# Missionaries kidnapped

## Muslim extremists snatch 20 people in the Philippines

Authorities in the Philippines continue attempts at resolving a massive kidnapping by the Muslim extremist group Abu Sayyaf. Among the hostages are two mis-

sionaries from New Tribes Mission in Sanford.

In all, 20 persons were abducted, including Martin and Gracia Burnham of Wichita, Kan.. The Burnhams have been members of the Sanford-based New Tribes Mission since 1986.

According to reports, masked gunmen, dressed in military uniforms, raided the resort Sunday, ransacked the cottage units and took guests as hostage. Reportedly no shots were fired and no one was seriously injured.

According to a Scott Ross in Sanford,

Martin and Gracia had arrived at the Dos Palmas resort only the night before to celebrate their wedding anniversary. The resort is on an island off the east coast of Palawan. Martin, 41, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Burnham, also members of New Tribes Mission. Gracia, 42, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Norvin Jones of Kansas.

Ross said authorities are still attempting to learn where the hostages are being kept.

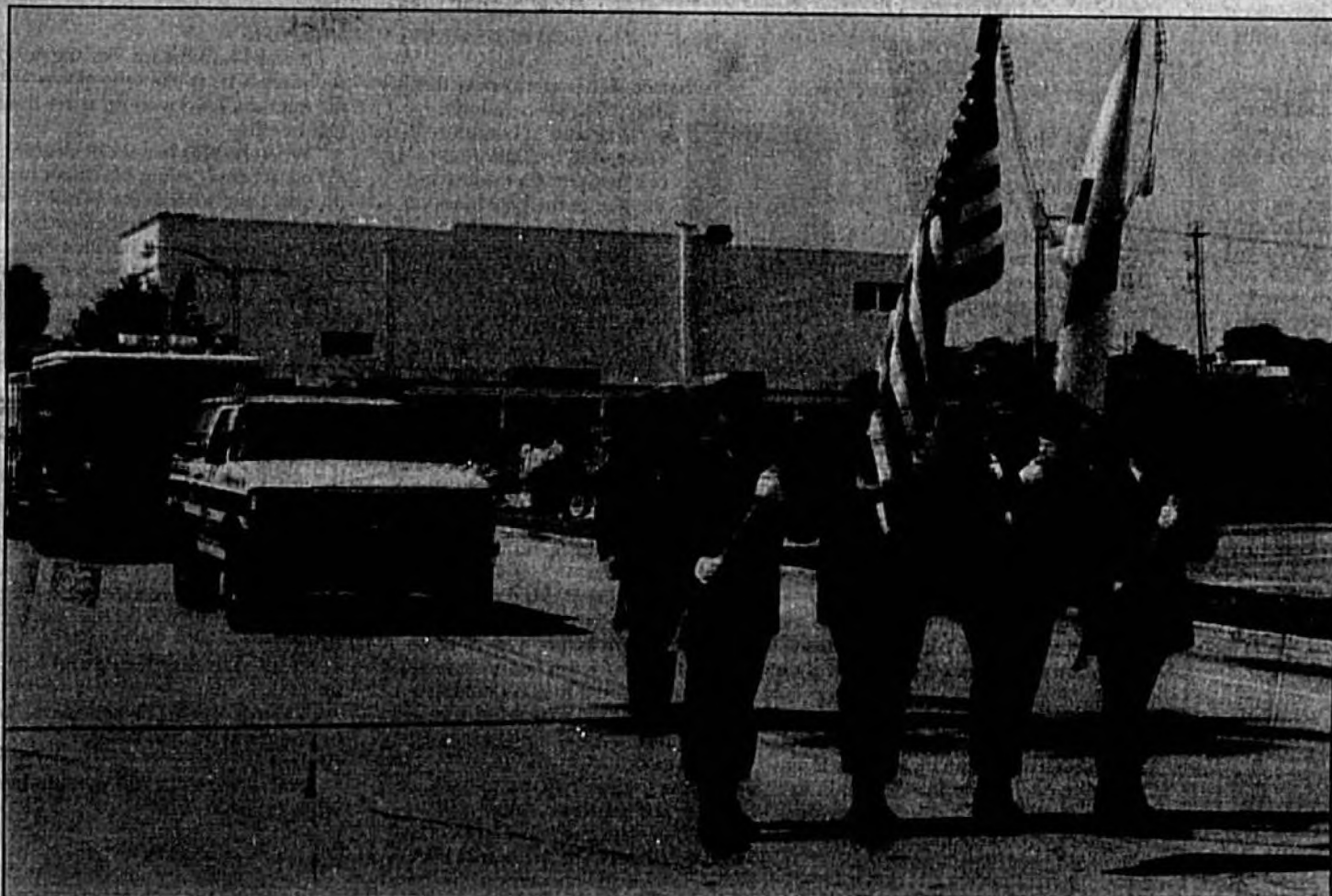

# Murder suspect nabbed in Ocala

SANFORD — Saturday at approximately 4 p.m., off-duty Ocala Police Department Sgt. Wade Jones noticed a transient fitting the description of a Seminole County murder suspect on his way home from grocery shopping.

After driving back for a better look, Jones called for back-up and kept the subject in sight while he panned with the use of a cardboard sign. OPD arrested 46-year-old Jerry Lee Fuller and booked him into the Marion County Jail.

Photos of Fuller were circulated by Seminole County Sheriff's Department Investigator Dan Prast to OPD last week after investigators learned Fuller may have been enroute to the area.

Fuller, also known as Gary Lee Miller, was wanted for questioning in the death of 42-year-old David Dykeman.

Dykeman's body was located May 19 in a shallow grave west of Sanford in a wooded area homeless people use for a camp.

When OPD made contact with the subject he gave the name "Steven Roberts."

However, officers were certain this was the wanted murder suspect because of the matching description from the information sheet. Miller was then shown a picture of himself from a wanted bulletin, and at that time Fuller admitted his true

SCSD Public Information Officer Steve Olson referred to Davis as one of the true local heroes in the community. Marva Pierce, site manager for the apartments, also attributed much of the apartments past success to Davis.

"She's a big help because before (Pro Force Management took over) the housing authority

had a security guard, but this area did not have one," Pierce said on why Rose's crime prevention programs were so valuable to the area. "She's a tremendous help. She has already paved the way for many community activities. We've really been working toward changing the image of Seminole Gardens."

The number one draw at the community event — besides the soft drinks, hot dogs and hamburgers — was the efforts of the auto theft investigators and their various programs designed to curb vehicle theft in Seminole County.

The cities of Sanford and

Altamonte Springs are involved in the City/County Auto Theft Task Force, as are the unincorporated areas of Seminole County. According to coordinator Anthony Berrios, 80 percent of the auto thefts occur in the three participating areas. The task force concentrates on three areas; enforcement, prevention and prosecution.

Prevention was the name of the game Thursday afternoon as investigators provided motorists with vehicle etching and stickers, which help the owner have the vehicle identification num-

# Lake Mary tennis complex expected to be a smash hit

LAKE MARY — The courts are down, the fencing is up and a tennis manager/pro has been hired. There's only a few decisions left to be made concerning the city's new tennis complex, including who gets to hit the first ball during Friday's grand-opening reception.

The reception, scheduled to begin at 9 a.m., offers city officials an opportunity to show off the long awaited facility. It's the culmination of more than two years of discussing, planning and constructing a state-of-the-art tennis complex within Lake Mary's city limits.

"We've got great courts," Parks and Recreation Director Bill Carrico said. "What we've got is everything I wanted it to be. It's a facility people are going to use, use and use."

According to Carrico, only a few routine inspections are needed before the courts are ready for play. The hydrosys-

tem, which maintains the water maintenance for the courts, is up and running, and workers are finishing the last minute details on the clubhouse and sun shelters.

"Right now, you can play on the tennis courts, literally," Carrico said. "Everything should be ready by Friday."

Construction on the courts began earlier this year following City Commission's approval of contract bids. Phase II of the Lake Mary Sports Complex, located on Rantoul Lane, includes seven soft tennis courts, sun shelters, and a club house with men's and women's locker rooms. The facility's construction cost was about \$700,000.

In April, Commission approved Carrico's recommendation to hire Jason Bradstreet of Bradstreet Tennis for the facility's tennis manager/pro. Earlier this month, contract negotiations were finalized, and

## The cost of crime

What do most men carry in their wallets? Money, of course (unless they're broke). But there are credit cards, membership cards, a social security card, medical and auto insurance cards, drivers license, often vehicle registrations, check-cashing cards, cards for medical appointments, voter registration card, and a myriad of other documents which are of importance to the owner. Where else could you keep these documents but in a wallet.

The same holds true for women's purses, which often contain a wallet with all of these items, plus a checkbook and other personal items.

What happens if your wallet or purse is stolen? Sure, you lose the money. But you are also in for some additional financial losses. Each of these items will need to be replaced, and for most of them, there is a fee involved such as canceling a credit card, reapplying for a drivers license or vehicle registration. And it also takes time. Letters have to be written, phone calls made and people to be contacted to get many of these items replaced. If there were checks involved, it costs to have your checks canceled — if you even know the numbers on the checks.

Criminals who steal wallets and purses seldom have compassion for their victims. Very seldom, when a wallet is stolen, are the contents recovered.

On May 16, a Sanford man reported his wallet was stolen from his home. He said it was the second time, but the first time, he found it outside on the ground later. Now, it's completely gone, with all of the documents as well.

Imagine what he will have to go through now. Letters, phone calls, applications — he can't even drive his car to do any of this because he has no license or registration. Some crook made his life miserable, in addition to taking his money.

I had my wallet stolen many years ago, but found it, without the money of course, in the driveway of my Sanford home. I had already started applying for replacement cards however, so I know a little of what he is going through now.

We can't appeal to those who may steal a wallet or purse to kindly return those personal items after they take the money. Persons with criminal intentions do not have compassion for their victims.

We can't suggest any way to prevent your wallet or purse from being stolen from your residence other than to be sure doors and windows are kept locked. We can't suggest how to avoid pick-pockets. Some men's pants have buttons over the wallet pocket but these are few with today's fashions.

In our crime reports, we often see someone accused of theft of property over \$200. Less than that is a lesser crime and carries a lesser punishment. So, let's say someone steals your wallet in which you have \$150. The judge will charge the lesser crime, petty theft, even though the victim may end up spending \$500 in time and effort to replace other stolen items.

It is apparent — stealing the contents of a wallet or purse is not only the taking of money, but it's ripping apart a portion of the victim's personal life. This, to me, is abuse and violence, just as much as if a person is beaten.

## Blackballed

### Republicans chose to keep Jeffords out

Be aware of the curse of getting what you wish for. Look at the Republicans in this excited town.

The Republicans who came to the White House four months ago with President Bush, and returning members of Congress who cheered him through the gates, wanted two things above all:

1. To cut the size and role of government;
2. To drive the liberal "squishes" out of their party.

It seems they've gotten their wishes. The Bush tax cuts, whether the total amount adds up to \$1.6 trillion or \$1.35 trillion, are about to be voted into law. The Republicans smartly used talk of recession to cut government off at the knees. The reductions over 10 years were designed to outlive their control of the White House and both houses of Congress.

The real goal of the tax-cutting is not to stimulate the economy, which would be nice, but to scale back the size and power of government by cutting off the oxygen of tax revenues. The tax cut was an ideological goal. The effect will be to reduce nondefense government spending to its lowest level since World War II.

Driving out the liberals was personal. The leaders of this wave of Republican conservatism are zealots. They simply could not stand seeing, hearing or being in the room with colleagues they considered traitors inside the party. It was only a month ago that I found myself writing happily about this odd resurgence of liberal Republicans. The "squishes," conservatives called them, or "the weak sisters" or "the RINOS" — Republicans in Name Only.

The resurgence was odd not because there were hordes of lefties masquerading as Republicans. It happened because the Republicans who came to power this year had moved so far right that moderates like the suddenly famous Sen. James Jeffords looked like Marxists to the Bushmen in the White House, Trent Lott in the Senate, and Tom DeLay and Dick Army in the House.

Now Jeffords has switched sides, almost, with a manner that echoes Josiah Bartlett in "The West Wing" television series. He will list himself as an independent rather than a Democrat, but will side with the Democrats in organizing the Senate — and demoting Lott from majority leader to minority leader. But even with the party paying a high price for purity, many Republicans are more than willing to pay it — cutting off their own noses for spite — to avoid having lunch with people they despise.

One down, a dozen to go. The other names on the conservative hit list now include: Sen. Lincoln Chafee of Rhode Island, Sens. Olympia Snowe and Susan Collins of Maine, Sen. George V. Voinovich of Ohio; and Rep. Jim Leach of Iowa, Rep. Mike Castle of Delaware, Rep. Amory Houghton of New York, Rep. Jim Greenwood of Pennsylvania, Rep. Nancy Johnson of Connecticut and Rep. Fred Upton of Michigan. The list may include Rep. Christopher Shays of Connecticut and even Sen. John McCain of Arizona.

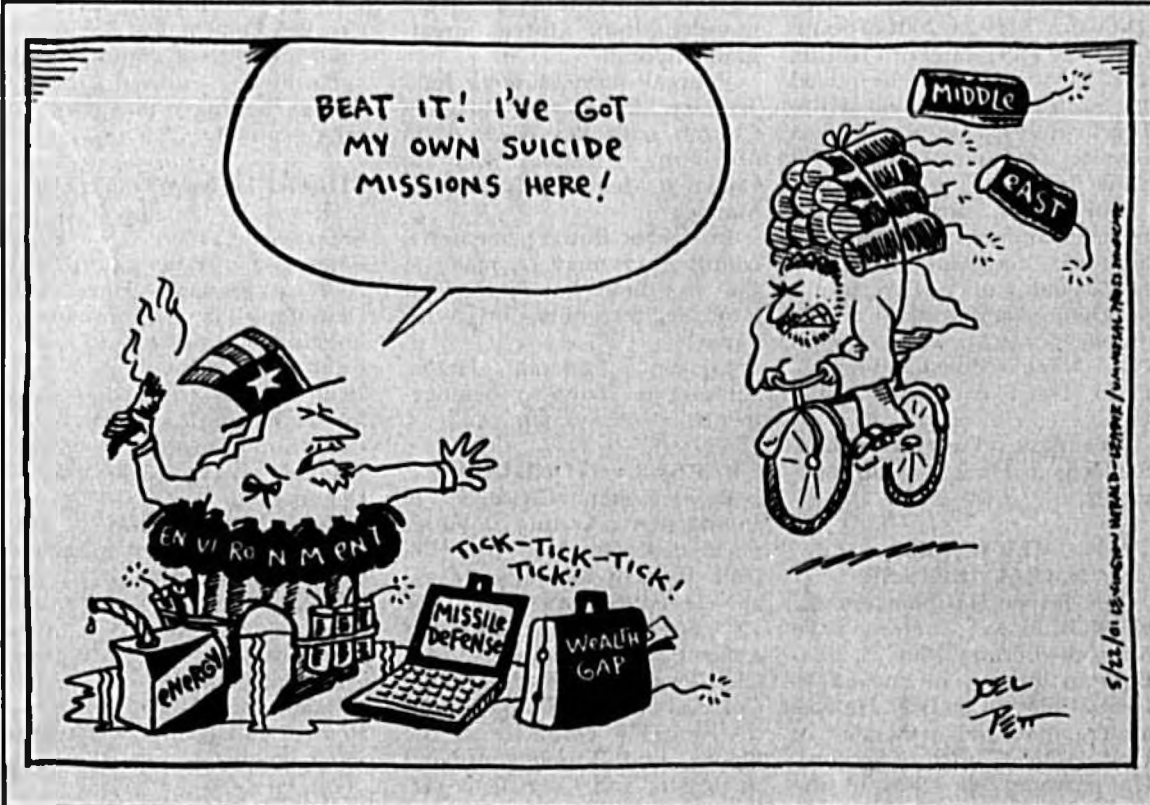
They have been characterized this way by Pete DuPont, who has moved from being a conservative presidential candidate to conservative radio commentator:

"Most are pro-racial preference and pro-minimum wage increases. And on two core issues of individual liberty, school choice and the free-speech limitations of campaign spending 'reform,' they're hopeless. They're big government people..."

The Jeffords defection will not only change the way the Senate operates — for the moment, at least, we have divided government again — it also could and should mark the end of the president's "mandate." Bush has for these four months managed to get away with pretending the nation is solidly behind him, even if the majority of the nation's voters cast their ballots for the other guy.

Sen. Snowe responded to last Thursday's events by saying it shows that the party has to pay attention to its own small minority of moderates or liberals. But McCain's reaction seemed more telling to me: "Tolerance of dissent is the hallmark of a mature party, and it is well past the time for the Republican Party to grow up."

That is certainly true, but it may miss the point. The Republicans don't want to grow up, and the bunch in power now are not really a party, mature or otherwise. The Republicans are a club, and they reserve the right to refuse admittance.

## Finally 'Gone With The Wind' get a parody it deserves

Lawdy, Miz Scah-lett, I done learnt to read and read me a book. I don care if you is mad. You cain't take it from me 'cause it ain't yo' book.

On Friday, the Atlanta-based 11th Circuit Court of Appeals lifted a shortsighted injunction by a lower

court that had prevented writer Alice Randall from publishing her novel, "The Wind Done Gone," a parody of Margaret Mitchell's shallow but legendary "Gone With the Wind." Randall says she wrote the book so that

Americans, black and white, can have a "belly laugh" over slavery and its consequences.

Though clever in places, Randall's book is not that funny. Some reviewers say it does not meet the literary definition of parody, either. (That's probably OK, since "Gone With the Wind" does not meet the definition of literature.) But whatever else may be said about literary merit and intellectual property rights, the poisonous mythology of "Gone With the Wind" richly deserves parody.

I don't have to tell you what Mitchell's "Gone With

the Wind" is about because you already know, even if you've never read the novel or seen the movie. The book has been translated into 27 languages in 37 countries. Say the name Scarlett O'Hara, and Japanese schoolchildren

and Indian college professors know who you mean.

(The worldwide recognition of Mitchell's novel, by the way, is all the more reason to believe that Randall has every right to borrow its characters

for her parody. Surely, characters so much a part of American culture belong to the public domain 65 years after publication.)

The broad acceptance of Mitchell's novel has lent her story the aura of actual social history. That means millions of readers take as realistic her superficial portrayals of steely Southern belles, dashing suitors/husbands and, most of all, stupid but devoted slaves. Never mind that slave narratives prove the lie to dumb Prissy, who starts bawling when she fears Union troops are nearing the plantation, or to other

slaves invariably drawn as fiercely loyal.

What? Is I'm goin'? You damn right, I'm goin'. Mr. Lincoln, he don freed de slaves, and if you think I'm gon stay heah and wash 'yo clothes and empty yo' pee-pot, you crazler than I think you is.

It is fascinating to watch the Mitchell Trust, which holds the copyright to "Gone With the Wind," fight like Gen. Robert E. Lee himself to protect Scarlett and Rhett from ridicule and prevent Prissy from taking on any semblance of self-respect. What could possibly be going on here? Since Mitchell died childless in 1949, and her closest surviving relatives, two childless nephews, are both elderly, it is unlikely that the Mitchell Trust is out merely to preserve profits.

No, this fight is over something far more precious to defenders of the Confederacy: preserving the Old South mythology that Mitchell creates in her novel. This mythology, so distant from actual history, cannot countenance the tortured South that William Faulkner so artfully and accurately portrays in his

works. And it cannot tolerate Randall's parody, with its bitter, scheming slaves, homosexual planters and, most of all, miscegenation between masters and slaves.

In Mitchell's "Gone With the Wind," sexual relations between planters and their slave-mistresses do not exist. And the Mitchell Trust means to keep it that way.

In the late 1990s, writer Pat Conroy backed out of negotiations with Mitchell trustees over a sequel when they demanded there be no mention of homosexuality or miscegenation.

How you think Big Mama's gal got them green eyes just like you, Miz Scah-lett? You think her mama just painted 'em like that? You think it just one o' dem funny thangs her eyes look like yo' daddy's and yourn?

Randall, who is African-American, may not have written anything brilliant, but she has certainly struck an icon in its soft underbelly. It's about time. May there be many more to come.

## Central Florida spiders: Friends or venomous foes?

Contrary to popular belief, all spiders are beneficial because they are good predators of insects and other small bugs.

Almost all spiders possess venom, but only a few are considered dangerous to humans.

Some spiders trap their victims with a web, while others rely on their hunting ability to obtain their food.

Most people associate spiders with poisonous creatures, but in reality only two spiders can cause a serious injury to humans in Florida, the widow spiders and the brown recluse spider.

The widow spiders are fairly common but the brown recluse is not considered to be an established species in Florida.

There are four species of widow spiders in Florida, the southern black widow, northern black widow, red widow and brown widow. The widow spiders are found mainly outdoors in protected cavities and around trees. They can be found in orange groves, which makes it necessary to use protective clothing when harvesting.

When widows are found around the homes, they are usually inside gas and electric meter boxes, furniture and other protected areas.

**House Spiders**  
Several species of spiders live in or around our houses. Many of them construct webs which make them a nuisance to homeowners.

The southern house spider

is very common in Florida and the males are often mistaken for the brown recluse, but they are really harmless.

### Southern Black Widow

This spider is the most widely distributed widow spider in Florida. The black widow has a black glossy color with a distinct red hourglass marking on the underside of the abdomen.

Their size is about 1 1/2 inches long with legs extended.

Females lay about 250 eggs in an egg sac, which is pear shaped measuring about 1/2 to 5/8 inches in diameter.

The eggs hatch in about 20 days and remain in the egg sac from four to 30 days. Females are known to eat the males after mating. They are found outdoors under rocks, boards, and frequently around old buildings.

### Northern Black Widow

This spider is similar in appearance to the southern black widow, but has two red triangles resembling an hourglass, and a row of red spots on top of the abdomen. This species is found west of Tallahassee, mainly in forests where it produces its webs three to twenty feet above the ground.

### Red Widow

This spider can be recognized by its reddish-orange head, thorax and legs but with a black abdomen. The top of

the abdomen usually has a row of red spots with yellow borders. The markings on the underside of the abdomen are usually one or two small red spots, lacking the characteristic hourglass marking. The spider is found mainly in sand-pine scrub habitats in central and southeast Florida.

### Brown Widow

This spider varies in color from light gray to light brown to black. The abdomen has variable markings of black, white, red and yellow. The underside of the abdomen has an orange or yellow hourglass.

It has been frequently reported in Seminole County, often found south of Daytona Beach along the coast, and is also common in orange groves. It usually makes its web on buildings in well-lighted areas.

### Brown Recluse

This spider can be easily recognized by the distinctive dark violin-shaped mark located on the head and thorax. This spider is light tan to deep reddish brown in color, and measures about 1/4 to 1/2 inches in length. It has three pairs of eyes arranged in a semicircle on the forehead of the head (most spiders have four pair of eyes).

They can be found inside the homes in bathrooms, bedrooms, closets, garages, under furniture, behind baseboards and crevices. The bite produced by this spider can produce fever, chills, nausea, weakness and joint pain. A blister arises at the site of the bite followed by inflammation.

The venom usually kills the affected tissue, leaving a sunken sore.

**Control**  
Sprays containing pyrethrins or pyrethroids are very effective to control spiders.

## Police arrest 22 for DUI during holiday checkpoint

**CASSELBERRY** — About 75 officers from every Seminole County city police department including the Seminole County Sheriff's Department and the Florida Highway Patrol participated in the "high intensity traffic enforcement" Friday night in Casselberry.

As a result of the operation, 268 tickets were issued and 22 drivers were arrested for DUI. Another eight individuals were arrested for various charges including possession of cocaine.

"It went fantastic," exclaimed Casselberry Police Department Sgt. Scott Pleasants. "We couldn't do this operation ourselves and Seminole County couldn't do it themselves — it was a matter of teamwork."

From 10 p.m. to 4 a.m., officers combed the south end of

the county, according to Pleasants even his wife was astonished as she drove down State Road 434 and all she saw was blue and red lights.

"I think it got the point across that we were out if force trying to prove a point," Pleasants said.

The overall point the City/County Traffic Unit was trying to convey was to stop aggressive driving, but the various law enforcement agencies were also trying to curb the amount of vehicle fatalities in a holiday weekend.

According to Pleasants, last holiday, Easter, there was eight fatalities in an eight-hour period in Central Florida, and "that was something we we're trying to avoid this holiday."

"The whole idea is not to allow the people to know when we are going to be out in force so they'll always want to wear their seat belt and not to drive impaired," Pleasants said.

ber (VIN) in many spots on the car rather than one. According to investigator Scott Slavin, posting the VIN on all the windows makes it too costly for a chop shop or thief to bust every window on a car.

Investigators were also signing vehicle owners up for the Combat Auto Theft (CAT) program, which allows an officer to pull over a vehicle during the morning hours from 1 to 5. According to Berrios, the CAT program is perfect for seniors that know they don't drive during those hours.

If an officer stops a car, with the CAT sticker, during those hours, he radios dispatch and then dispatch calls the home. Many times the car has been stolen and the owner does not know, hence the officer has just stopped an auto theft that was unreported.

"We're trying to make it more difficult," Berrios said. "We had a 14 percent decrease in auto theft last year, which is good because we were looking for a double-digit decline. We have been down the last three or four years."

In conjunction with the Safe

Kids of greater Orlando coalition, Tina Sherburne of the Sanford Fire Department was also on hand at the community event to promote bicycle safety.

According to Sherburne, the Sanford Police Department has been enforcing the bicycle helmet law and have been writing citations this spring. However, individuals with bicycle citations can turn their tickets in for a helmet at the Sanford Fire Department at 1303 S. French Avenue.

"It's a one shot deal, but we have had a tremendous response," Sherburne said.

"It is our desire to see a soon and safe release for all of those being held," Ross said.

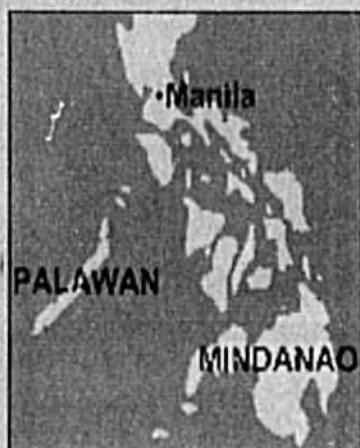
On Tuesday, Philippine President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo imposed a news blackout on the military operations against Abu Sayyaf. The extremist group threatened Tuesday to kill all the hostages if it suspects a rescue attempt.

Philippine military and police authorities are actively involved

in helping to resolve this incident.

Arroyo also said Tuesday she has a no-ransom policy and offered \$2 million in rewards: \$100,000 for each leader and \$20,000 for each member of the group involved in the kidnapping.

The Abu Sayyaf has kidnapped and killed hostages in the past. Just last year, the group killed two teachers after the government declared war on the group. The Abu Sayyaf wants the Philippines government to create a separate Muslim state. The country is overwhelmingly Roman Catholic.

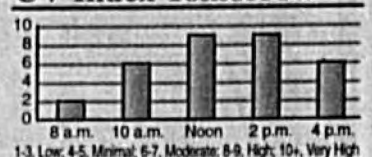

## Everglades, Okeechobee this week's best of lakes

This week we will look at Everglades Water Conservation Area 2 and 3 and Lake Okeechobee on our tour of the Top 10 bass fishing lakes in Florida according to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission.

### EVERGLADES WATER CONSERVATION AREAS 2 AND 3

Everglades Water Conservation Areas are marsh lands bordered by canals. Area 2

has 210 square miles of marsh, and Area 3 contains 730 square miles of marsh. Originally designed for flood control and water supply, the area provides some of the best bass fishing in the country.

The best fishing usually occurs in the spring when dropping water levels concentrate fish in the canals.

April is the peak month with angler catch rates as high as 4.1 bass per hour in the L-67A Canal.

Most anglers fish in the canals. Anglers work edges with plastic worms and minnow imitations. Flipping into the vegetation is also a popular technique. During high water, anglers will often enter the marsh areas where bass can be found in the open slough areas. The L-67A Canal has trails off of it specifically cut to provide boats access to marsh areas.

A no-consumption advisory for bass is in effect in these areas due to high levels of mercury. Because of this, most fish are released, which has resulted in anglers catching many 2- to 5-pound bass and an occasional 9- to 10-pounder.

The L-67A and L-35B are two popular canals in the area for fishing. The L-67A Canal has access at the north end at Holiday Park, off U.S. 27, where camping and boat rentals are available.

### LAKE OKEECHOBEE

Lake Okeechobee is consistently one of Florida's top producing bass lakes.

Situated in south central Florida, the "Big O" covers 730 square miles and is easily accessible from Florida's east and west coasts. The lake is shallow and provides ideal forage and habitat for bass.

If you want to catch big bass, the Big O is the place to go.

Anglers routinely catch 7- to 10-pound bass, and 10- to 12-pound bass occasionally show up too. The lake record is 15 pounds, 5 ounces.

Anglers do well fishing in bulrush near Eagle Bay Island, Little Grassy Island and King's Bar at the north end of the lake. At the south end, anglers are effective fishing in eelgrass in the South Bay area. The largest bass are caught using live golden shiners and casting into, or along edges of, vegetation. Plastic worms and spinner baits are often productive. Casting lures near vegetation often produces the largest numbers of bass.

Lake Okeechobee has a 13- to 18-inch slot limit on bass, meaning all bass between 13 and 18 inches must be released unharmed.

Sixteen boat ramps and numerous fish camps surround the lake. For more information contact the Clewiston Chamber of See Outdoors, Page 2B

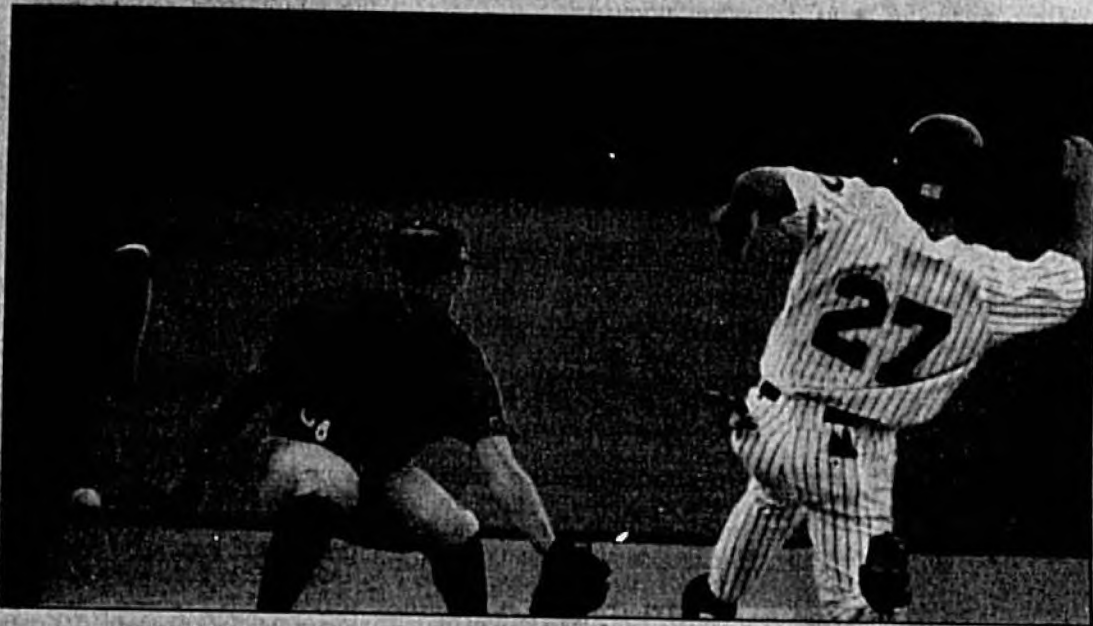

Completing the standings were Winter Springs (6-6), Seminole (5-7), Lyman (3-9) and Lake Howell (0-12).

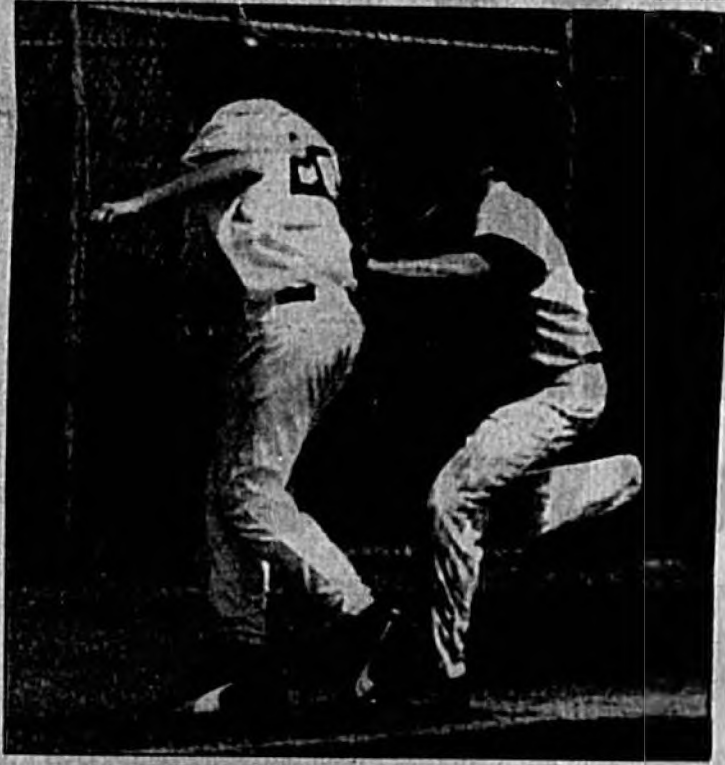

## CHANGES ARE MADE IN DETERMINATIONS OF THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF SEMINOLE COUNTY, FLORIDA, BASE (1% ANNUAL CHANGE) FLOOD ELEVATIONS (BFES) AND ZONE DESIGNATIONS UNDER THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM (NFIP)

On April 17, 1995, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) identified Special Flood Hazard Areas in the Unincorporated Areas of Seminole County, Florida, through issuance of a Flood Insurance Rate map (FIRM).

The Associate Director for Mitigation has determined that modification of the elevations and zone designations of the flood having a one-percent chance of occurrence in any given year (base flood) for certain locations in the unincorporated areas of Seminole County, is appropriate. The modified BFES and zone designations amend the FEMA FIRM for the community.

This modification to the effective FIRM reflects more up-to-date and detailed topographic information and more detailed hydrologic and hydraulic analysis along three unnamed lakes, hereinafter referred to as Lake 10, 11, and 12. As a result of the modifications, there is widening and narrowing of the 1% annual chance (100-year) floodplain for Lakes 10 and 11; narrowing of the 1% annual chance (100-year) floodplain for Lake 12; and change in zone designation from Zone 1 to Zone AE. In addition, BFES have been added to Lakes 10, 11 and 12. The revised BFES are as follows:

The changes are made pursuant to Section 206 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (P.L. 93-234), and are in accordance with the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended, (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, P.L. 90-448) 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR Part 65.

Under the above mentioned Acts of 1968 and 1973, the Associate Director for Mitigation, must develop criteria for floodplain management. In order for the community to participate in the NFIP, the community will be using the new BFES and zone designations to administer the floodplain management measure of the NFIP. These modified BFES and zone designations will also be used to calculate the appropriate flood insurance premium rates for new buildings and their contents.

Upon the second publication of notice of these changes in this paper, any person has 90 days in which he can request through the Chief Executive officer of the community that the Associate Director for Mitigation reconsider the determination. Any request for reconsideration must be based on knowledge of changed conditions or new scientific or technical data. All interested parties are on notice that until the 90-day period elapses, the Associate Director's determination to modify the BFES and zone designations may itself be changed.
