

Kettles And Payne To Face Saints In Twin Bill Tonight

St. Augustine Captures Wild 10-8 Contest Of Celery Feds Last Night

Manager Ed Levy announced this afternoon that Goose Kettles and Jim Payne will be given the hurling assignments tonight in the twin bill with the St. Augustine Saints at the Municipal Park. The double header gets underway at 7:00 P. M.

Kettles will hurl the first contest which will be the play-off of the game rained out earlier this month. This contest is slated to go seven innings. The regularly scheduled game will follow with Payne on the hill.

In order to avoid a rush on

the box office, Sanford Association officials this morning urged that fans come as early as possible. A crowd of approximately 1,200 is expected to witness tonight's games.

Should the Feds take both ends of tonight's dual ball, Sanford would then take over second place in the league standings.

FRANCIS FIELD, St. Augustine, May 29, (Special)—Manager Bill Steinke's St. Augustine Saints maintained their hold

on second place in the Florida State League here last night when they captured a wild contest over Manager Ed Levy's Celery Feds at Francis Field by a score of 10 to 8.

Jim Schantel, Sanford right-hander, started on the mound for the visitors but was ejected in the fifth inning by Umpire Davis for protesting too vigorously a decision at the plate. Another right-hander, Cal Blane, took over the mound duties and hurled for three innings. Blane was credited with the loss. Buddy Lake, Fed leftfielder, tossed the eighth frame.

The three Fed hurlers were nipped for 13 hits by the big bats of the Saints. However, Sanford trapped out 11 bluffs off three St. Augustine pitchers, Jim Ketcher, Tom Smith and Ed White.

The Saints gathered in a single tally in the opening frame, two in the second and produced an 8-0 lead in the third. However, Sanford opened its scoring hostilities in the fourth by pushing over a single marker. The Feds racked up another in the fifth but the Saints came back to score one. Three Sanford runs in the sixth limited the count at 8-1. The Feds went into the lead in their half of the seventh with another three-run barrage but Blane was unable to stop the Saints who came back in their half of the stretch frame to score three times and take a 9-8 lead. Another run by the Saints in the eighth, only added to the St. Augustine margin.

Buddy Lake captured hitting honors for the evening with a single, double and a triple in four official at-bats. He connected three times in five trips. Levy recorded a

single and a double in four appearances.

INSIDE SPORTS REPORT

BASEBALL AND ORLANDO
The recent column on the Sanford Celery Feds by Charlie Wadsworth caused a great deal of talk among local baseball fans.

In fact some of them have openly remarked that Wadsworth practically handed Sanford the pennant. This is not quite the point that Wadsworth pointed out. He wrote that Sanford was the best ball club in the league and one of the reasons why they were was because of the support local fans were giving Manager Ed Levy's fighting Feds.

We agree with Wadsworth 100 percent. But as to Sanford winning the flag that is strictly another story.

Wadsworth if you will remember also praised the ability of the one time amazing Senators before they began their current slide. The same thing could happen to Sanford.

In our opinion, the Feds are undoubtedly one of the strongest clubs in the circuit today. But what will they be tomorrow? The Feds have their faults and the records will prove it. But on the surface they're a mighty fine club.

The Fed hitting has been slowed down a bit lately due to the fact that they've become a flag contender and naturally the Feds draw the best pitchers of the second division teams that, to date, haven't been able to establish a schedule for their hurlers. Levy established a hurling slate about ten days ago and has followed it carefully. He selected Jim Schantel, Jim Payne, Goose Kettles and Jodie Howington as his starters. He has Cal Blane, Charlie Blison and Buddy Lake on hand for relief work. Schantel, Payne, Kettles and Howington have been working in that respective order.

We don't intend to sell the Celery Feds short. But at the same time we don't intend to place the state loop crown on the heads of the Feds either. It will be a long hard battle and every game must be played cautiously.

The biggest discrepancy in the various Fed phases of ability, in our own opinion, is base running. The Feds have had a number of runners nipped off the sacks and nabbed while attempting to advance. However, we're not second guessing Skipper Levy or his base line coaches for that for we know that a winning ball club is one that will take chances and scrap for every break in the game.

But all in all, Sanford is well represented in the circuit and the Sanford fans are really supporting the club. We've personally heard numerous comments from ball buyers themselves as to the number of people who travel to Leesburg, DeLand, Daytona Beach and particularly Orlando to support the local line. And playing before packed stands during home games is certainly a morale builder to any baseball team.

Again we say: Don't sell the Feds short. But let's not raise the bunting at the Municipal Park just yet!

Memorial Day

It is a sad reflection that the celebration of this day comes at a time when, perhaps more than at any other period since the Civil War, there is a great wave of misunderstanding and controversy in this country.
 Fortunately, there is no armed warfare, open or threatened, but only a difference of opinion and procedure among large economic groups in the field of organized labor. Yet this problem itself goes to the head of all authority, and is capable of arousing division among individuals and groups to a degree which might seriously harm the national welfare.
 On Memorial Day we honor the dead who gave their lives for freedom. It is the time of all times to remember and hold sacred our American ideals when there is any such possibility of serious political or economic division among honorable men.

The Rochester Strike

Although Senator Claude Pepper announced over the radio Tuesday night that the rail strike had been settled, the coal strike was practically settled, and peace had returned to the warring management-labor factions in this country and that as a consequence no additional labor legislation is needed at this time, we picked up our paper Wednesday morning and read about the strike of municipal employees in the city of Rochester, N. Y.
 There all municipal services were slowed to a standstill by a strike of 48,000 CIO and AFL workers following the discharge of 500 department of public works employees and the arrest of 267 pickets for disorderly conduct. Public transportation had broken down completely as all buses, subway trains and taxicabs ceased operations in that city of 325,000 persons.
 Streets were reported as littered with paper and debris as the entire street cleaning department stayed off the job. Uncollected garbage was piling up in recent weeks and in downtown areas theaters had to close and the city's two newspapers were unable to publish their usual editions. Anthony Capone, the CIO leader, issued a statement to the City Commission that the strike would continue until the City agreed upon "the mandate from all Rochester labor."
 This is not a strike against the government of the United States, but a strike against the government of the city of Rochester. We wonder if the authority of such a city government should be less than that of any other organized municipality. We wonder what will eventually happen to our city and to every other city in which city employees can force city officials to do their bidding. Senator Pepper to the contrary notwithstanding, it strikes us that the safety and security of our entire country depends upon an immediate solution to this problem of labor-management relations.

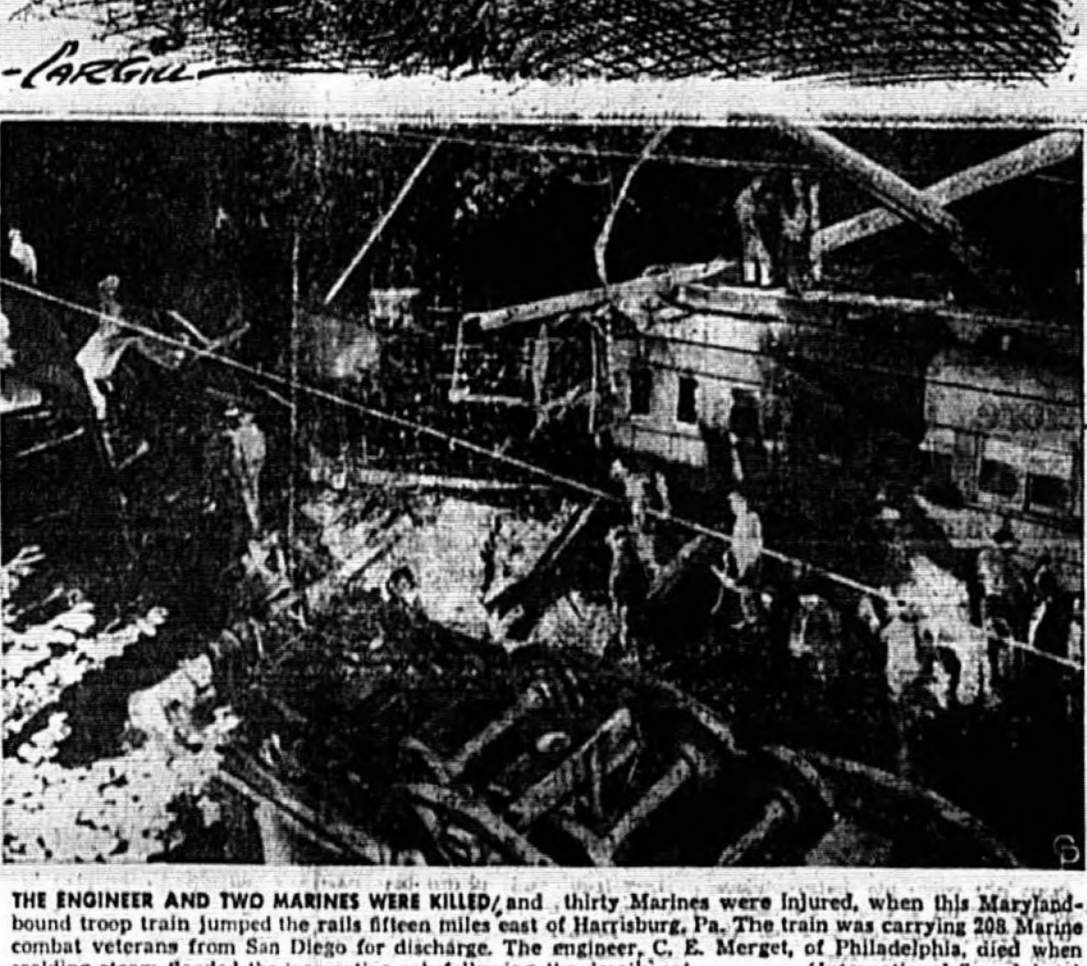

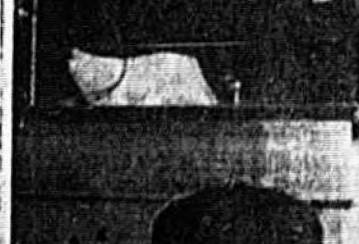

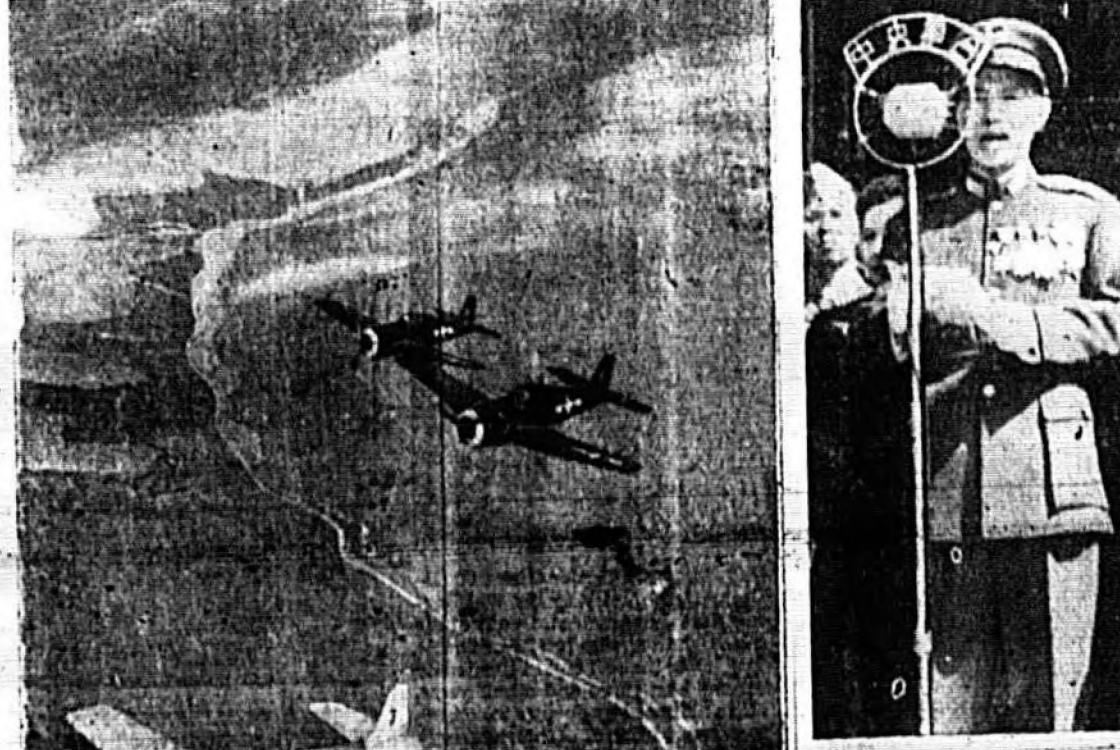
