

Bailey Defends State Adult **School Program**

School Supt. Thomas D. Bailey today defended Florida's controversial adult education program and urged its expansion.

Beiley told an adult education meeting, being held in connection with the Florida Education Association's convention here, that the legislative "freeze" on the program in 1950 was due largely to a "lack of understanding." Commitments of legislative lead-

ers against new taxes also had something to do with it, he said. There was pressure in the Legislature to abandon state support of adult education programs altogether following criticism of some courses like basket-weaving as "frills."

Finally, the Legislature decided to freeze the program at its 1936level and allow no expansion.
