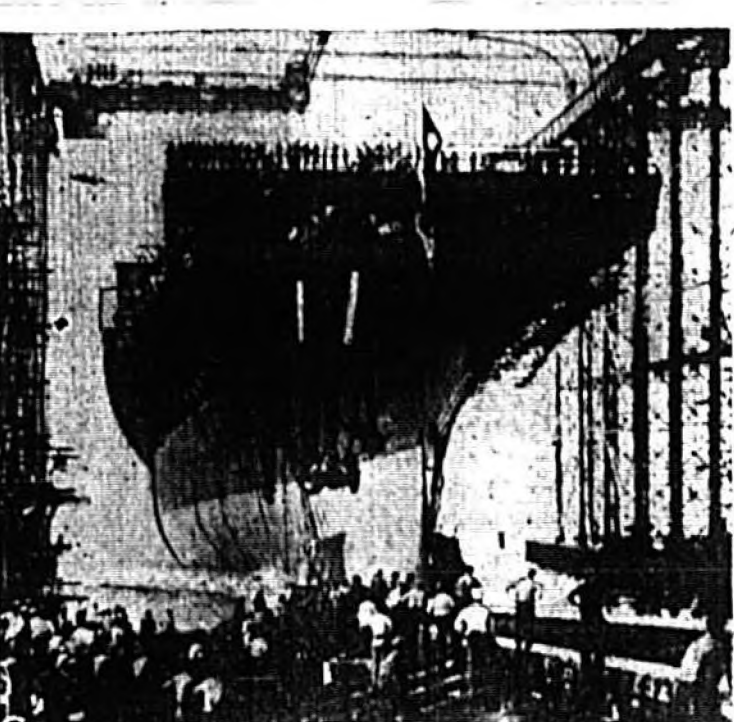

R. L. Glenn, Former Resident, Is Given New Federal Post

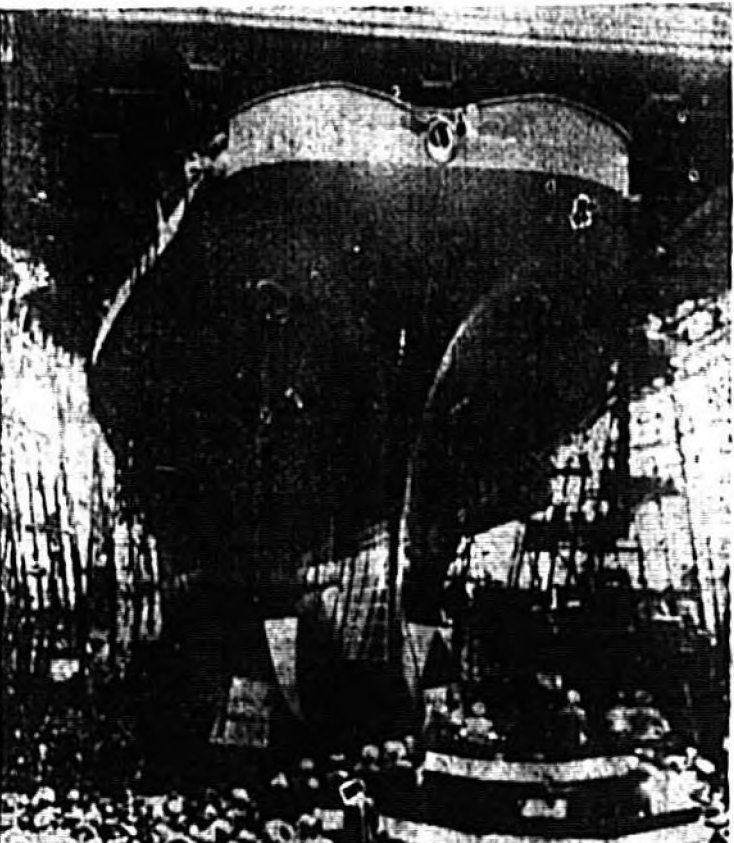
Robert L. Glenn, who for many years was active in promoting civic improvements in Sanford, was named on July 1 as director of the ODT Division of Transport Personnel.

The manufacturer of the waterproofing material has been asked to supply a small quantity of the material for testing.

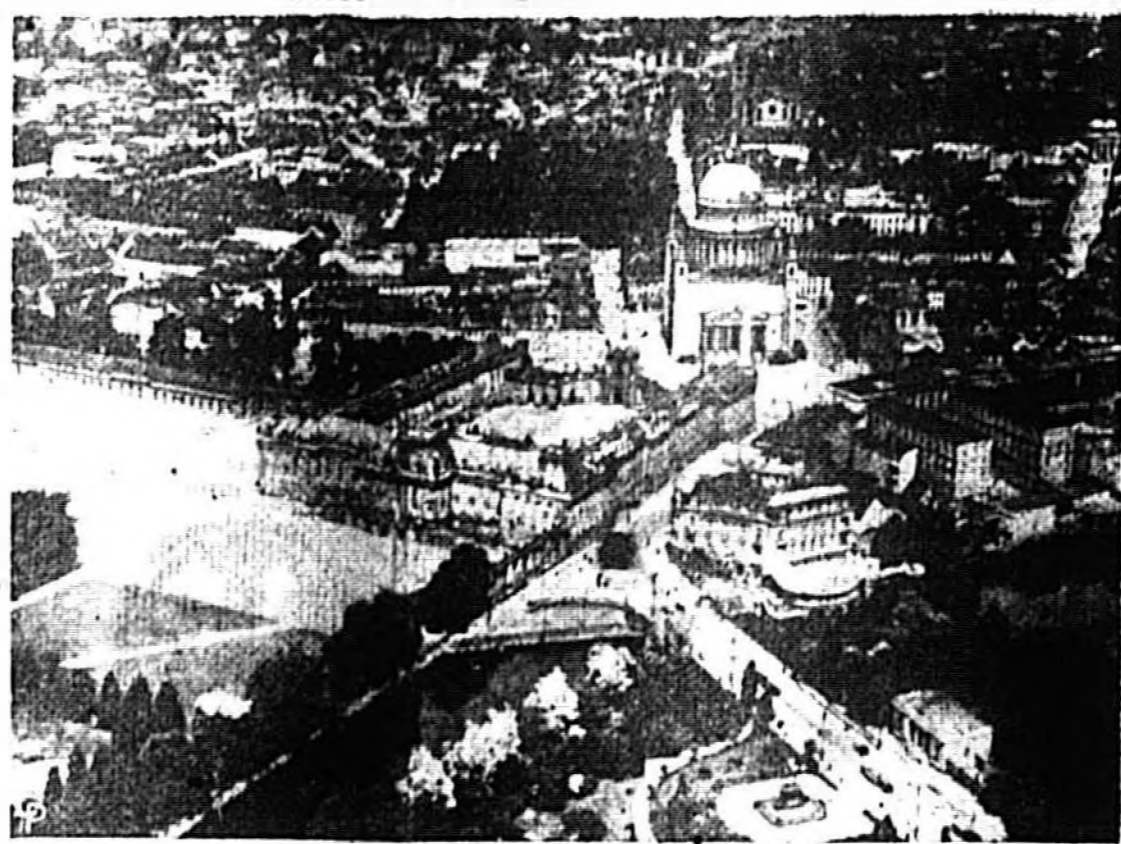
According to reports, the material is fitted with a canvas-like covering which is rolled into a depth of two to three inches. When it rains, the water slides off into ditches or canals.

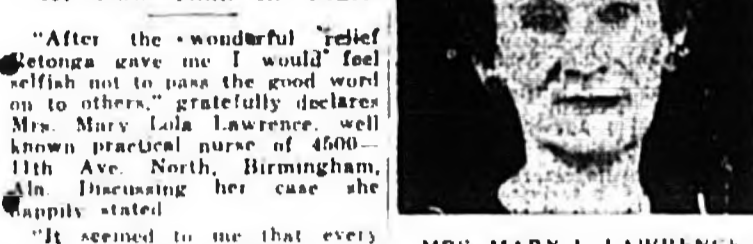

BIBLE VERSE FOR TODAY

THERE WERE SOME WHO THOUGHT THEY HAD LAUGHED IT OUT OF COURT FIVE YEARS AGO. THEY THOUGHT MEIN KAMPF WAS MORE SUITABLE FOR A GREAT RACE. THEY IMPRISONED THE MOST FEARLESS PREACHERS OF THE GOSPEL. THEY ARE FREE NOW, BUT WHAT HAS BECOME OF THE AUTHOR OF MEIN KAMPF? Romans 1:16: I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ.

Congress has voted to construct a new roof over the Capitol. After all these years of so much hot air, we can't understand how the roof has held up as well as it has.

Elmer Davis, head of OWI, admits that an article by his organization put out for Russian consumption depicting economic conditions in the Middle West was "badly written." If the OWI's objective in the foreign field is to try to show what "sorry" country America is, then we think the agency should be abolished.

Rear Adm. Husband E. Kimmel, the "goat" of Pearl Harbor, promises to "talk plenty" if and when he is ever given the opportunity before a court martial. And we have no doubt that he will for the right reason—defeating the charges on his trial has been that what he has to say will not be pleasant "listening" for many higher-ups.

As Japan admits that her "aircraft arsenal" has suffered a "temporary setback," Admiral Halsey's famous Third Fleet is staging an unprecedented attack on Tokyo, daring the Japanese Navy and air force to come out and fight. If they don't, it is probably because "Bull" Halsey will get his wish to ride Hirohito's white horse, unless that famed charger is burned to a crisp in the ensuing conflagration.

The news blackout in Russia and Russian-occupied countries is the "gravest single menace" to peace, declares Senator Wiley of Wisconsin. The big question, however, is how to eliminate the news blackout. The Soviets believe their system of controlled propaganda is the epitome of press freedom, and that our system is just the opposite, because, so they think, our news is controlled by the advertisers. When you find a people or a form of government believing that black is white and that white is black, there is little anyone can do about it.

An American congressman demands that Great Britain come into the war against Japan stating that so far as he knew the British aren't contributing a thing towards fighting the Japanese. This kind of talk is sheer demagoguery. For even a grammar school boy knows that British troops have driven the Japs out of Burma, destroyed several hundred thousand of them in the process; that Australian troops have given the Japs a bad beating in oil-rich Borneo; that a very sizable section of the British Navy is operating in the Pacific and that three of her aircraft carriers were attacked just recently by Jap kamikaze fliers. Permanent peace and mutual understanding between nations are not served by ignorant utterances of men high in public life.

The soldier, who was sentenced to two years for slapping Germans, then reprieved and more or less made a hero by the sentimental public even to the extent of being given a War Bond by a Jacksonville group, is back in trouble again. In his 18th court martial conviction Private McGee received a six month sentence on hard labor for being AWOL, drunkenness, swearing to a false affidavit and wearing combat awards not entitled to him. The charges at the other military hearings included being AWOL, drunkenness, fighting, disrespect to a superior officer, using a military halibut without permission, and slapping the Nazi prisoners. We hope that no instance of a Congressman this time will "get him off" lightly so that he may be inspired to continue his un-military and law-

One Woman To Another

Gladys Richmond, of London, England, writes the New York Times "to pay tribute to the mothers, wives, sweethearts of the American boys who have done and are doing such a grand job of work." She says the English have seen these boys "fresh from the dust and grime of battle, helping us in our suffering, always there as quickly as any civil defense aid could be, doing their utmost to help."

She speaks of their concern for the well-being of the English people of their gaiety and friendliness. Then she speaks of how the English women have come to know and appreciate the women of America through these boys.

"It is as though one flew on a magic carpet, having the most amazing experiences as one visits each state. The Middle West with its deep blue skies and miles of rolling green plains, California with its orange groves, through the cities teeming thousands with the lights aglow, on into the tenement areas, where the heart of America beats proud and strong, back again to some quiet backwater, perhaps fishing, perhaps just lazing the time away."

"Not infrequently we caught glimpses of happy wives playing and romping with their children just before bedtime, or in some stately country home where a mother waits with anxiety such as only a mother can know. We see pictures of happy, laughing girls or stately matrons from Washington to Florida, New York to California, we have felt the warmth of your friendship and have known in our hearts you have followed along the same path we have trod, always ready to give a helping hand. O you women of America! You truly have just cause to be proud of the men you bore!"

The women of America are proud—and grateful to the women of other countries for such appreciation as that expressed in this warm and understanding letter.

Science Or Magic

It was an interesting revelation that Herbert Agar, special assistant to the American ambassador in London, made the other night.

"If the war had gone on another six months," he said, "it is quite possible that this planet would have ceased to exist, because it was probable that someone would have learned to break the atom without controlling it. There was a danger that the Germans would learn how to split it first, and our scientists gave the date as of August 6 of this year. I sincerely believe that in a very few years, the human being will know how to destroy the human race."

Well, intelligent human beings already seem to have a pretty good notion of how it might be done, without invoking any magical formula. Maybe all that is necessary is just one more attempt at what German leaders a few years ago were calling "another fresh, jolly war."

Scientific destruction for everybody but the destroyers is an old idea. It may conceivably be carried out some time to a considerable extent, and the Germans might be depended on to try it at least once.

But, as one of Shakespeare's character sanely observed, "A long time ago this world began, and so far there is no visible evidence that it is near the end. God is still in his heaven. And although we can hardly say that 'all's right with the world,' there seems to be a trend that way. So far as most of us can see, what we need is to step up the trend among people of good will, and fight the Devil instead of each other."

The Tractor Age

It may well be that this economic era will be known as the Age of the Tractor. The tractor is certainly reforming, and may be a major factor in saving America's basic industry—agriculture.

Tractors on farms rose from less than a million in 1930 to 1,570,000 in 1940. It is estimated that in the current season of 1945, in spite of wartime restrictions, more than 2,000,000 are in use.

Mechanization of the farm is here. And its full development will be speeded up by farmers' sons, who will return to the land with experience gained in an almost wholly mechanized war.

The session some called it North Florida and South Florida. Well, that is untrue. It is a matter of two groups, one being the constitutional group, while the other is a constitutional group. The House Majority group, the Senate Minority group, when I term as the constitutional group, feels that upon the oath that we have taken and the confidence of the people who sent us here, that regardless of expense or inconvenience on our part, we are duty bound to continue the fight until the final end, or until our term of office expires. It is true, practically everyone of the Representatives and Senators are getting very tired and feel that the voters of our various districts should lend us every possible backing and encouragement that we might carry out our duty and to the purpose of which we were elected to do.

I notice from the press that a number of the counties in South Florida are really lacking

in these delegations, both in sentiment and of helping to bear their expenses. I realized last week when I visited my county, talking with a number of citizens, that there is not more than one out of five who really knows or understands what the fight is all about and I feel that a proposition that is as far-reaching as this reorganization, that the newspapers of each county should put that so regularly before the voters that they all become educated in regard to every phase of it.

History will show that there have been wars started over less differences than what we are facing now. With the present year which was caused from nothing less than 2 or 4 dictatorial subjects wanting to dictate to the world what to do, and I feel this difference in the Legislature of the State of Florida is demonstrating very clearly that democracy is being knocked out the door. The State of Florida is in good many of us is the greatest

state in the union and with genuine democracy and fairness to all, it could be still a greater state. The proposition has been circulated during this session that there was a matter of large counties trying to overrun small counties, which is not true, because any reorganization in the Senate directing will only affect small counties. It will not change the large counties whatsoever.

"I think Duval county should get the praise of every democrat in the State of Florida because that delegation (10) is not fighting for small counties or large counties. They are trying with the rest of us to carry out the constitution of the State of Florida of which the people themselves ratified in 1925.

The end of the state for which we are trying to get a fair play is producing in state revenue annually something over \$60,000,000 that part of the state has a population of 1,200,000 with a representation in the Senate of 10 senators, while the other end of the state has a population of 600,000 and contributes in state revenue less than \$30,000,000. I feel that anyone who will give the picture a fair glance can see that there is no fairness in the present set up

Florida canners contend that point rationing has held back the sale of grapefruit and blended juice while orange juice, not rationed, has been moving into consumer channels at a fast clip. They say that unless old stocks are cleaned up prior to the start of the new season, they will not be able to pay satisfactory prices to growers for raw fruit.
