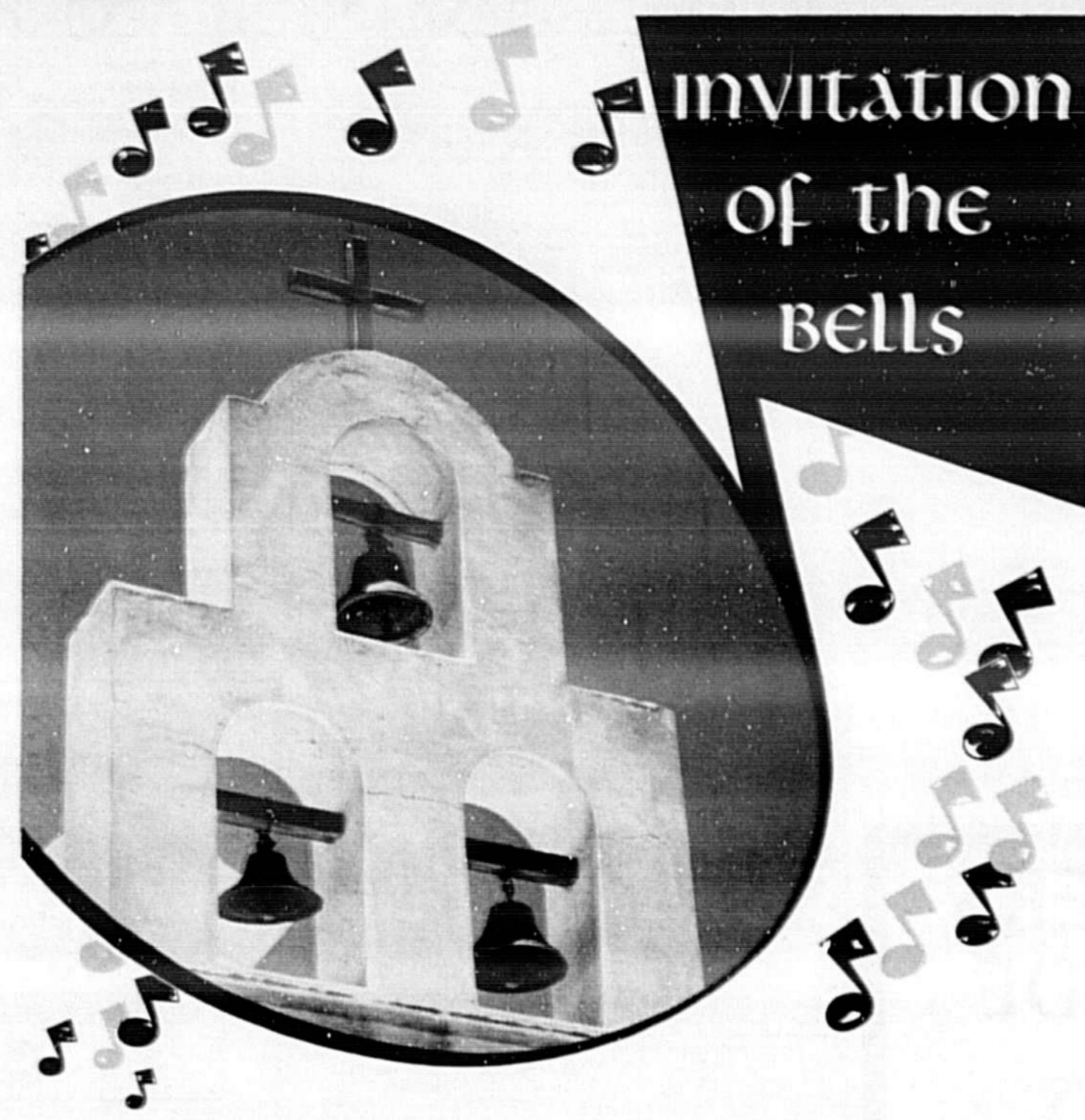

Chiles Goes Along With Gurney's Pick

MIAMI (AP) — Democratic Sen. Lawton Chiles' decision to go along with Republican Sen. Edward Gurney's recommendation for an appointment to the federal bench has put off a confrontation between the two, but probably not for long. While agreeing to support Gurney's recommendation of John A. Reed Jr. of West Palm Beach for appointment as a federal district judge, Chiles said "for the future I intend to insist that we find a better way than political patronage." But Gurney said he had no intention of supporting Chiles' proposal to create a nine-member judicial selection commission, composed of appointees of the two senators and the Florida Bar, to recommend judicial appointees to the President.

"Because I do not want to cloud the issue of finding a better way to select our federal judges and because he seems to be qualified," said Chiles. "I am going to support Judge John A. Reed for the vacancy left by the death of Judge William McRae." If President Nixon accepts Gurney's recommendation, Reed, 41, now a member of the Florida 4th District Court of Appeal, would become a U.S. District Judge for the Middle District of Florida. Under Chiles' proposal, the selection commission would screen applicants and submit five names to the senators. From these Gurney and Chiles would make a joint recommendation to the President for nomination. If the senators were unable to agree, the final selection would revert to the board of governors of the Florida Bar Association. Gurney called the proposal "interesting but wholly impractical and reflects serious disregard of the Constitution."

"Chiles would have the President rely on nine people, whom he doesn't know and has no part in naming, to pick his judges," Gurney said. "It is difficult to think of an idea that would abrogate more completely the responsibility of the President and of a senator in the selection of judges." Gurney said the present system of recommending appointments for judgeships is working and he sees no sense in changing it.

3 Seminole County POWs Fly Into Alabama Air Base

CLARK AIR BASE, Philippines (AP) — Sixty happy American prisoners, including three from Seminole County, left Clark Air Base for home Saturday, and plans are being made for the departure of more on Sunday and Monday. Navy Cmdr. William M. Hardman, Longwood; Navy Lt. Cmdr. Giles R. Norrington, Sanford; and Navy Lt. Richard G. Tangeman, Sanford, were all scheduled to arrive on the second of three flights. That plane was scheduled to arrive at Maxwell Air Base, Ala. at 7:30 p.m. Saturday. All three will be going to the Jacksonville Naval Hospital. (Complete list of the returning 60 POWs on page 7A.) The POWs who left Saturday were from a group of 100 released by North Vietnam last Wednesday. They included Navy Lt. Cmdr. John S. McCain III, 36, son of Adm. John S. McCain Jr., former commander-in-chief of U.S. Pacific forces, who directed the war in Vietnam. McCain, whose wife Carol lives in Orange Park, Fla., flew to Maxwell Air Base to meet her husband.

Funds Cut Off Special School In Jeopardy

Eighteen day care centers in Florida including Seminole County's Little Red School House, which provides special training for retarded children, face imminent closure because President Richard Nixon has frozen their funds. Christine L. Jones, acting Little Red School House County coordinator, and executive director of the Seminole County Association for Retarded Children (SCARC), explained that the existence of the Little Red School House is in its present location at the Community United Methodist Church in Cassberry, and the hopes of moving it to a permanent home in the projected 30 acre Children's Village, is jeopardized.

This week she received a memorandum from Jack McAllister, the director of the Florida Division of Retardation, summarizing significant changes in federal proposed rule making concerning laws that effect the proposed expansion of the Sunland Hospital and Training Centers and the establishment of the regional organization system being implemented by the Department of Retardation to request that if federal policy must be changed, at least the contracts that exist be honored until termination, with a one-year containment contract renewal so that the programs can be gradually liquidated.

The SCARC objects to their contract and the other 17 programs in the state being placed in jeopardy because the Florida IV-A Requirements have been combined. At the present time a family of four within an approximate gross income of \$2,700 a year or less qualifies and the children of that family would be eligible to attend a Title IV-A Day Care Program. Proposed regulations seem to have the effect of reducing the \$2,700 gross income to approximately \$1,300.

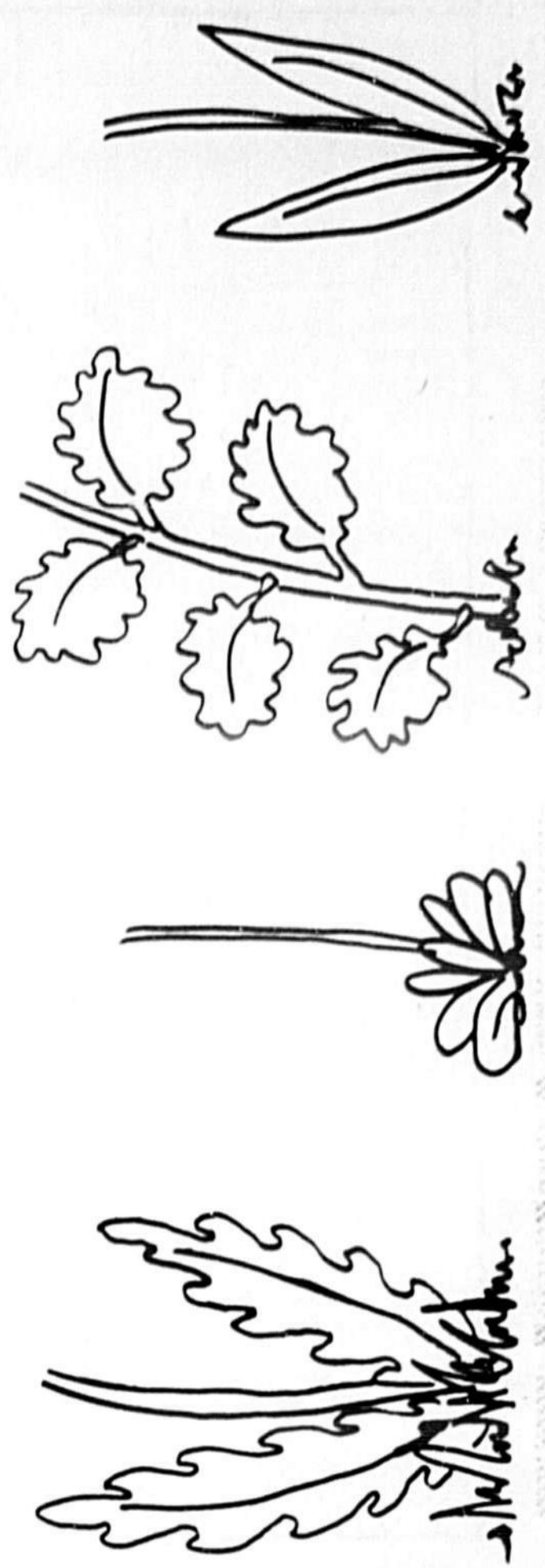
