Each franchise cost \$6 million, three times the amount paid by the six West Division expansion teams that entered doubled its size to 12. Now with 14 teams, the NHL had to shuffle its divisional

setup with Chicago of the East Division moving to the West, while Buffalo and Vancouver set up shop in the East. Other teams in the East are Montreal, Toronto, New York, Detroit and Boston. In addition to Chicago, the West is made up of Oakland, Pittsburgh, Minnesota, Los Angeles, St. Louis and Philadelphia.

The Vancouver franchise was awarded to the Medicor Corporation of Minnesota, a Minneapolis-based firm, while the Buffalo group - the Niagara Frontier Hockey Corporation is headed by bankers Seymour H. Knox and his brother.

Buffalo's entry is "contingent on the formal approval by Buffalo city authorities to increase, hy the 1970-71 season, the seating capacity of War Memorial Auditorium to not less than 15,000 seats," a statement from the NHL read. In addition they will have to be an execution of a lease satisfactory to the NHL between the city of Buffalo and the

hockey club. The NHL board of governors said that Vancouver would have to acquire the Northwest Sports Enterprises, which owns the Vancouver Canucks of the Western League and Rochester of the American League. And final execution of a satisfactroy lease with the Pacific Coliseum, the arena which is owned by the Pacific National Exhibition Co. Campbell said four more teams will be added in 1973-74, two for each division - plus the possibility of a European di-

vision. However the Europeans would not compete during the regular season with the NHL but would meet for the world championship at the close of the season. Campbell said that Moscow, Leningrad, Stockholm and Prague were leading candidates for the European entries. The 1970-71 schedule is set for 78 games with the 14 teams

playing six games against the other 13 clubs. Buffalo Bills' halfback O. J.
