bers of a family that perished in the 1870s was located on property formed by Carlson's grandfather Albert Sydney Hawkins in Lake Monroe Lamily members are beheyed by Carlson to be German transplants brought to the country by Gen Henry Melton Sandord The graves were still distinguishable, surrounded by a rusty wire fence, when construction began on the interstate in 1960. concerns over the encephalitis alert. Fright Nights was scheduled for October 24, 25, 30 and 31. It would have been its third year. During the stay, visitors go through the haunted walkways" confronting glant spiders. snakes and even the Loch Ness monster. The trail ends at the Grim Reaper standing in the

Graveyard of Extinction. Then it is off to the Reality Barn, where visitors learn about the myths and legends of the more mysterious creatures of the Earth. According to Andrea Farmer, 200 marketing director, Fright Nights is fun but also educational.

Taking the place of Fright Nights for this year only is floo at the Zoo on October 25. During Boo, visitors encounter the hundreds of natives and exotic animals that call the zoo home. There will be various demonstrations and programs throughout the day. Admission to Boo is 87 for adults, \$3 for children 3-12 years, 84 for sentors 60 years and older, and

free for children 2 and under. Zoo members are admitted free.

Recently, an encephalitis alert had been issued by the state health department for 27 counties including Seminole. Human cases, continued sentinel chicken conversions and rainfall amounts prompted the health department's decision. Farmer said, unlike other organtzations, the zoo cannot apray because of the chemicals being dangerous to other forms of insects such as butterfiles.

Fright Nights began in 1995 bringing in an estimated 1.500 people to 2,300 in 1996. See Zoo, Page 5A



Garofalo stars as an assistant to a floundering Massachusetts senator. The senator asks her to go to the Emerald Isle to find his family roots as an opportunity to further his campaign. Little does she know. but she lands right in the middle of a matchmaking festival in the small village of Ballmagra. The local cupid (Milo O'Shea) sees her as a special project, she is there on business and not to get hooked up

The Matchmaker is a screwball romance about love striking when one least expects it. But this is the most unaffecting romantic comedy in some time. The ending is evident within the first 45 minutes of the film and the mechanics of the romance between Garofalo and an Irish lad (David O'Hara) does not effectively arouse any feeling or emotion.

Garofalo delivers the film from total blandness. She just lits into the role perfectly. You can say Garofalo and her part are a match.

Bread choices include the classic sourdough, used also in the freshly baked pizzas. wheat, dark rye, and jalap-eno cheese buns. The warm sandwiches come in two sizes, small or, for an additional dollar, regular.

The Original regular (\$3.99) was tasty in its toasted bed of sourdough. The thinly sliced deli meat assortment of ham, Genoa salami, and cotto salami was served with mozzarella, and parmesan cheddar Accompaniments, cheese. unless otherwise specified, include mustard, lettuce, onion, tomato and black ofives. For the extra hungry,

the Muffuletta (\$6.99) is served in a giant 8 inch bun. Other featured regularsized sandwiches include ham and cheese (84.25) and turkey (84.89). Light sandwich choices are smoked turkey breast (83.99). chicken breast (\$4.69), Dijon chicken breast (84.79), and the vegetarian (83.99). Delt style sandwiches include turkey and bacon club (84.89), roast beel and cheese (84.89), and pastrami and Swiss (84.89).

From the pizza menu, the 8-mch bacon tomato and mushroom pizza (\$4.09) was a stand out. Other specialty ptzzas, all made to order, mi clude the Mediterranean (83.99), a combination of feta cheese, black olives, tomato, onton and basil pesto, smoked turkey and Jalapeno (\$4,09) chicken and pesto (84.09), and barbeeue chicken (\$4.09) More canventional choices like cheese and tomato are also available as is a vegetarian pizza.

On the light side, soups are made daily in the store (81.99 for 'a bowl). Salad choices include some creative combinations like Chinese chicken salad (83.99). featuring romaine lettuce, chicken breast. sesame seeds, chow inten noodles, green onton and mandarin oranges served with a spicy That peanut dressing. 

AAA believes that driver educatton, offered as one element of a graduated licensing system, is an essential component. of an overall safe driving program. Much of what a novice drivers learn about safe operation comes from helitud-thewheel experience, not just the classroom. Any program that seeks to improve novice driver safety must provide the opportunity for novice drivers to gain experience in the safest possible on the road environment

Florida AAA members overwhelmingly support mandatory driver education. In a 1996/97 public affairs survey, 90 percent of respondents support mandatory driver education for new drivers who are learning to drive.

"Clearly, steps need to be taken to examine Florida's driver education program and to find ways to improve it." Bakewell said. But until changes can be made, it's important to find alternatives to ensure that there young drivers are getting enough of the suprivised experience they need behind the heel it's important for parents to get involved inthe teaching process.

Bakewell cited AAA's Teaching Your Teens To Drive program as a valuable resource for parents who are looking for a structured program in which to teach teens important driving skills. The program includes a handbook and video or computer CD-ROM to help guide parents in their efforts to teach teens to drive But with or without a program like Teaching Your Teens To Dive parents can make a big difference in their teens driving habits just by setting a good driving example and offering teens ample supervised practice time: Bakewell said

Campaign to combat teen driving deaths with activities by AAA clubs in all 50 states.

"In 1996, an average of 17 teens died every day in traffic crashes across the United Bakewell "Fatalities could soar to 7,500 per year by 2012 -- more than 20 per day - as the number of young drivers increases by 25 percent in the next 15 years."

Bakewell said that most crashes involving young drivers are caused by inexperience, poor driving skills, risk-taking or poor decision making

"Mistakes are part of any learning process." Bakewell said. "The issue is how to minimize the likelihood that crashes will occur while young people are learning to drive and how to protect them from injury '

AAA will work this next year on both the state and national level in accomplishing three action steps during its "Licensed to Learn" campaign

Raise awareness of the importance of novice driver safety and incorporated the Issue Into the national public health agenda

Mandate more behind-thewheel driving experience, provide guidelines for selecting driver education courses and increase parent involvement in teen driver training.

Implement a graduated hcensing system for novice drivers and climinate delictencies in the licensing process that allow new drivers to become fully beensed without assuring they are ready to drive

There are also daily discussions with owners and attorneys representing the eight existing. lawfully operated adult entertainment enter-

prises in the county, The eight are. House of Babes, Circus Cir cus, Cabaret Internationale. Rachel's Restaurant & Lounge, Club Juana Cocktail Lounge. Erotte Emportum, Excitement Video, Inc. and Bob's Video Novelties and Magazines. The first five are cabaret type establishments.

Kevin Fall, from the Comprehensive Planning Division and the county's planning consultant, has been working with the various AAEs relative to design standards and infrastructure improvements that may allow these husinesses to stay at the current sites.

The premise of the talks with the licensed AAEs is to explore the possibility of grandfathering rather than force them to move by late.

Pastor speaks on importance of evangelism

Somehow, we must address the discomforting reality that most of our churches are ineffective in evangelizing the people outside their doors This is true even in some growing churches in which the growth consists mostly of folks coming from other churches. And this ineffectiveness is tied to the fact that most of us tend to be incoherent and even speechless when confronted with human unbe-

I'm not sure whether nonevangelizing people produce non-evangelizing churches or non-evangelizing churches non-evangelizing people. Either way, it is urgent that we break out of this crippling cycle. But as long as we are content to worship and fellowship, and support some mission projects in other communities at home and abroad we breed ingrown ineffectiveness

What is really at stake is the extent to which Jesus is central to our living and being Too often, we try to avoid this issue by developing programs which, in reality, transfer the responsibility to someone else Programs of mass evangelism and of visitation evangelism are too often substitutes for the kind of evangelisin indigenous to the NT. Instead of witnessing to our own faith in Christ, we count on the professional evangelist or

the person evangelizing while we continue in our own incoberence regarding the faith All churches are at an all time low attendance since 1940, all North American churches

In convinced that we can break the impasse, not by training a few isolated folks to be evangelists, but by recovering the New Testaments view of witnessing, Instead of looking for quick fixes in programs of evangeltsm, we really need to engage in the long. and perhaps painful, process of becoming different Christians and distinct churches

This process will require a recovery of biblical preaching in our pulpits. This preaching must go beyond moralizing and bringing comfort to the already comfortable. It must declare the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus for the forgiveness of sins as central and normative.

This process will further require calling people to discipleship to Christ rather than to become patrons of the church. Only when people become participants rather then spectators is there any hope for the future of our evangelizing churches. We must not be participants in programs. but in the life in Christ.

Every time we regard evangelism as a program, we resort to programs, outlines, and arguments. But if we see it as a flow of life from, one

person to another our focus will be upon matering in

Evangelism was neither program nor a problem in the New Testament, was it? Nerther Andrew nor Philip had any hesitancy or methodology histead, theirs was a contagious and triesistible overflow of faith, life, and joy in the Savior Immersed and caught up in the Spirit of Christ, their words and actions represented a continuing invitation for others to come and see Je-

Witnessing and evangelism. then, must become more than programs or words designed to bring people to faith in Christ Genuine witness will flow through our conversations and our actions in relationships as we take people sertously as belonging to God with us. Witness may flow as well through our silence when we are genuinely trying to understand the needs, lears, and aspirations of our acquaintances. Religious language is often excess baggage that erects barriers between us

and other persons.

The late D T Niles described evangelism and witness as "I beggar telling auother beggar where he found bread." To us for whom Christ has become the Bread of Life. sharing the good news with our fellow beggars will bring as much loy as when we found It for ourselves. Just ask An-



Confidence continues to rise, may indicate good holiday sales

Consumer Confidence
As the national economy As the national economy continues growing at a healthy pace, consumer confidence among Floridians gained a point in September to 101, up from a revised figure of 100 in August. This gain was led by a rise in respondents' perceptions of their personal financial situation now and over the next year. Perceptions of curnext year. Perceptions of cur-rent finances rose four points to 93 in September, and per-ceptions of future finances rose

ceptions of nature infances rose two points to 106.

Once again Florida confidence levels are high, mirroring what we are seeing at the national level as measured by the University of Michigan and

the Conference Board. This op-timism has fueled a rebound in retail sales. Forecasts based on July and August data aug-gest that third quarter retail sales will be much higher than the second quarter. This is the type of spending you would normally expect when con-sumer confidence is high," said Chris McCarty, the Burvey Di-rector. rector.

"Retailers planning for Christmas should note that Floridians' confidence is now 9 points higher than the 92 reg-istered in September 1996," said UF economist Dave Denslow. "If confidence holds at 100 or more, holiday sales should exceed last year by 4 or 5 percent." Sales of existing homes are

up and are expected to exceed last year's sales as consumers take advantage of what continues to be very low interest rates. New home sales also appear strong compared to last year. Outstanding consumer credit, while still growing, appears to be alowing significantly. cantly.

cantly.

Plorida's Regions

The consumer confidence index can be calculated for regions, although the margin of error is much higher due to amailer sample elses. This month there appears to be significant differences regionally. Both the North and Southwest registered no change while respondents' confidence levels in Central Florida dropped 2 points to 105 for the overall

index. Southeast Piorida gained five points to rise from 95 to August to 100 in September. The rise in Southeast Plorida is due primarily to increases in perceptions of personal finances and a dramatic increase in the perception whether it is a good time to buy big-ticket items. The latter component rose from 106 in August to 118 in September, an increase of 10 points.

"When we calculate consumer confidence regionally we often see the trend in Southeast Florida running differently than the other regions of the state. On the other hand, this region also has the highest

region also has the highest margin of error because you tend to get more varying re-sponses there then elsewhere. This is caused by the diversity of Southeast Florida in terms of income and other accideconomic factors," said

Business Conditions
Those respondents who are
employed report business activity in Florida to be about the
same in September as in
August, in August, 47 percent
of the respondents described
business activity at their place
of work to be higher than a
year ago. In September the
percentage rose to 48 percent,
However, the percentage expecting extra employees to be
hired over the next six months
fell for the second time in as
many months. In July, 37 percent of those responding in
August and is down to 31 per-

cent in September. This aug-gests that in Florida we may be approaching full employment.

"Over the past couple of years employment opportunities were widespread due to the healthy economy. At some point we would expect this trend to level out. Our respondents may be telling us that we should expect fewer jobs to be available over the next year, compared to last year," said McCarty.

The Florida Consumer Atti-tude Survey is conducted monthly by the Survey Program of the Bureau of Economic and Business Research at the Uni-versity of Florida.


Ironically, the Silver Hawks knocked off DeLand in the first round last season.

And it can pinpoint a single bacterium in just a thirtieth of an ounce of meat. But don't take that as a sign that it's safe to eat your burgers or meatloaf rare or be less vigilant about washing your hands and keeping kitchen equipment

This is a major technological leap", says David Acheson, MD, a Tufts researcher who studies bacteria in food. He

new test is not fall-safe. A beef processing plant that chooses to use it as part of its upgraded inspection system might find some part of a batch of meat bacteria-free, while just a couple of inches away harmful bacteria could be thriving. "You could hop all over the sample" and find different results with each piece of meat you test, he

That's why Dr. Acheson advises people to "assume that ground beef that comes into your house has potentially harmful bugs in it. I wouldn't want people to freak out and think it's unsafe to eat properly handled beef that has been thoroughly cooked, he says, but improved testing shouldn't provide a false sense of secu-

Director of the U. S. Depart-

ment of Agriculture's Meat Animal Research Center. Danny Laster, Ph.D. agrees.

The meat industry has been doing a credible job of working to reduce the harmful bacteria in meat. But no test is going to eradicate all foodborne pathogens. All you can do is mitigate the problem."

In other words, it's safest not to eat the burger until the juices run yellow with no trace of pink left. (The color of the meat is not a reliable indicator--press the burger with a spatula if you need to squeeze out some juice.) Also, don't slice tomato or onion on the counter or cutting board you used to shape or defrost the patties until you wash the surface with hot, soapy water. Finally, don't put booked burgers on plates you used to hold the meat while it was raw.







Symptoms alone cannot confirm stroke

DEAR DR. GOTT: My brother suffers from poor balance and slurred speech, Ilia doctors have failed to find a reason for these symptoms. I'm afraid he may have had a stroke. What is your opinion?

DEAR HEADER: You may be correct. However, from the limited information you supply, I cannot diagnose a stroke. At the very least, your brother needs a CT or MRI scan of the head. These tests will show if he has had a stroke. If his doctors have ordered them and they are normal, consideration must be given to inner ear problems or possibly a neurological disorder such as multiple scierosis. In this instance, your brother should be examined by a neurologist to determine the cause of the symp-

To give you more information on one possible cause of his symptoms, I am sending you a copy of my Health Report "Multiple Scierosis." Other readers who would like a copy should send \$2 plus a long, self-addressed, stamped envelope to P.O. Box 2017. Murray Hill Station, New York, NY 10155. Be sure to mention the title.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Two years ago, because of arthritis and a facial nerve palsy, I was diagnosed with Rocky Mountain spotted fover, I received antibiotics and improved. However, about two months ago, I developed similar symptoms of joint stiffness and pain. I think that I have Lyme disease, yet my blood test again shows RMSF. Should I be treated for Lyme

DEAR READER: Not necessarily. Tick bites can result in Lyme disease. Rocky Mountain spotted fever and other infections. Fortunately, the ireatment for one condition usually eradicates the others. You may have contracted RMSF again - or, as you suggest, another tick-borne infection may be to blame. In any case, a month-long course of doxycycline should take care of both. Share your concerns with your doctor and follow his advice as to which antibiotic therapy would be right for you

DEAR DR. GOTT: I believe that homosexuality starts when a baby gets home from the hospital and the mother begins massaging his anus Because the baby will strike out at the person doing this, the infant will get beaten up by that person. Then the haby will make friends with a blankel, toy and doll, and try to hide under a table or in a closet to avoid the abuse The baby is scared and helpless and becomes homosexual




