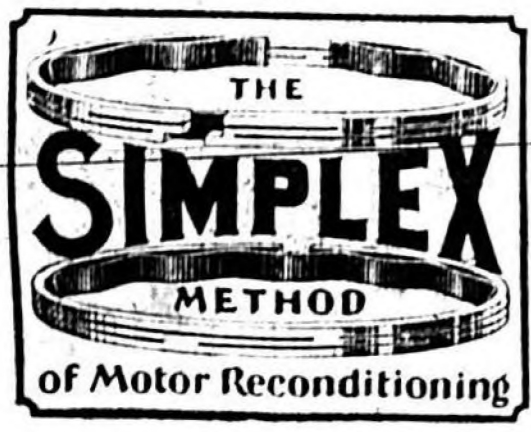

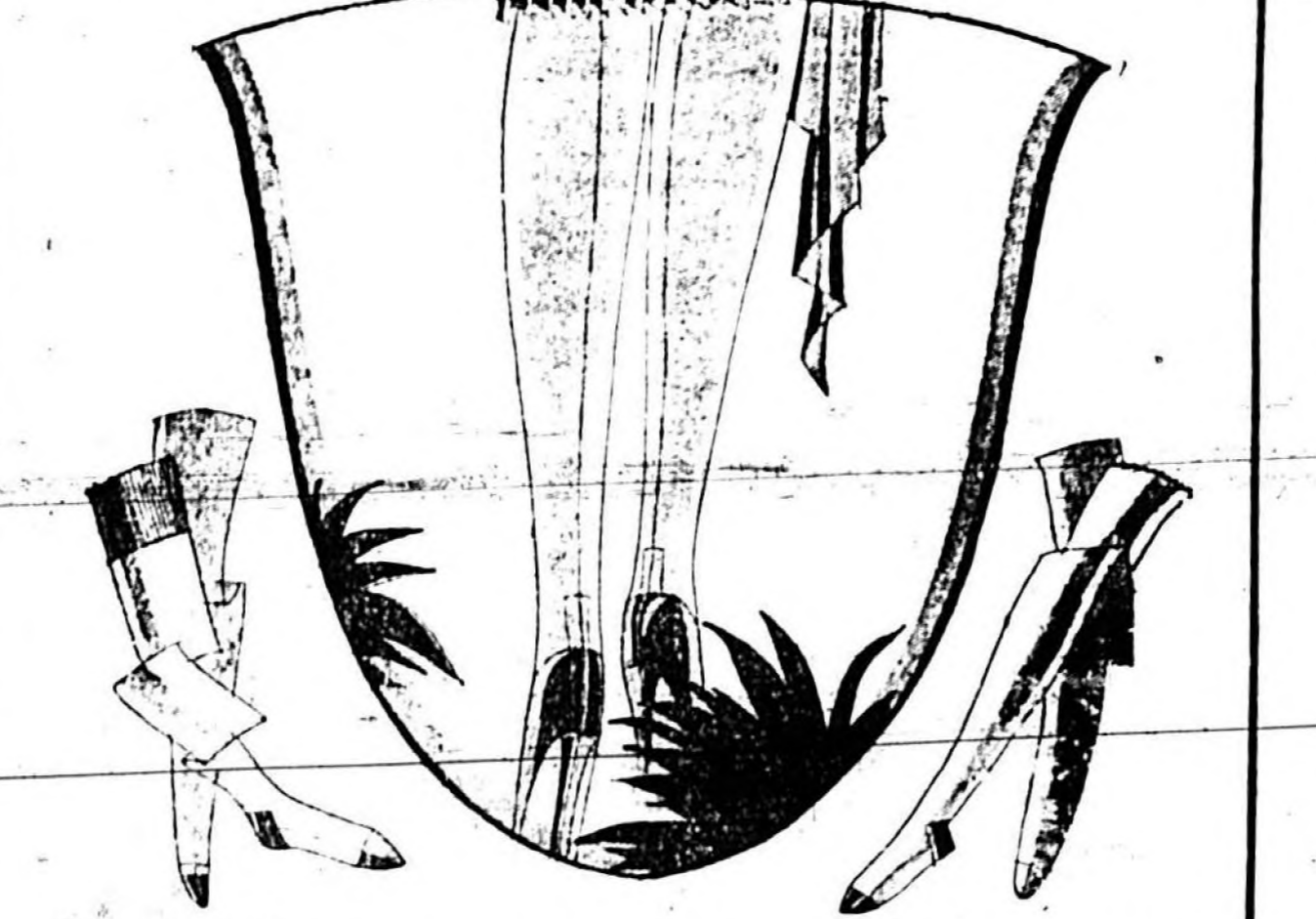

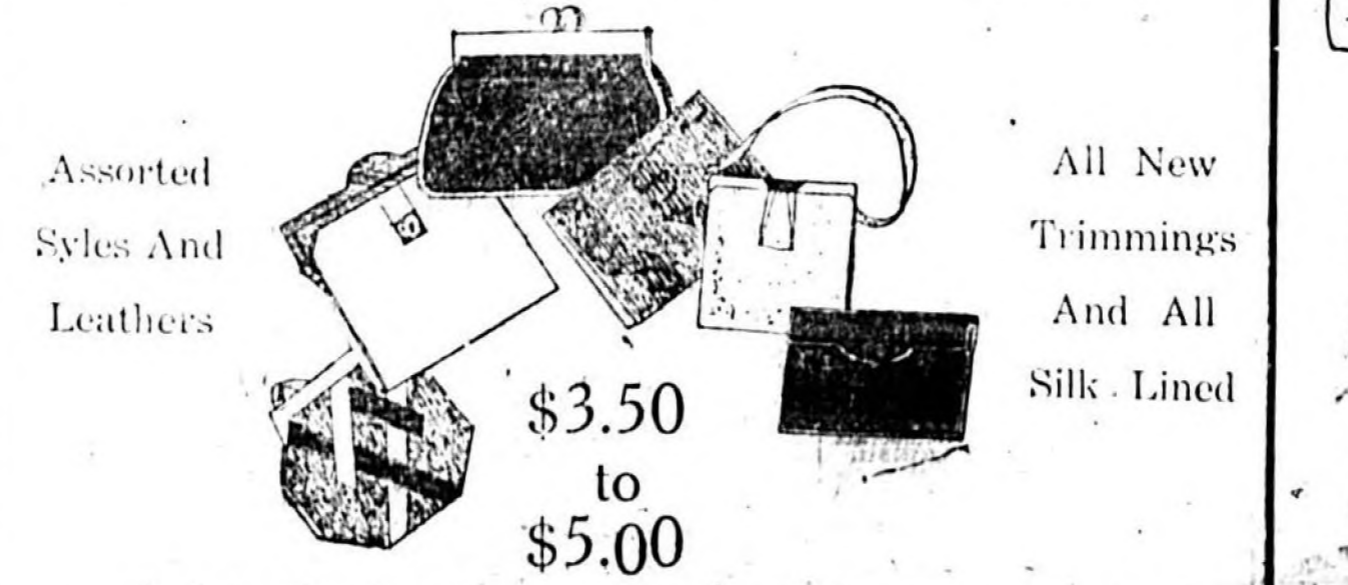

Almost every gubernatorial candidate is claiming the support of almost every newspaper in the state.

That's very much like some of these meetings with a thousand or fifteen hundred present, some of them all having.

Get Ready To Vote

We often wonder what would happen in this country of ours if fifty per cent of our population were suddenly disfranchised. Imagine the soap-box orations against the tyranny of government.

And yet that is exactly what happens on every election day. We have not the statistics at hand, but we venture the assertion that far less than fifty per cent of the people, who have the right to vote, actually go to the polls.

There remain exactly ten more days in which Seminole County citizens can register for the Democratic primary on June 5. There should be at least three thousand persons registered for this election.

The Miami Herald writes interestingly of those who do take time to register and vote. They are the bootleggers, the gamblers, the professional politicians and their henchmen.

"Florida is facing just such a crisis. If the good people of the state don't get out and cast their votes for the upright men, they can have no complaint if the other kind get elected, proceed to pillage the state treasury, sell off all state jobs, sell pardons and appointments to the highest bidders and drive companies with big investment possibilities out of the state."

Mayo's Duties

The average person is so interested in the race for Governor or in the progress made by various county candidates that he often loses sight of other important offices that must be filled in the coming election.

Not the least of these is that of commissioner of agriculture, a position now being well filled by Naham Mayo. A great agricultural section such as Seminole county should be vitally interested in seeing that this office is occupied by a capable man who thoroughly understands the duties of his office and who is conversant with Florida agricultural conditions.

In a recent issue the Tampa Tribune lists the duties of the commissioner of agriculture and we reprint them here for the benefit of our readers:

A land division, which has the custody of all state lands.

A field note division, which gives service in that line in connection with federal and state surveys.

A prison division which has supervision of all state prisons and convict camps.

A bureau of immigration which handles the state's publicity program, directing the campaign conducted to bring new settlers into the state.

A shellfish division which has charge of the issuance of licenses to fishermen and fish dealers.

A state marketing bureau with headquarters in Jacksonville which compiles and furnishes current information regarding the marketing of Florida products and keeps growers supplied with statistics and other advices.

A state chemist division, which does analysis work of the state.

In addition to directing these divisions and seeing that they function properly, the commissioner of agriculture is a member of the board of state institutions, and has direct charge of the state hospital for the insane, the prison farm, the boys' industrial school, the girls' school at Ocala and the college for the feeble minded at Gainesville; he is a member of the internal improvement board, of the state pardoning board, of the text book commission and of the budget commission and he is also one of the commissioners of the Everglades drainage district.
