

WASHINGTON, Nov. 27 .- In the three brief months of life that remain of the Sixty-eighth Congress, the House has many matters that must be thrashed out if it is legislative calendar.

Hanging over the session that ended last June are many bills that must be taken up on the floor for consideration after Congress reconvenes next Monday, Coupled with these are other bills, practically completed in committee, but not reported. In the closing months of the session numerous investigations were ordered.
