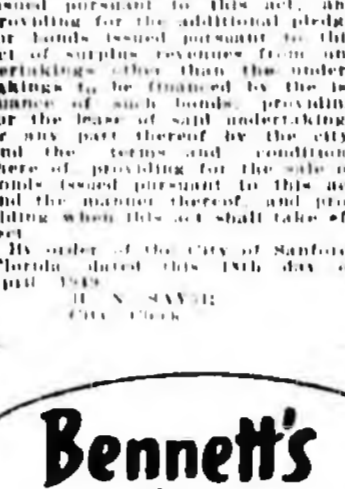
