Hubert H. Humphrey - Man For President - 1969

We endorse Hubert H. Humphrey for the office of President of the United States. We do this because we believe he is the best man in terms of character, ability and experience to fill this post as both the domestic and foreign fronts come under heavy fire from within and without during the next four years.

Mr. Humphrey is right now displaying the courage and strength which has characterized his public career since cleaning up the City of Minneapolis as mayor. He is being attacked by an organized, militant minority. If a man should be known by his friends, it is certainly true that his enemies finish the picture with the harsh outlines of such an attack.

Yet it is the issue of the Vietnam War which now devils the presidential candidate of the Democratic party. Almost everywhere he turns he finds his old issues, those he championed when few would pay any more than lip service, being adopted by his political rivals.

Lessons learned in 1960 are not being ignored. Far from it. They are being given priority. But we would remind them that this is not the world of 1960. We are a nation now in ferment. There are new questions being asked everyday. We do not hear any answers from the Nixon camp that can be nailed down as solid plans.

The "Giant Step"

Congratulations to the new Jacksonville! What has been accomplished in our sister-city to the north is worthy of praise from every viewpoint. For now the consolidated county-city government functions in the largest land-area city in the United States—827 square miles.

In short, Jacksonville and Duval county have decided that action now will prevent confusion tomorrow. Already the far-sighted leaders are looking as far as 1990 when the area planning board predicts a population of 1,110,000 residents.

"Samizdat" Underground Press

WASHINGTON (NEA) — An underground technique perfected under the czar offers the United States an unparalleled opportunity to strengthen the pressures for human freedom within the Soviet Union. In the days of the czar, as now, Russian writers could not get their works published if their writings offended the authorities.

These poets, novelists and playwrights then would copy their banned works with pen and ink, circulate them through hand-to-hand underground networks. This system was called "samizdat."

Fulbright Scholarships?

The Senate's Fulbright-type vote away taxpayers' hard-earned money on programs to send the brightest U.S. students to foreign colleges to be indoctrinated in Fulbright and Fulbright scholar-ship there is obscured in voluminous wordage so that the public cannot digest and quote it.

But the casual reader might think Fulbright donated the money himself. Digging into the record shows, however, the appropriations from tax funds for Fulbright programs totaled \$38,800,000 in 1966, for example. This was the fiscal year after the winter of the U.S. agreed on bringing communist dictator Tito's Yugoslavia into the Fulbright program, with Fulbright himself present for the signing. He took that occasion to praise that dictation as a nation "in a unique position to contribute to the education of other nations."

HHH And His "IN" Stigma

CLEVELAND (NEA)—Vice President Humphrey's aides say privately that the political world would be amazed to identify and the number of key Democrats who have urged him to resign his high office to divorce himself from President Johnson on Vietnam and other issues troubling the nation.

There seems no likelihood at all he will take this step. And more than a few of Humphrey's advisers argue that it would probably do him far more harm than good in his race against Richard Nixon and George Wallace.

Dorish Democrats of the McCarthys stripe appear to believe that if the vice president can just separate himself from the President on the Vietnam war, there will be a flood of eager voters will come flocking to his banner and strengthen his now fragile hopes of victory. But supporting evidence is lacking. No polling data or other surveys suggest that acceptance of such dovish terms as an unconditional U.S. withdrawal from Vietnam would unlock the door to great clusters of votes.

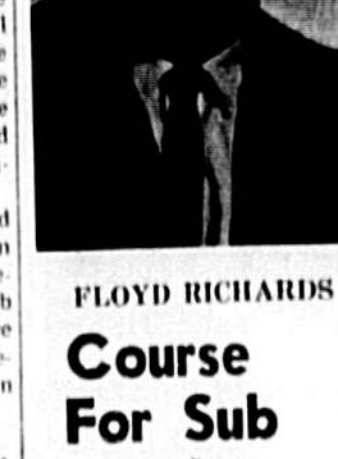

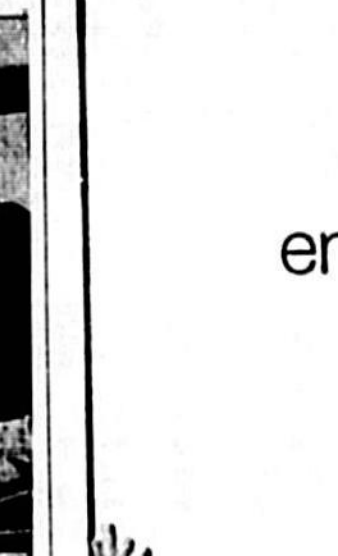

Senate Rebuffs LBJ, Fortas

WASHINGTON (AP) — Majority Leader Mike Mansfield, backing time and strong opposition, says he will decide by week's end whether to try to overturn the Senate vote against Abe Fortas' nomination to be chief justice.

The Senate desk Fortas and President Johnson a prestige-crushing blow Tuesday when an attempt to end a filibuster against the appointment fell 11 votes short.

Manfield, who is under strong pressure to end the Senate session soon because of the upcoming election, said after the vote: "I am thinking the whole picture through and trying to decide on my next move. I want to assess the line-up of the Senate and see what the prospects and possibilities are."

If he can't drum up support, the nomination will be dead, for all intents and purposes. Fortas' foes were confident that there will be no shifts from the vote, which was 45 to 43 to kill the filibuster—far short of the two-thirds margin needed to limit debate and bring the nomination to the floor.

# Lyman High Has 'Growing Pains'

Beginning the fifth week of school, Lyman High is having serious "growing pains", according to William (Bud) Laver, assistant principal.

The state survey shows the present school plant was built to house 550 students. Last year we received three portable classrooms and today we have an enrollment of 1,282, an increase over last year's enrollment of 200 students, Laver said.

World History classes are taught in the school auditorium while a study hall group meets at the same time directly behind in the cafeteria. Each class contains 150 students and there is no partition what-so-ever separating the two, Laver advised.

The gymnasium serves as a classroom for the driver's education class, with the bleachers used as desks.

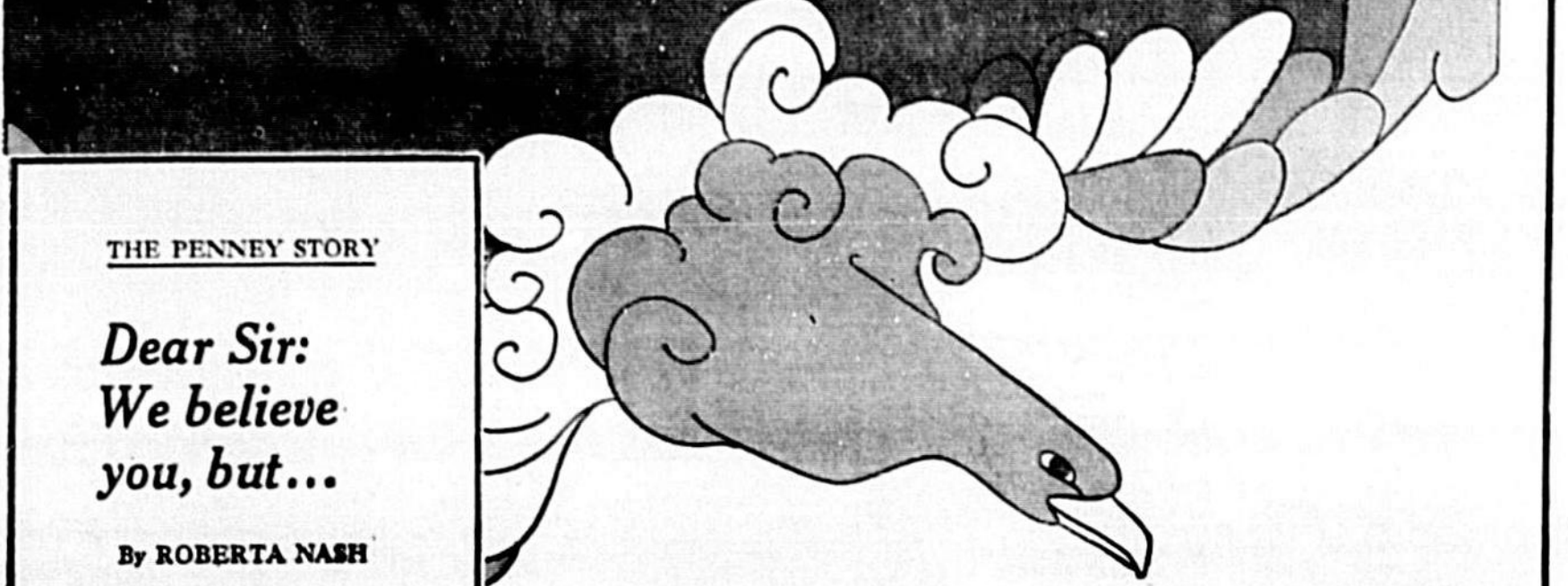
"In addition to this, we have five floating teachers with no permanent classroom of their own," Laver added.

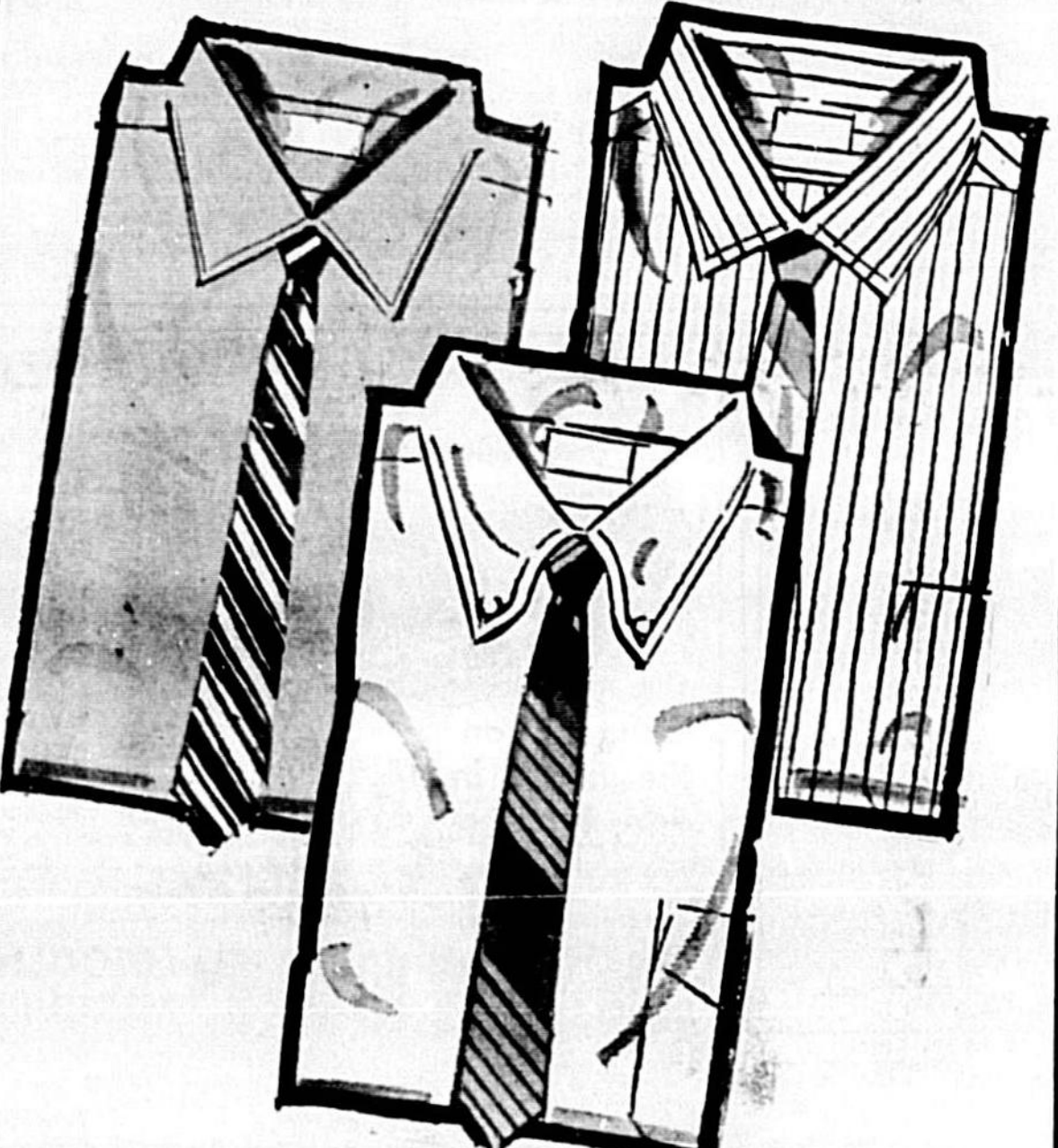

One of the most popular puddings in American cuisine comes in layers—a cake-like top and a custard-like bottom.  
Perhaps this pudding has intrigued cooks over the years because, although it's a two-part affair, it's made in one mixing and separates during baking.  
Originally this dessert started out as a lemon pudding. But cooks eventually began to give it orange flavor. And this year a really adventurous cook came up with a grapefruit version.  
From the original lemon pudding it's just one step to lime—and that's the flavor the following recipe features. The lime version is a delicious concoction and may be made well ahead of serving time because it tastes best after it has been chilled.

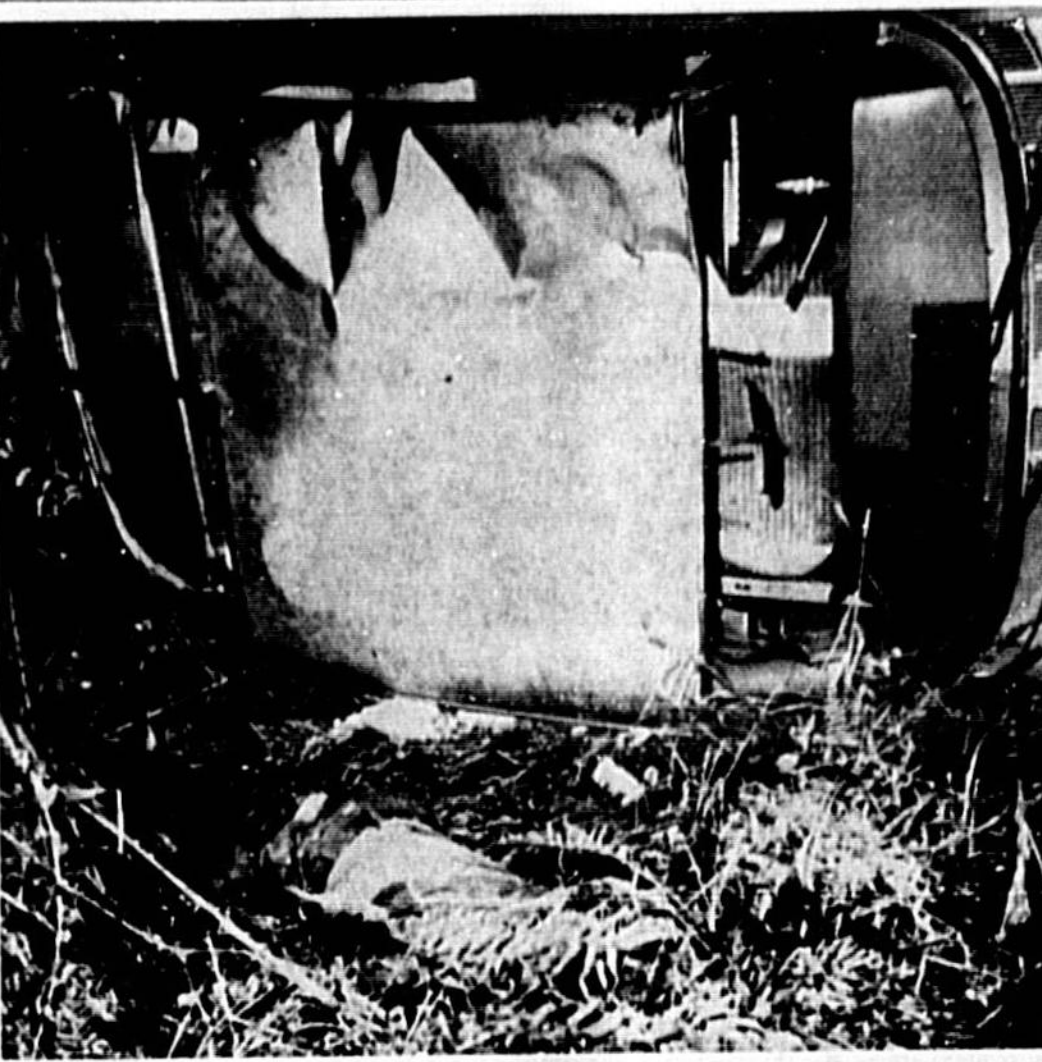


Deputy Retires
