

#### Carter Marks Anniversary

#### Of Camp David Accords THURMONT, Md. (UPI) - President Carter, ap-

parently fully recovered from an episode of heat exhaustion during a foot race, marked today's first anniversary of the Camp David accords with a plea for a full Middle East peace settlement. "Our goal has always been the establishment of a comprehensive peace in which Israel could at last live in

security and tranquility with all its neighbors," Carter said in a statement issued by the White House Sunday. The Camp David agreement, he said, which established frameworks for an Israeli-Egyptian treaty as well as an overall peace settlement, went "a long step on that path." Dr. William Lukash, White House physician, meanwhile, said Carter's health is excellent and "everything is normal," according to deputy press secretary Rex Granum, who detailed the results of two comprehensive physical examinations the president has undergone since the incident Saturday. Carter, who planned a return to Washington today after a weekend at Camp David, was overcome Saturday while running in a 6.2-mile race on the mountain roads near the presidential retreat.

#### Castro Lost A Few In Havana

The basic orientation of the non-aligned countries in world affairs appears to have been little changed by their just-concluded summit conference in Havana.

In terms of their final declaration of views, the 95 countries at the conference, as in the past, were highly critical of the United States and the West on familiar grounds. Nevertheless, they rebuffed idel Castro's strenuous attempt to put the nonaligned movement squarely in the Soviet camp. The moderates prevailed in upholding the position President Josep Broz Tito of Yugoslavia that the non-aligned group should preserve its independence as between the Western and Soviet

Castro and the more militant heads of state lawere also on the losing side in attempts to get the "Cambodian puppet regime of Heng Samrin admitted and Egypt evicted at the conference. Members ruled they would seat neither Heng Samrin nor China's puppet Pol Pot as Cambodia's representative, and both the Egyptian and Cambodian questions were deferred for further study and later decisions.

Americans can take some satisfaction that Castro, despite his leverage as conference host, did not get his way on important matters. But nonaligned summits are never happy occasions for the United States and its industrialized allies. It is standard fare at non-aligned meetings to berate the one-time colonial powers as "militarist," "imperalist," and if not still "colonialist," at least "neo-colonialist" — to deplore the alleged \*\* economic exploitation of Third World countries by "the industrialized West. Such charges are a form of Third World pressure for concessions from affluent nations as well as outlets for grievances that have some measure of justification. But they are also escapist rhetoric that camouflages the failure of many Third World countries to put their own shouses in order and settle down to the hard work of realizing their own potentials.

The Havana summit reasserted these old positions and added a new item of censure for the United States, namely a resolution against the Camp David accords - an action that put a majority of world nations on the record, pro forma at least, against the U.S.-Israeli-Egyptian peace

It is too early to assess what effect the Washington revelations about the presence of Soviet combat troops in Cuba had on Castro's standing at the conference. Apparently, this had mited impact inasmuch as elements of the Soviet brigade seem to have been there a long time, and summit leaders were quick to regard the revelations as a U.S. political ploy timed to damage Castro in sensitive circumstances. But it can be safely assumed, all things considered that, although he scored some points. Castro did not gain stature from the conference.

Non-aligned conferences themselves are never decisive in world affairs. Their importance lies in dixing policy lines that countries then carry over winto more important world gatherings such as U.N. meetings where policy lines become votes calling for action. Although Cuba and the Soviet Union undoubtedly will boast about their gains at Havana, the conference is not likely to make the conduct of foreign policy any harder, or any easier, befor the United States and the West.

## What's In 100 Days?

By DON GRAFF

Franklin Delano Roosevelt was responsible for introducing into the language of American politics a time period that is now of critical importance to James Earl Carter — 100 days. There similarity ends. It is differences, however, that are significant in this case. And as they apply to the importance of that period in the two presidencies, they go far to define the magnitude of the task at present facing Carter. For Roosevelt, the "Hundred Days" were those at the very beginning of his first administration. They saw a rush of innovative legislation that had a lasting effect upon the nation, established the pattern of an activist presidency and provided much of the momentum to carry it through three subsequent elections. For Carter, the situation is in many respects the reverse. A hundred days is roughly the period his own staff has set for the task of compiling a record of administrative and legislative accomplishment. These are not actually the last days of his administration, but they are effectively his last chance to turn his administration around from drift to action before facing the voters in the bid for a second

Roosevelt launched his legislative program fresh from a landslide election victory and with a large and largely cooperative congressional majority. Congress and public, stunned by the Depression and relieved that someone was at last doing something, were ready to be led.

Above all, in compiling his record he must deal with a Congress that is not only unimpressed by his performance to date but skeptical as to prospects of genuine improvement. It has a number of minds of its own on how to deal with energy, the economy and defense, the foremost make-or-break issues.

Some see it as an "imperial" Congress, successor to the "imperial" Johnson and Nixon presidencies, relishing its post-Watergate prominence and resistant to presidential direction. And it has no reason to do this president any favors. Dealing with a Congress more inclined to lead

# Canadians Acquire Chase & Co. Assets

Most of the assets of Chase & Co. are being purchased by Reichhold Limited, a Canadian corporation, through its United States subsidiary, Canadyne Corp. for "in excess of \$5 million," it was reported today. The 60 stockholders of the 95-year-old Sanford based Chase & Co. approved the sale Monday by 3-1.

Closing for the purchase is scheduled for Sept. 28. Although present management will continue, the name of the new corporation will be changed to Sunniland Corp. Lee Moore, president and general manager of Chase & Co. said the Chase & Co. firm has been using the "Sunniland" label on its fertilizer products for years. The only assets being retained by Chase & Co. are an orange grove in Seminole County, a sugar farm and a farm in Zellwood, said Moore.

Chase and Co., established in 1884, manufactures and sells a broad line of chemical fertilizers for agriculture and for the lawn and garden market in Florida. since last May. Both Moore and O'Shaughnessy declined to reveal the purchase price. Stockholders said, however, it is in

"excess of \$5 million." O'Shaughnessy said Reichhold's philosophy is decentralized management. "It will be up to Lee Moore and his management staff to set new goals for the organization and to meet them. We will not be setting goals for Sunniland," O'Shaughnessy said. "We have found that people who do the work set higher goals than we would." "All of our companies are quite autonomous," he said.

"There will be no change in key people, employment or

in what the company is doing," O'Shaughnessy said, "but there may be some additional products." He said the organization will grow a little faster with the infusion of new capital - "whatever is needed to provide a faster growth rate."

The Reichhold firm was founded in 1959 in Canada. In 1969, sales of \$21 million were recorded and sales in 1979 are expected to total \$291 million. Originally the Canadian firm manufactured synthetic

resins. In 1968 it diversified into printing and in 1973 bought Sears Limited in Canada. Sears sells printing equipment and supplies and broadened into agricultural chemicals and gas. In 1977 it began its acquisition program in the United States. It also has interests in oil and gas in Louisiana. Five weeks ago, it acquired a chemical and manufacturing exchange in

Texas and two weeks ago Seed and Feed in Ocala.




