Fire Prevention Week

With the proclamation by President Roosevelt setting aside the week of Oct. 5 to Oct. 11 as Fire Prevention Week, it is well for the public to consider the added importance of fire prevention as the nation grids itself for increased efforts toward national defense and the spectre of war approaches nearer and nearer.

Heretofore, most fires have been the result of carelessness. They have been caused by cigarettes thoughtlessly thrown away while still burning, by faulty wiring in our homes, by defective heating systems, and by countless other means which could easily be avoided.

In times of war fires are caused deliberately and assume increasingly dangerous significance. They are caused by saboteurs desperately trying to block the nation's war effort. They are caused by accidents resulting in the handling of dangerous munitions and other explosive materials. They are caused by enemy bombers.

And when fires occur in times of war, they are apt to be much more costly. A factory burning down when a nation is at peace may result in the loss of considerable money, but when a factory burns in time of war it may mean a shortage of fighter planes, of tanks or guns which are needed to turn the tide of battle.

Even the burning of a private home, commercial buildings or idle forest acres is a hindrance to the nation's war effort. The home or building being rebuilt may require raw materials needed in defense industries. Burning forests consume countless tons of timber and pulp wood vital to defense.

So it becomes the patriotic duty of every citizen to avoid carelessly starting fires and to take every possible precaution to prevent others, whether they are saboteurs or just plain stupid, from starting them.

Our Daily Bread

"Give us this day our daily bread" is a plea that most of us learned while very young. So it comes somewhat as a shock to learn that the "daily bread" of thousands of American youngsters today is not enough.

One of the most surprising results of using surplus agricultural products to provide hot lunches for school children, is discovery that nearly half the undernourished children are from farm homes. This is a condemning condition in a land of plenty. Farming has become too much of a means of making money instead of a way of living.

Preservation of national vitality demands greater production of food for home use, on soils that are better understood and managed. These, then, must be used more intelligently and to best advantage.

A simple rule set up by our state board of health says that all dietary essentials—calories, protein, minerals, vitamins—should be adequately supplied if the daily meals for each person include: Milk—1 quart for babies and small children, 3 or 4 cups for other boys and girls, 2 cups for grown folks, 1 quart for expectant or nursing mothers. Cereals and Bread—Dark, cooked cereal for breakfast. Dark bread instead of white. Fats and sugars—Not too much. Fruits and Vegetables—Orange, grapefruit or tomato, other fruits, fresh and dried. Potatoes and one or two other vegetables. (Dark-green-leafed and raw vegetables used often.) Eggs—At least three or four a week. Meat, fish, cheese, dried beans, and peas—At least one of these.—Florida Grower.

Buying Defense Bonds

Florida is doing right well in the purchase of national Defense Bonds. And when the emergency is over and prices again resume a normal level, Floridians will have money with which to buy at bargain prices. Texas bought more Defense Bonds during the summer months than any other Southern State, but Florida was next.

"Florida bought \$4,164,000 worth of the Defense Bonds—more than any other southern state except Texas," says the St. Petersburg Independent.

North Carolina, with \$3,568,000 people to Florida's 1,897,000, bought \$2,861,000 worth of bonds. Georgia, with \$3,120,000 people, bought \$3,056,000 worth. Tennessee, with 2,911,000 people, bought \$3,203,000 worth. Other southern states whose populations are larger than Florida's but whose bond purchases were smaller were Louisiana, Kentucky, Mississippi, South Carolina and Virginia.

"Though ranked the twenty-seventh state in the union with respect to population, Florida was nineteenth in bond purchases. It is true that Florida can and should do more. But we may take at least a little pride in the fact that Florida shows up well in comparison with other states from this standpoint."

Reception Centers For Selectees Believed To Be Under-Publicized

RECEPTION CENTER, Camp Blending, Oct. 7.—(Special)—There are a few major organizations of the new national defense program that are an intentionally under-publicized as the Reception Centers. There a single individual is transported overnight from civilian to military life by experts in handling Uncle Sam selective service recruit system.

Since the establishment of Camp Blending, one of the nation's largest military centers, thousands of potential leaders have been inducted into the service and assigned to regiments all over the United States.

This article, prepared under the supervision of Lt. Colonel Ira E. Ryder, Commanding Officer of the Reception Center, is for the purpose of answering the numerous questions that arise upon receiving the selectee, who are men who have been inducted into the Army. It is by now the procedure will be explained to give the future soldier a clear picture of what to expect when he reports to the Reception Center.

After induction into the Army, the selectee will be assigned to a reception center where he will receive the necessary instruction phase, requiring twenty minutes and the final test, requiring forty minutes.

After the test, the selectees are marched into another room where the benefits of National Life Insurance are explained, and every man given an opportunity to subscribe for a policy. It is stated as given up to the man, which is for the amount of \$10,000,000.

After each man has either signed an application for insurance or a statement that he does not desire it, he is sent to the reception center, where he is assigned a number of questions to answer in his past experience. The questions are: (1) Name, (2) Address, (3) Education, (4) Religion, (5) Marital Status, (6) Civilian Occupation, (7) Military Service, (8) Criminal Record, (9) Physical Condition, (10) Character, (11) References, (12) Other.

Music Competition On Radio Will Continue

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7.—(AP)—A large segment of the radio industry, preparing to enter a new five-year agreement with the National Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers, expressed determination Sunday to continue support of ASCAP's revived music publishing organization—Broadway Music, Inc.—in order to assure competition in the radio music field.

Neville Miller, president of the National Association of Broadcasters, said in a statement that the National Broadcasting Company and the Columbia Broadcasting System had previously supported BMI for the period of the new contract which ASCAP has offered the radio chains and individual broadcasting stations.

Germans Are Given Diet Of Bull Fights

NEW YORK, Oct. 7.—(AP)—The Nazis are luring bull fighters into occupied countries with fat fees in order to give German troops "battle-to-death" recreation, a ranking Mexican matador said Sunday on his return from Europe, flying from Lisbon.

Ricardo Torres, veteran of 300 battles, declared the drive to popularize the fights was especially intense in France where several elaborate programs have been staged. While Torres himself did not appear in occupied countries, he said many of his fellow-matadors had.

"The Germans know little about bull fights," he said. "But they are given signals when to applaud. At other times when I command they leap to their feet like robots and shout 'heil'."
