# Hot County Budget May 'Burn' Tonight

A series of small bombs could combine into a major explosion in Seminole County Commission chambers tonight, leaving the board's proposed \$13.3 million budget in a shambles of threatened lawsuits and ill feelings.

First to go up in flames could be the proposed county-wide fire tax district, which faces opposition from volunteer departments fearful of losing authority, and cities opposed to complicated tax bills. Then, the sheriff's currently budgeted \$1.88 million allotment

must still be negotiated.

Should the disputes delay approval or either the sheriff's or fire budgets, the spectre of a supplemental tax bill has been raised by bureaucrats anxious to avoid an even worse possibility-sending city government s to the bank to borrow operating funds until the budget hassles are worked out. And lurking on the horizon are threatened city lawsuits against the county over the question of "double taxation" for

The board is scheduled to give its overall budget a final reading after disposing of six prior agenda items, starting at 7 p.m., but just when all should be flowing smoothly, all seems to

Chairman John Kimbrough, who earlier predicted that if the sheriff's appeal is carried through to Tallahasee the cabinet will award fellow-Democrat Polk up to \$250,000, today told newspeople that negotiations have broken down. Polk later denied this, and agreed to meet with Vihlen, saying "if the negotiations have broken down, they've broken

down on their (the commissioner's) part." The sheriff also dismissed rumors of a contemplated lawsuit by the commission testing the constitutionality of the Cabinet's authority to raise taxes in Seminole county by hiking his budget.

If the threatened problems with Polk's budget and the county-wide fire district are not hammered out tonight or in the near future, County Tax Assessor Terry Goembel has raised a

problem of his own-the cost and delay in sending out supplemental tax bills.

However, as Marsee himself pointed out, since state law requires the county to send its budget to Tallahassee prior to the start of the Oct. 1 fiscal year if it desires to spend any money legally after that date-a supplemental tax bill will be

Far from being a simple compromise to buy time, however, tax assessor Goembel has warned that a paper shortage could delay sending out bills for at least another three months, and could cost as much as \$40,000.

To add even more spice to the financial stew being cooked up by the commission is the threat several cities say they face if the board balks at passing a budget without the sheriff or fire

The municipalities say that unless a supplemental tax bill is sent, they will be forced to borrow money from banks-at today's inflated interest rates-just to balance their books. Sanford officials say a two or three month delay would mean the cities in the county, as well as county government,

Vernon Mize to appear at tonight's county commission public hearing on the proposed fire district requesting the county proceed with the regular tax roll and later issue a supplemental tax roll to fund the fire district.

Sanford is also, in anticipation of possible legal action, asking the county assume the responsibility for any costs the cities may have if they have to borrow money from banks until tax funds are received.

Although municipalities aren't involved in the fire district controversy, the tax assessor's office handles all property tax assessments for cities along with the county tax roll. Thus any delay in the county tax roll means a delay in cities' tax rolls as



#### Copyright Law Revised

WASHINGTON (AP) - A major revision of the nation's copyright law, including extension of protection past the life of the copyright holder, has been approved by a 70-1 vote of the Senate.

The measure now goes to the House, which is not expected to act on it this year. If the House does not act this year, the legislation would have to start over in both houses in 1975.

## Pan Am Subsidy **Poor Solution**

Pan American World Airways, the "flag carrier" of the United States on many international air routes, is appealing for federal subsidies to avoid financial collapse. We sympathize with Pan Am and its employes and stockholders, but we think it would be a bad idea for the American taxpayer to bail out this famous airline, even if it would be a blow to our national pride to see it go under.

If there is any argument to be made at all for federal funds to be used for rescuing Pan Am, it is that the airline owes many of its problems to shortsighted policies of our own government. Rather than start writing checks to cover these mistakes, the government should try to create conditions that make it easier for our international air carriers to

Our government can do nothing about the fact that most of the 57 foreign airlines that compete directly or indirectly with U.S. airlines on international routes are subsidized by their governments. However, there is no excuse for the United States to be making the competitive advantage of


Why, for instance, should Australia's Qantas Airlines pay a \$271 fee to land one of its 747 jumbo jets at San Francisco when Pan Am must pay a \$4,200 fee to land at Sydney, Australia? Why is our government-sponsored Export-Import Bank loaning money to foreign airlines at special low interest rates so they can purchase aircraft in the United States, when they are going to use those planes to compete with U.S. airlines that must pay prevailing high commercial interest rates to buy the same kind of planes? Why is the U.S. Postal Service paying foreign carriers more to carry mail than it pays to our own airlines?

Some of these inequities can only be ironed out at the international level. The United States has followed an "open skies" policy giving foreign airlines virtually unlimited access to the U.S. travel market. Some foreign countries openly discourage their citizens from flying on U.S. airlines in order to create patronage for their own national carriers. There should be the same reciprocity in the sphere of air travel that we pursue in our free trade policies.

Pan Am is not the only U.S. airline caught in a squeeze between skyrocketing operating costs and fare and route structures that are often slow to reflect changes in competitive conditions in the travel market. Trans World Airlines for one, is suffering the same disadvantages as Pan Am in international service but can cushion its losses with its domestic routes and subsidiary operations. If the survival of Pan Am is important to the national interest, domestic carriers might consider yielding on their opposition to granting Pan Am some domestic routes, too.

Congress will no doubt be told that Pan Am's appeal for subsidies is a "last resort." It can hardly be viewed as that when changes are possible in our national and international air policy that could put Pan Am and other U.S. carriers on a far more equitable basis of competition in the world travel

## Lindbergh And World Were Lovers

It might be said of Charles Lindbergh, as Robert Frost wrote of himself, that he "had a lover's quarrel with the world." Reaching the heights of fame at 25, he stayed there for nearly half a century; but never once did he compromise, let alone surrender, either his privacy

Lindbergh's first and most spectacular achievement - his nonstop solo flight from New York to Paris in 1927 - evoked powerful responses from the public consciousness of the day. The Age of Flight was still in its infancy, but Lindbergh's feat made its promise plain: through technology, mankind would largely conquer time, space and even nature herself.
