How rapidly the world is moving these days is indicated by the reports coming from Europe during the past 24 hours, reports, which if they had been received six months ago would have been accompanied by the wildest

For Hitler is today completing the conquest of Czechoslovakia. It was only six months ago that the Nazi drive to sever the Sudetenland from the little neigh-boring republic almost started a world war, and avoided one only when at the Peace of Munich Hitler agreed to respect the new boundaries of Czechoslovakia.

Since then German propaganda agents have kepf up an inceasant agitation among the Slovaks and the Czechs to destroy all central authority, split the little country into warring groups and factions, and to create a condition of as complete chaos as possible. This drive has finally been as successful as the earlier one to stir up the Sudeten Germans had been. So, now on the pretext of restoring law and order,

Hitler masses his troop to the saint prepared to take over the entire country. So accustomed has the world become to this idea anyway, that not a single major nation makes a move to lodge a protest. The seizure of the entire free nation of Czechoslovakia is not likely to cause as much comment today as the theft of the Sudetenland six months ago.

Events move swiftly in modern Europe. Where will the next blow fall?
