Hot County Budget May 'Burn' Tonight

By CHRIS NELSON BOB LLOYD Herald Staff Writers. A series of small bombs could combine into a major explosion in Seminole County Commission chambers tonight, leaving the board's proposed \$12.3 million budget in a shambles of threatened lawsuits and ill feelings.

Sanford city commissioners have instructed City Atty. Vernon Mize to appear at tonight's county commission public hearing on the proposed fire district reorganization. However, as Marsee himself pointed out, since state law requires the county to send its budget to Tallahassee prior to the start of the Oct. 1 fiscal year if it desires to spend any money legally after that date—a supplemental tax bill will be necessary.

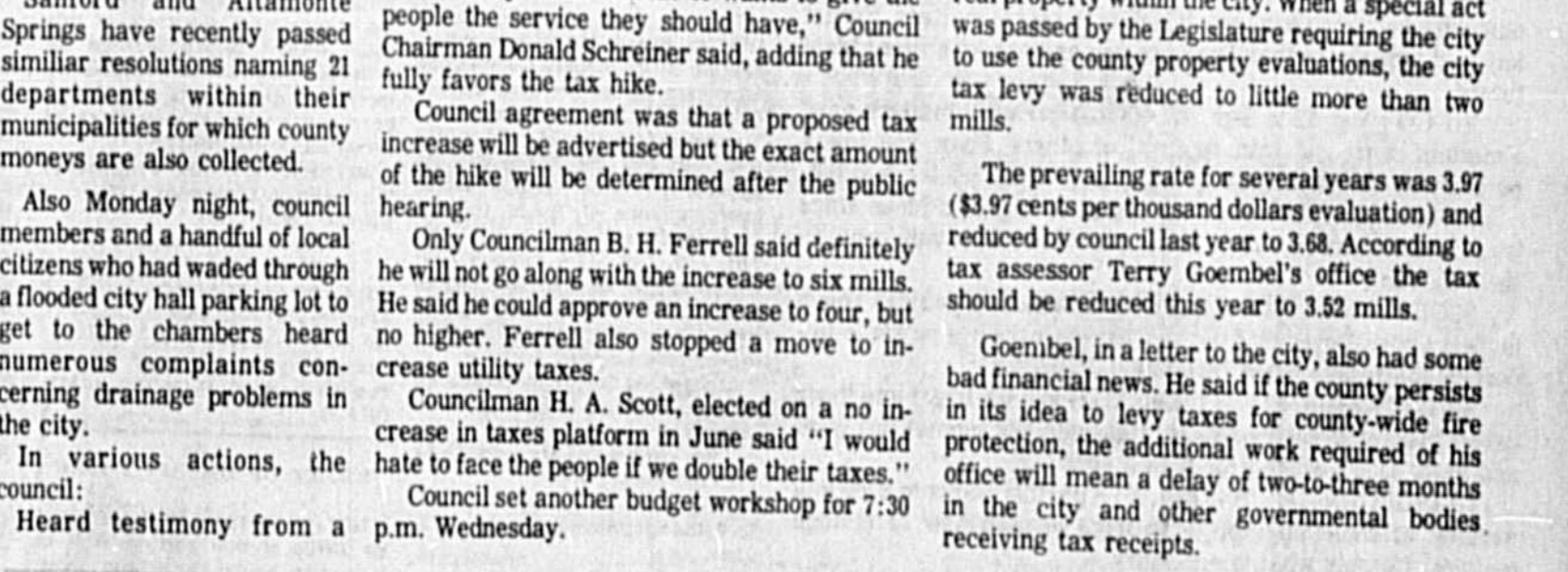

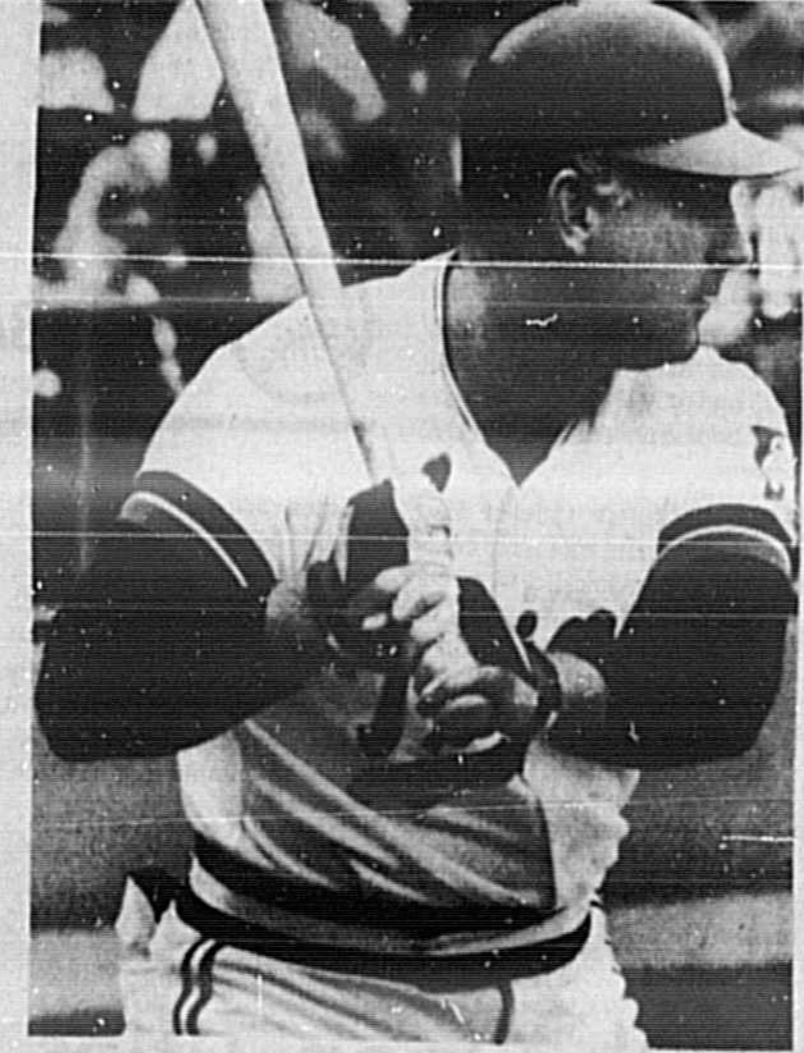

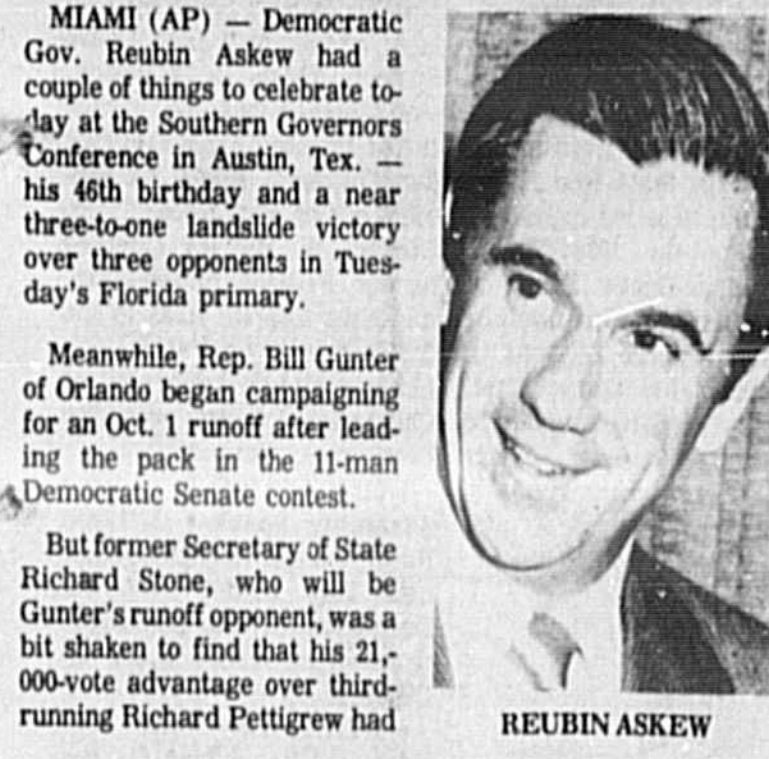

MIAMI (AP) — Democratic Gov. Reubin Askew had couple of things to celebrate today at the Southern Governors Conference in Austin, Tex. ... Stone, 45, pulled 142,000 votes, or 20 per cent. Public Work Jobs Ordered By Ford

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Ford announced today he has ordered the spending of \$415 million to finance 85,000 public sector jobs in state and local governments. ... "To leaders of our labor unions, and to the captains of industry, I make a sincere appeal for restraint," said Ford. ... "Settlements at the bargaining table are the responsibility of the participants as long as they respect the public interest."

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Polk Satisfied; Budget Adopted

A midnight compromise on a \$2.1 million sheriff's budget and a determination to forge ahead with a county-wide fire tax district enabled Seminole County Commissioners to pass through the valley of the shadow relatively unscathed early today. ... The board, which also promised to cooperate in the face of a promised legal challenge by at least Sanford and Caseberry on the question of "double taxation" for fire, police and other services, adopted its overall \$3.3 million budget near 1 a.m. after four hours of public debate.

Polk was referring to complaints by Sanford and other cities, as well as county tax assessor Terry Goebel, that failure to produce a total budget would cause financial chaos because tax bills could not be sent out—and revenues could not be collected. ... However, that threat and others failed to materialize as the commission adopted a \$2.1 million budget for Polk, and hammered out minor adjustments in the overall budget.

Two Florida Supreme Court justices were re-elected in non-partisan races. ... Justice Joe Boyd of Tallahassee defeated Rivers Buford of Tallahassee, and Justice Ben Overton of St. Petersburg beat Circuit Judge Shelby Highsmith of Miami.

Two Rail Officers Indicted

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two former Penn Central Railroad officers and three other men have been indicted on federal charges of conspiring to misapply \$4.2 million in Penn Central funds. ... The Justice Department said today that the five also were charged with mail and wire fraud in a 23-count indictment returned in U.S. District Court in Philadelphia Tuesday.
