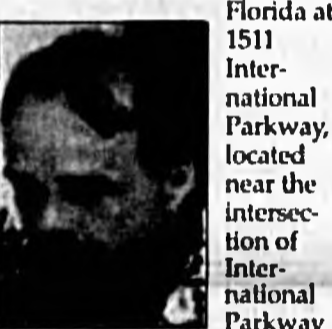

Lake Mary bank robbed

Lake Mary police are asking for the community's help in tracking a down a bank robber.

At about 1:30 p.m. Thursday, Lake Mary police and Seminole County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to the First National Bank of Central

Florida at 1511 International Parkway, located near the intersection of International Parkway and County Road 46A.

A white male, about 35 to 40 years of age reportedly demanded a bank teller to empty a cash drawer in a bag. Lake Mary police Sgt. Greg Grayson said no weapon was seen at the time, but he held a pair of rolled up white socks in his right hand.

A dye pack was given along with the money. Police say the pack exploded, but they are unsure if it tainted any of the money as it was found ditched along side International Parkway.

The suspect reportedly made his get a way in a medium blue, four-door Jeep Cherokee and traveled toward Interstate 4.

The First National Bank branch is less than a year old and is equipped with state-of-the-art digital cameras, police said.

"He made no effort to conceal his identity," Grayson said.

"We're hoping somebody out there in the public will recognize this gentleman. The picture is quite clear."

Seminole Blvd. still closed to traffic

SANFORD — City commissioners will consider Monday night whether to close Seminole Boulevard for a classic car festival May 29. Problem is, the road has yet to open.

Seminole Boulevard was closed to traffic about 15 months ago so the city could rebuild the seawall and install a

walking/biking path along Lake Monroe. But two weeks after the official grand opening of the \$11.2 million project, the boulevard remains closed.

City of Sanford project manager Chris Smith sent an e-mail on May 13 indicating the road would be open on May 14. Later that day, Smith sent another e-mail changing the opening to sometime this week and said

there were some "minor" issues to correct. Those issues have apparently become more substantial and city officials say Seminole Boulevard may not open for

several weeks.

"It's going to be a few more weeks before we open that road back up," Smith said. "There are some issues we want to take care of so that we don't have maintenance problems down the road. From a safety standpoint and work scheduling, it's easier if we do that we there is no traffic."

City OKs first park smoking ban in Seminole

LONGWOOD — City commissioners successfully extinguished smoking in Longwood parks Tuesday by passing a measure with a 4-1 margin that outlaws tobacco use in public recreational areas.

Deputy Mayor Brian Sackett cast the lone dissenting vote. He has repeatedly debated the ordinance that bans smoking in city parks, but also creates designated smoking areas in the recreational areas.

"I think the designated areas are going to create more problems than they are worth," he said. "I have issues with designated areas that children will not be supervised."

Sackett also objected to how the ordinance does not outline stipulations for the creation of the designated smoking areas. The decision on where to place the designated areas is up to City Administrator John Drago, but will be submitted to the City Commission for approval.

Smaller parks will probably not have a designated smoking area, but two larger parks that will be Reiter and Candyland. Reiter Park is currently being redesigned so a smoking area will be incorporated in the process, Drago said.

"The biggest challenge is going to be Candyland because (of the proximity) of the ball fields and playground," he said.

The proposed fine for violating the Longwood ordinance

Former Sanford resident turns 106 years old

SANFORD — Ruth Hamilton, a long time Sanford resident who now lives in Orlando, celebrated her 106 birthday on April 12. And she has not simply been alive for 106 years — she has lived for 106 years.

Hamilton, who used to live in Bram Towers, could write a book about all the things she has seen and done in her 106 years.

So she did. Hamilton grew up in Alta, Iowa, the daughter of Peter and Hulda Jensen, immigrants from Denmark and Sweden. She has always loved baseball, and, in 1921, she married a pitcher for the Cleveland Indians, Dr. Carter Hamilton.

Later, Ruth Hamilton moved to Florida. Her son, Peter, attended Lyman High School. Hamilton has been a teacher, lecturer, radio commentator and a member of the U.S. House of Representatives in

New Hampshire.

She was very involved in the community, often wrote editorials and had homes investigated to help children who were receiving inadequate care.

Some of her travels include Romania, Russia, the Balkans, Norway and Germany.

She even has had tea with Eleanor Roosevelt.

Some of her other experiences along her way include meeting Hitler in 1937, corresponding with former first lady Hillary Clinton, meeting former Nobel Peace Prize winner Oscar Arias and being invited to the inaugurations of Presidents Carter and Johnson.

She received the Unsung Heroine Award from the New Hampshire Commission of the Statues of Women in 1986.

Not surprisingly, Governor Jeb Bush has proclaimed a Ruth Hamilton Day.

Hamilton wrote a 52-chapter memoir book to share her experiences.

After all that, one might think Hamilton would be

ready to rest. However, she continues to contribute to charities, mentors and gives talks about her experiences. Hamilton is also a member of the Optimist Club and the Historical Society.

"She's very spunky and out-

spoken," said Penny Sheipe, of Sanford, a friend. "I guess she's my mentor."

Hamilton takes no pills or medicine except for the occasional aspirin, boasts Sheipe. "She'd go dancing if you'd let her!"

Lake Mary deal upsets some

LAKE MARY — Litigation between the Seminole County School Board and Lake Mary may be coming to a close, but some residents believe the city made concessions at their expense.

Residents from the Manderley and Timaqan neighborhoods voiced their concerns Thursday as city commissioners gave their final approval to a settlement and development agreement

that ends a year-long legal battle with the School Board and includes the participation of resident-developer D.R. Horton.

The agreement spells an end to the legal debate over the city's denial to approve a "Excel School"

for troubled students at a building located in Technology Park off Lake Emma Road. It increases the density for a proposed commercial and residential development, The Villages of Lake Mary, located near the intersection of Primera Boulevard and Rinehart Road.

In exchange for up to 500 townhouse units and 16 single-family homes of medium density in planned unit development, D.R. Horton would set aside about seven acres of the 156-acre tract — considered to be the last large parcel of undeveloped land in Lake Mary — for a new elementary school.

For its cooperation in the agreement, the School Board would not only receive the elementary school site free, but it would also obtain city property at the Public Safety site at a cost of \$75,000.

Nearby residents expressed trepidation about the expedited manner in which the city approved the agreement. Commissioners

A GLANCE AROUND OUR COUNTY

Waiting game: Soldiers have a phrase they use to describe the bureaucratic chaos that results in periods of inactivity: **Hurry up and wait.** I doubt there's much hurry up and wait for those troops stationed in the Middle East. However the phrase fits well for any branch of government. Take the city of Sanford's RiverWalk, for example.

After months of steady progress, work seemed to stop in mid-February. Much of the landscaping was installed in March and there was a bustling of activity in the final days before the official grand opening on May 8.

But for weeks as I made my daily trips down to the lakefront, there appeared to be little activity. I walked/biked/skated over the same rough patches and holes. I passed along my observations and assumed they'd be corrected in due time. I wasn't alone.

Now comes word, two weeks after the official RiverWalk opening, that Seminole Boulevard will remain closed a minimum of two weeks, probably much longer. I wrote last week that if it was up to me, the lakefront would be closed to vehicles permanently. That's not how the project was designed, however, and it's a bit irksome that the boulevard remains closed.

Unfortunately, the city of Sanford has been adverse to inserting incentive/penalty clauses into major capital project contracts. Other cities I have lived and worked in financially reward contractors for meeting early deadlines and impose hefty fines for failing to finish a project on time. The city commission, for all its talk about running government like a business, continues to be befuddled by this concept.

Oh well, I reckon there's nothing else to do but hurry up and wait.

I dare ya: Last week I wrote about Sanford Mayor Brady Lessard shaving his head to benefit the Central Florida chapter of the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. Former mayor Larry Dale challenged Lessard to shave his thinning locks if Dale was successful in raising \$2,000. He raised \$3,000.

But that wasn't the only challenge issued. **Word Around The Clock** is that someone challenged the Lake Mary City Commission and the Seminole County School Board (most of the members of each group were in attendance) to perform a group hug for the camera. The city and the school board recently settled a year-long legal battle regarding a piece of property the school system owns in Lake Mary. (See Page 1A, right-hand side, in today's Herald for more details.)

The two boards complied with the challenge and a photo was taken, though I haven't seen evidence of such. If someone has the photo, I'd love to publish it.

Always the publicity hound, Lessard pooh-pooed the group hug stunt.

"I changed my total appearance," Lessard said. "All they did was pose for a group picture." He was quick to point out that his stunt raised \$2,850 more than the hug photo.

Lessard was less critical of Dale's performance which involved swallowing a goldfish for \$50.

"I don't think I could have swallowed that thing for \$3,000, much less \$50," Lessard said.

Of course, the old mayor has a lot more gut (no "s") to accomplish that job than the new mayor.

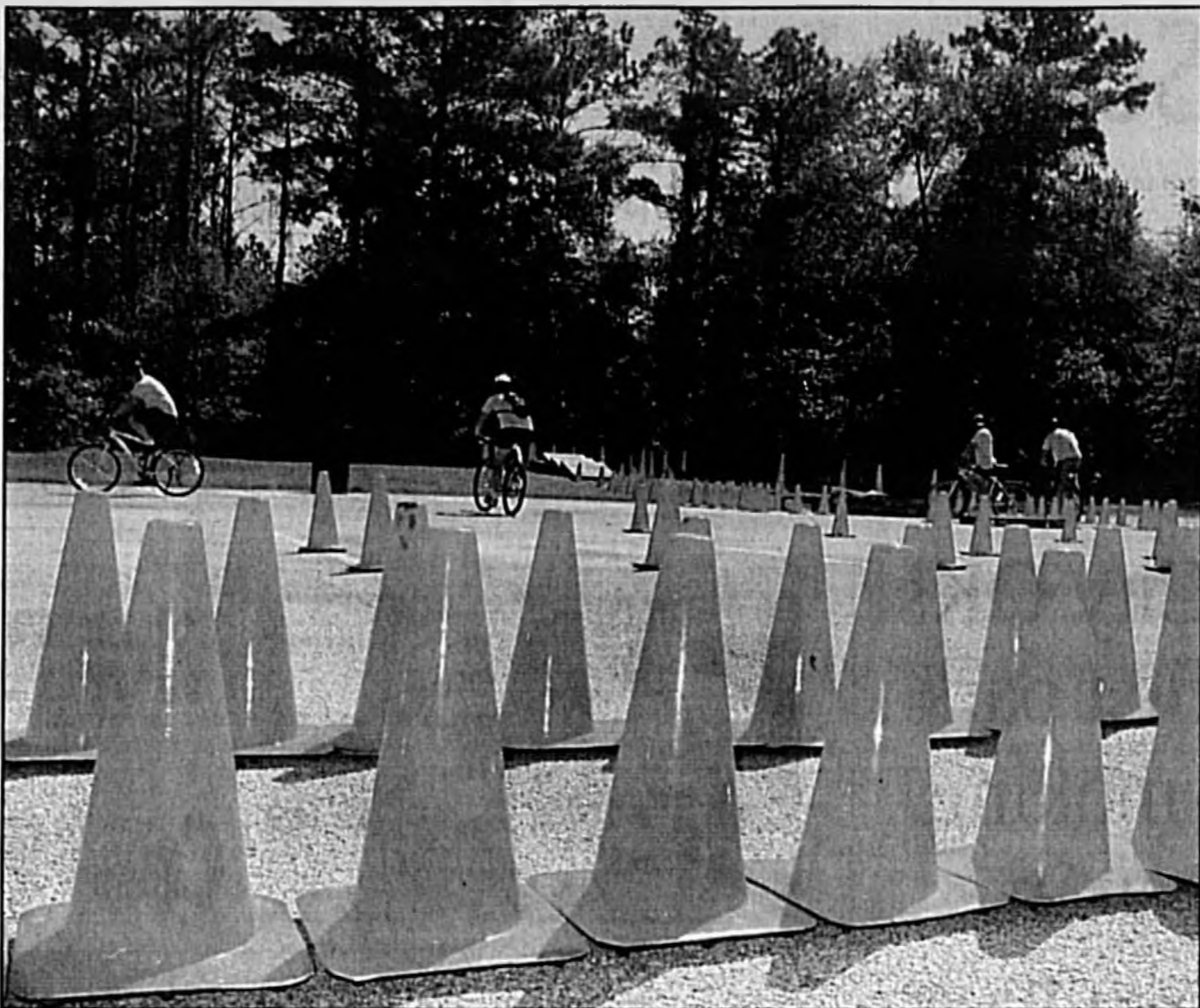
Money well spent?: Sanford city commissioners will decide Monday whether to extend a \$5,000 per month contract to Adeo Media Group for public relations, advertising, marketing and related services. After the job Adeo did promoting the RiverWalk celebration, I'd say it's money well spent. That's bad news for the Mica McCormick Agency.

Mica McCormick is the firm the city and the Sanford Airport Authority agreed to give \$40,000 to market the city and the airport. DeAnne Mica, daughter of U.S. Rep. John Mica, is the Mica of Mica McCormick and the point person with the city.

Word Around The Clock is the congressman's daughter received not one but two tongue-lashings from city manager, and retired U.S. Marine colonel, Al Grieshaber. Evidently, Grieshaber had grown accustomed to the thorough job Adeo did on the RiverWalk marketing, including detailed reports documenting and measuring media coverage the event generated. The city was getting much less from Mica McCormick. In fact, until Grieshaber's "come to Jesus" meetings, Mica had yet to put together a plan for how she and her firm planned to earn the taxpayers' money.

The prodding by Grieshaber did result in some action. Mayor Lessard took a last-minute flight to Gary, Ind., as part of Mica's strategy to promote the new Gary-Sanford service offered by Southeast Airlines. He remained in Gary for about an hour before catching a return flight.

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Clubs, deputies gather items for kids

Seminole County 4-H teens, members of the Longwood Rotary Club, and the Child Protective Services Unit of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office will be working on a special community project starting Saturday, June 5, at 10 a.m. at Child Protective Services Division, 100 Bush Blvd. in Sanford.

Adults and youth alike will be assembling backpacks filled with basic necessities and activities for Seminole County children that receive services from

Child Protection.

Annually, more than 3,000 children in Seminole County are reported for child abuse, removed or receive services from this division of the sheriff's office.

The "Packaged with Care" project started as a partnership between the Seminole County 4-H Teens in Action community service club, Longwood Rotary Club, and the sheriff's office as a way to provide for those children who are removed from their

homes with little or not notice. The program has grown to assisting other children in need.

Children receive a backpack filled with personal care items, clothing, books, toys, games, and a teddy bear with its own security blanket. The project has received funding from local business, the Longwood Rotary Club as well as a grant from National 4-H Council.

nance would be up to \$100 for first-time offenders and possibly up to \$500 for each subsequent violation.

Commissioner Dan Anderson said the smoking ban in city parks accommodates the best use of the property for the most people.

"I think this is a regulation of how public property will be enjoyed," he said. "I would personally like to take my dog to the park, but I am not allowed to because of a few people that have been inconsiderate so you get along and deal with it."

Along with Port Orange, Brevard County has enacted a similar ban on smoking, but Commissioner John Maingot said he expects others will follow.

"I think it's a good thing and I think other cities around will

take note of what we have done," he said.

In other business:

Commissioners turned down a request to revisit language in the historic district codebook that forbids tractor-trailers from traveling through downtown district streets unless permitted by the police chief.

Progress Energy had requested City Administrator John Drago bring the issue before the City Commission as one of their employees was recently cited for \$100 by Longwood police.

"They have a valid point because I told them the ordinance wouldn't be applicable to them if they had to do a service call, but they're trying to do more preventive maintenance," Drago said.

Several commissioners said they thought large Progress

Energy trucks driving through the historic district was unnecessary when looking for maintenance issues.

"I just feel a little strange on this thing it is almost as though as 'Oops it is something we forgot to include,' but I also can't see a large 12,000-pound plus truck driving through looking to cite any preventive type things," Sackett said.

Commissioners were pleased to announce the Boston Medical Group billboard advertising "Sex for Life" on Interstate 4 was removed after the city expressed concern to Viacom, the billboard owner.

"I like to congratulate our city administrator for his following through and also for Viacom for seeing the wisdom and the perseverance of our small but powerful city," said Commissioner John Maingot. "We truly represent the voice of the people and when it comes time to speak up we do not hesitate."

Bumping & grinding

Ever since my column recently regarding the need for portable traffic lights to be put into service whenever there is a major power failure at an intersection, people have been asking me what other inventions I have to suggest.

One that comes to mind immediately has probably been invented, but apparently very few municipalities use it. It's a road-leveling machine, perhaps similar to a sanding machine for wood.

It seems (to me, at least) that every time a utility such as a water line or electrical line is placed under a roadway and the depression is filled, it is never level. There is always a dip when the surfacing goes down. Some of these dips might be 5 to 10 feet in width. On the other hand, once in awhile, the filling causes the roadway to be higher than the rest of the surface. I don't believe these are ever corrected. Do the utility companies or municipal public works departments believe that once a depression is filled, the project is completed and no more work is needed? Our vehicles are forced to bump along over the road. I would hope there is some machine capable of traveling over these areas and making them level but I have seen no such device.

One solution to this problem has been with us for years. The city or county merely puts up a sign approaching the depression saying "dip" or approaching the rise that says, "bump." I'm familiar with one such "dip" sign that has been on a Sanford street for possibly 20 years or more.

Of course, a road leveler could not resolve my frequent complaint about manhole covers, but there must be something that could be accomplished so that these don't always stick up in the road 3 to 5 inches from the surface. As frequent readers know, my main complaint has been along 25th Street from Sanford Avenue to Mellonville in the left lane. Talk about speed-bumps, these are lusus. Vehicles traveling east often attempt to miss those hazards by driving to the left, and allowing the manhole covers to go underneath. This however, is often a traffic hazard in itself as it veers one over into the path of oncoming traffic.

I have, at times, thought that these depressions and raised areas are intentional, designed to slow traffic. Believe me, they certainly do just that. Bouncing up or down in a vehicle, even at the posted speed limit or less, is uncomfortable, and unnecessary (and it can spill your cup of coffee).

But getting back to the road-leveling machine — I know there is large machinery which can travel down a paved street, rip up the present pavement, mix it with new materials, and deposit it back onto the roadway in a repaving situation. These are great. The roadway ends up as smooth as can be. Unfortunately, in what appears to be a very short time, along comes a developer or utility company, digs up the new roadway to plant new utility lines or sewers under it, and we end up having another depression.

Everyone is concerned about streets and highways these days. The Florida Department of Transportation is continuously working on improving Interstate 4 and highways in our area, to allow for better motoring convenience. Additions of new lanes on Interstate 4 have been a boon for many folks, and new exit and entrance ramps (if they're ever finished) have provided better accessibility from one artery to another.

But get off those major highways into a city or town, and it's bump-bump, bump. We may as well have square tires on our vehicles — it would have the same effect.

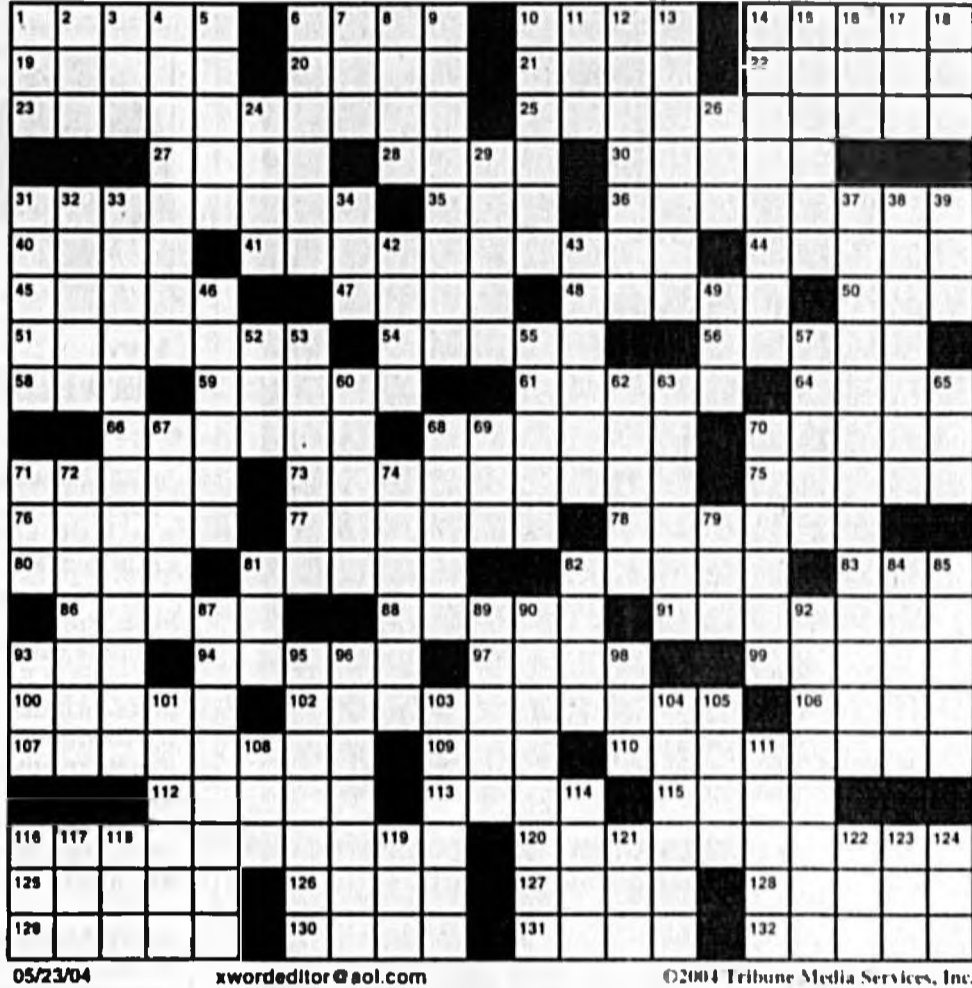

Florida philanthropist Eckerd passes at 91

Jack Eckerd, 91, philanthropist, activist, appointee of three U.S. presidents and founder of the Jack Eckerd Corporation passed away on Wednesday, May 19, 2004, in the company of his family.

Eckerd's memorial service will be held at Peace Memorial Presbyterian Church, 110 South Ft. Harrison in Clearwater on Monday, May 24, at 11 a.m. A visitation at Peace Memorial Presbyterian Church, Roebing Hall, will be held on Sunday, May 23, from 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. Born on May 16, 1913, in Wilmington, Del., Eckerd graduated from Culver Military Academy and the Boeing School of Aeronautics. He was a pilot for the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II, receiving the Air Medal and Presidential Unit Citation. He was a member of the Hump Pilots Association, the organization of pilots and crews that served in the China-Burma-India Theatre that flew over the Himalayan Mountains known as the "Hump."

Starting in the 1950s, Eckerd

transformed the retail drugstore business, creating self-service stores and the national drug chain bearing his name.

As a man of great faith who deeply believed that every child is entitled to an opportunity to succeed, Eckerd and his wife, Ruth, founded Eckerd Youth Alternatives in 1968, one of the nation's leading non-profit organizations offering therapeutic educational programs to troubled and at-risk youth. During his lifetime, more than 60,000 troubled youth have been helped in Eckerd Youth Alternatives' programs.

His active involvement in politics and service in both state and national government spanned thirty years and included appointments by both Presidents Gerald Ford and Jimmy Carter as Administrator of the General Services Administration.

In addition to his wife, Eckerd is survived by seven children, William Eckerd, Bozeman, Mont.; Rosemary Lassiter, Wilmington; James Swann, Merritt Island; Kathy Swann

Brooks, Tampa, Fla.; Terrell Swann Clark, Tampa; Richard Eckerd, Asheville, N.C.; Nancy Eckerd Hart, Clearwater; 17 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

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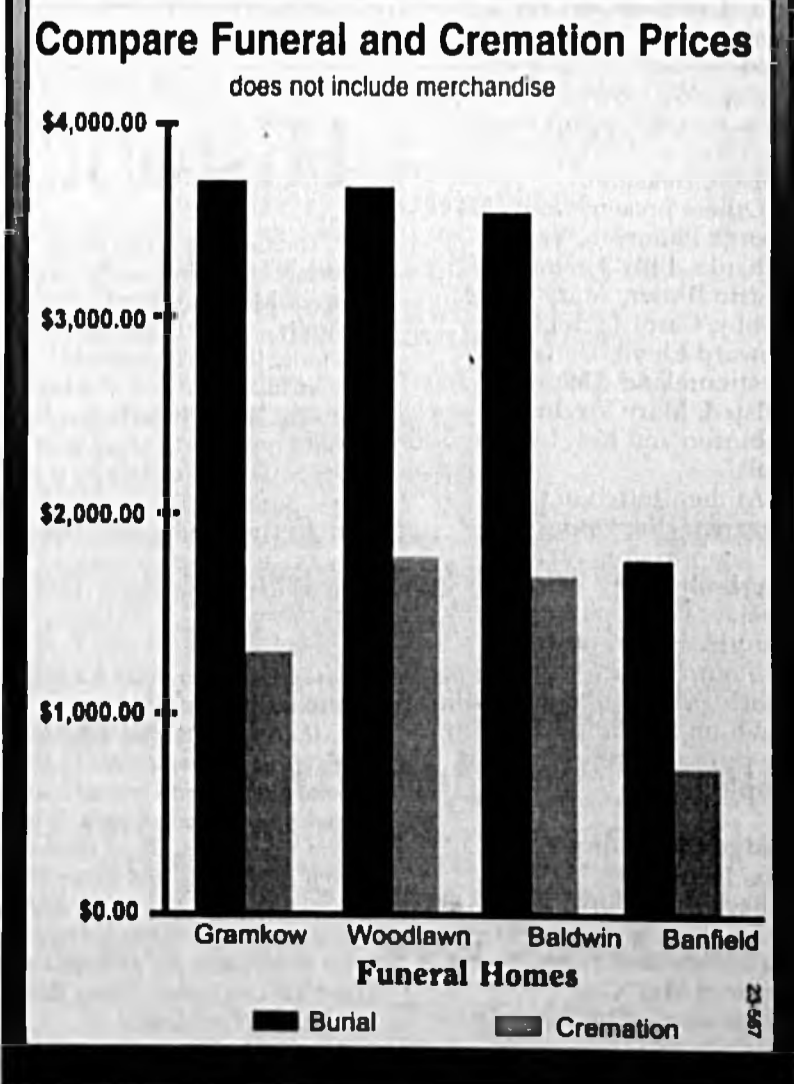

"Old Fort Lane originally stood on the clean sanded shores of Lake Harney, along the Eastern boundary of our community. It was one of the chain of forts used by the American army in its campaign of terror and treachery against the picturesque Seminoles.

"A few sand covered, charred posts still mark the site Tradition tells of a san-

guine clash between the soldiers and their Indian opponents, in which the commandant of the fort, Captain William Harney, separated from his men, saved his life by a wild plunge into the waters of the lake which now bears his name. Of heroic acts, of sacrifice, of grief-what stories of those days the gnarled old live oaks might tell. But history is mute.

"And those who then greeted the sunrise over Lake Harney have long since passed into the sunset beyond Lake Jessup. When the Harts, the Prevatts, the Daniels, and others of the first settlers drove their herds of cattle into the Geneva area, wandering remnants [sic] of that chivalrous Indian tribe were still wont to return from time to time to the pleasant woodlands of their memories.

"The life of the pioneer communities is filled with the eternal struggle of man against nature. Such was the early life at Geneva, as told me by several old men whose boyhood memories go back to those early days. The woods 'bowed to their sturdy strokes.'

"The timber line was driven back and gardens were made to produce. In the surrounding wilderness herds of cattle grew fat and increased in number, despite the

ravages of wild animals and even more dangerous human marauders. And now and then there was a wild ride through the night over treacherous trails and a baby's cry was heard in some pioneer home.

"In the late seventies we find the inhabitants devoting more attention to the raising of citrus and less to the cattle industry. About that time a circuit riding evangelist held religious services beneath the outstretching arms of a giant oak that still stands in our cemetery.

"The men of the community cooperated in the building of a one room rock-floored schoolhouse. An enterprising [sic] resident made weekly trips over the trails to Orlando and so supplied his little store. Mail came twice a month up the St. Johns River and citrus, lumber, and turpentine found their markets down the winding channel of the same stream. Cattle were driven in herds to the markets at Jacksonville, fording streams and sloshing through swamps. It was a hard working, God fearing and happy community.

"The massacre of the forests seems to have started during the seventies. Then

Turpentiners followed — in their greed destroying those trees which the lumbermen had left. During the succeeding years incendiary fires, thought by the cattlemen to improve the grazing for their herds, or negligently set by irresponsible campers, have made barren thousands of acres of our choicest lands. This tragedy of the woods is still being enacted year by year.

During a final inspection Thursday, city officials discovered cracked concrete curbs, holes in the asphalt on the road and inferior asphalt finishing on the pathway. There also appears to be a problem with some of the stormwater inlets, including a filtering device that may have been installed backwards.

"When I walked it yesterday, there was some ponding on the concrete near the inlets," said Al Grieshaber, city manager. "I don't know why that water is there. There may be the need for some underground drainage

work."

Both Grieshaber and Smith characterized the deficiencies as minor and not an indication of sloppy workmanship by the general contractor Wharton Smith.

"For instance, the type of asphalt we used is suppose to have a very smooth finish," Smith said. "The quality of the finish is hard to maintain as you install it and there are a few places that are a little rough."

"You couldn't ask for a better general contractor," Grieshaber said, noting that there would be no additional cost to the city to

fix the problems. "Wharton Smith has addressed every matter we have brought to them and they want the job done right. This is not an adversarial thing."

Correcting the problems will take some time, Smith said, particularly replacing the concrete curbing.

"Concrete is hard to get and it's very pricey right now because of the fuel prices," Smith said. "Some of the plants are closing on Friday and Saturday because of it."

"I would say we're looking at weeks, but not months."

Park Ave. to be closed for 3 days

Park Avenue will be closed from Monday to Wednesday next week as the asphalt is removed to reveal the existing bricks.

Pavement Savers moved equipment to Park Avenue Thursday to begin removing the asphalt off Park Avenue from Eighth to 10th streets. They will park their equipment on one side of Park Avenue until work is complete.

Work will begin Monday morning and Park Avenue will be closed from Eighth to 10th streets during working hours. The road will be open to traffic at night, over the weekend and at all non-working hours.

This work involves heating the asphalt with radiant heat to over 12 million BTU's to soften it so that it may be removed, this usually takes three passes and requires specialized equipment.

first discussed at the agreement May 6 and pushed the settlement and development agreement forward by holding its first public hearing at a special called meeting Tuesday and a second hearing Thursday evening. According to city officials, the agreement had to be approved this week to avoid an option D.R. Horton has on the Jeno Paulucci property from expiring May 26.

Residents say the lack of time to prepare and look over the agreement left many wondering what had changed from when the D.R. Horton development was first discussed last December.

"The last meeting from Manderley we had four dozen (people show up)," said Rod Pixley, of the Manderley neighborhood association board. "This one we had only five. There wasn't a lot of notice."

In the first meeting with the city, density for The Villages development was capped at 420 units, but D.R. Horton could possibly add 40 more townhouses if they left alone a "peninsula" shaped upland that separates two environmental sensitive areas near Manderley and Timaquan. Proposed building heights were also considered to be about 35 feet near the two neighborhoods, said Shirley Gray, a resident of the Timaquan neighborhood.

Changes to those two stipulations concerned residents as the new agreement allows for building heights up to 50 feet and a dry retention pond to be built on the peninsula. Commissioner George Duryea pointed out that the building height restriction was for the load-bearing wall. With the addition of a pitched roof it could make the townhouses as high as 58 feet.

"We need to remember all of these are fee-simple town homes, which means they are

not going to be multi-level condominiums where you have entrances on every floor," said Commissioner Gary Brender.

But with setbacks of no more than 250 feet to each neighborhood, residents argued the possibility of having five-story buildings towering over their backyards was too much.

"My concern is the balconies because they will be looking over our house," Pixley said.

Lee Rogers of the Lake Mary Planning and Zoning Board said he had a different concern.

"My concerns are more with the traffic," he said. "I'm going to tell you 500 units is going to generate a lot of traffic."

"You got other developments that are coming up and down Rinehart (Road) in the future. It's four lanes now and can hold up to six lanes. I hate to see the day that it comes to six lanes because that's (State Road) 436 all over again."

Rogers said if he had to vote on the agreement as a planning and zoning board member, he would probably approve it, but would make future changes for the sake of preserving Rinehart Road as a four-lane boulevard.

"I know this has to pass tonight, but if it does I think all of us should keep it in the back of our minds that for future developments on Rinehart (Road) we should start by saying 'we want to see a traffic study before we start voting on this,'" he said.

One issue the commissioners and residents did not balk at was opportunity to have another elementary school in Lake Mary. Mayor Thom Greene said he couldn't guarantee inquisitive residents if their children would attend the new elementary school that is probably four to five years away from being built,

but said the new school made the agreement a "win-win situation" for the city and School Board.

"Hopefully, a lot of Lake Mary kids will get to go to this school," he said.

The City Commission voted

4-1 in favor of the agreement with Duryea as the lone dissenter.

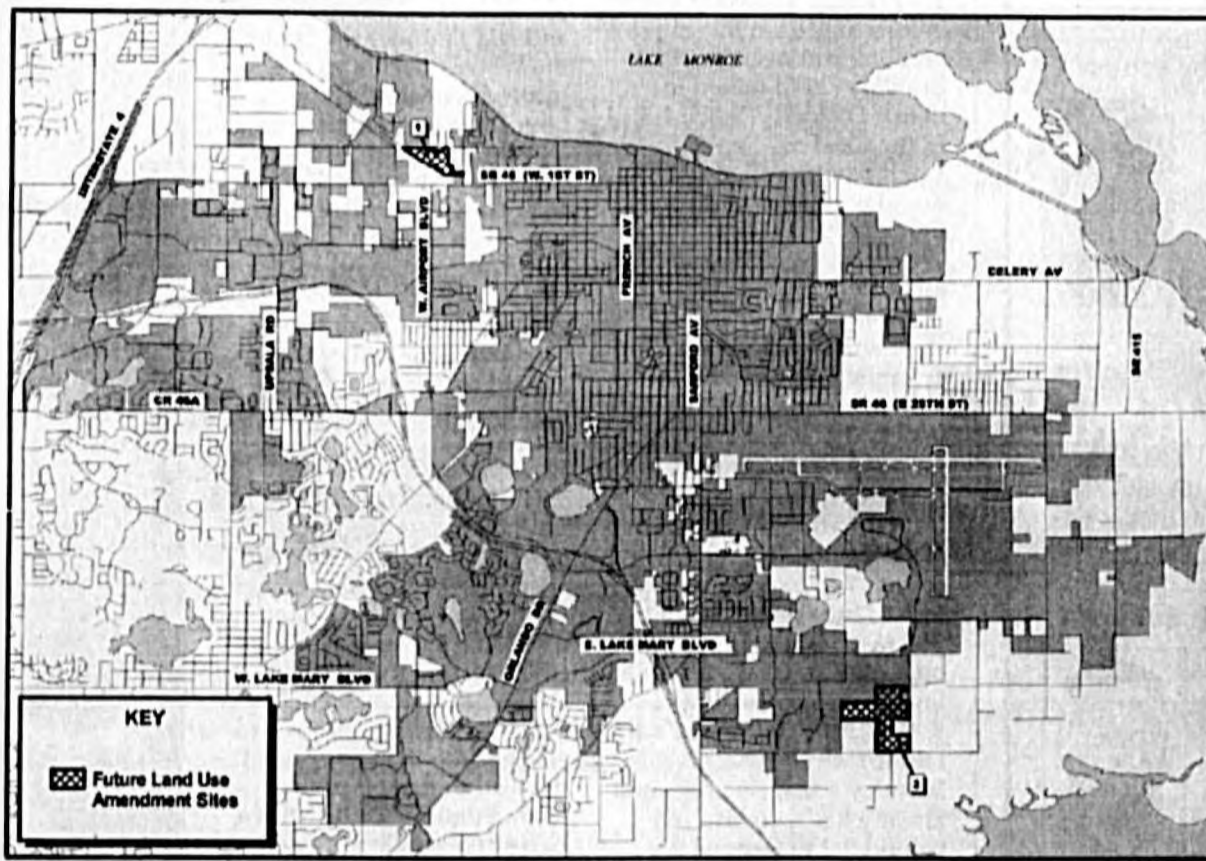
"I have some of the same

concerns as the residents do," he said. "I think the density that exists in this environment is too high."

Former Sanford Babe Ruth star is player to be named later

The Cleveland Indians Wednesday completed the trade of April 4th with the Los Angeles Dodgers, acquiring righthanded pitcher Andrew Brown as the player to be named in the deal that sent outfielder Milton Bradley to the Dodgers in exchange for outfielder Franklin Gutierrez.

Brown, who turned 23 on February 17th, has spent the 2004 season at Class Double-A Jacksonville of the Southern League, compiling a record of 1-3 with

a 4.02 ERA in eight starts (40.1 innings pitched, 36 hits, 18 earned runs, 5 home runs, 14 walks, 58 strike outs). He currently leads the Southern League in strikeouts (58) and is averaging 12.9 strike outs per 9.0 innings pitched so far this year. He fanned 10 in 4.0 innings in his season debut on April 8 (vs. Tennessee) and 13 on April 19 (at Greenville). He has limited Double A hitters to a .235 (36-153) average.

The Deltona resident, who played in the Sanford Babe Ruth League, was originally drafted in the 6th round of the 1999 draft by the Atlanta Braves and was later acquired by Los Angeles Dodgers prior to the 2002 season along with Brian Jordan and Odalis Perez in a trade that sent Gary Sheffield to the Braves.

Brown, who was born in Chardon, Ohio, enjoyed his best minor league season in 2002 at Class A Vero Beach, going 10-10 with a 4.11 ERA in 25

games, 24 of which were starts (127.0 innings pitched, 97 hits, 58 earned runs, 62 bases on balls, 129 strike outs, .215 average against). He was second in the Florida State League in strikeouts (129) and third in lowest average against by a starter (.219). He missed all of 2000 and most of 2003 (one inning pitched) with right elbow injuries. He was placed on the Dodgers' 40-man roster prior to the 2003 season.

Gutierrez is currently hitting .328 (45-for-137) for Double-A Akron with 23 runs scored, 15 doubles, 2 home runs and 16 RBI in 36 games. He is currently tied for third in the Eastern League in doubles and ninth in batting average.

Brown will report to Akron in the coming days and assumes a position on the club's 40-man roster. To clear room for Brown on the roster the Indians have transferred outfielder Ryan Ludwick from the 15-day to the 60-day disabled list.

Weeks wins it

Junior's two-out, two-run single earns Lake Brantley trip to state

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS — Ho hum. Lake Brantley wins again.

What was everyone worried about? In what has become a crazy FHSAA baseball playoff series, everyone should have known that the Patriots would win even though they trailed 3-2, it was the bottom of the seventh, they had two outs and no one on base and their No. 8 hitter at the plate with a no-ball, two-strike count on him.

But it was still gut-wrenching for the huge crowd at Lake Brantley Field.

For the second consecutive game junior shortstop Jemile Weeks singled in the game-winning run as Lake Brantley (22-8) rallied to defeat Deltona (17-12), 4-3, in the Class 6A-Region 1 Championship Game Tuesday night and earn its first trip to the State Tournament since winning it all in 1997.

It was also the Patriots' third straight one-run victory in the regionals, following a 2-1 win over Boone in the quarterfinals and a 6-5, nine-inning defeat of Oviedo in the semifinals.

After Lammur Guy was called out on a tough full-count pitch to open the bottom of the seventh inning and Jason Bush was retired on a nice running catch of a line drive in rightcenter by Ricky Littles, Jeff Dietz, who had driven in Lake Brantley's first two runs and already had two hits, fell behind 0-2 to Deltona ace Nick Pugliese (9-3), Wolves fans just knew their team was going to make a trip to Tampa for the second straight year. Deltona had made the Class 5A Final 4 in 2003.

But Dietz refused to give in and hit a high fastball back over the mound that

the Wolves shortstop knocked down but could not quite make a play on.

Designated hitter Ryan Polte then drew a walk on five pitches, sending courtesy runner Denny Pregno to second.

That brought to the plate leadoff man Weeks, who had hit a two-run home run and drove in the game-winner against Oviedo last Friday. The lefty swinger fouled off a couple of pitches and worked the count to 3-2, giving Pregno and pinch-runner Ryan Kelley a running start.

Weeks then hit a liner over short and into the gap, easily scoring Pregno with the tying run, but with the head start from first, Kelley was also able to come around and slid in under the tag by the Wolves catcher as the throw from leftcenter bounced a little high.

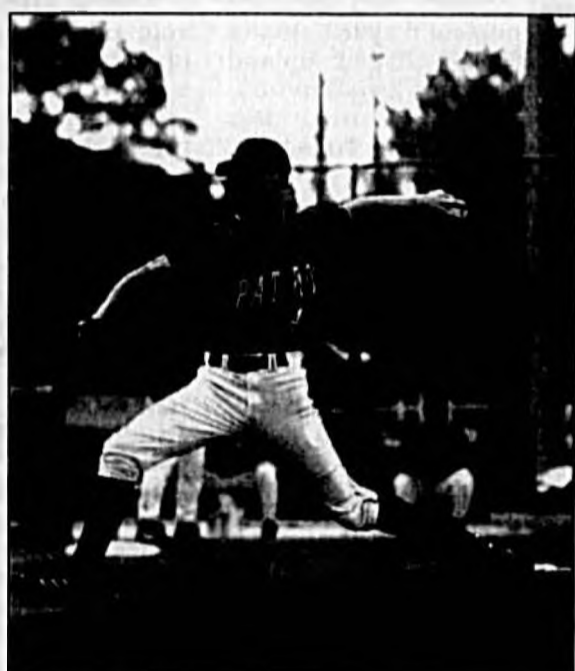
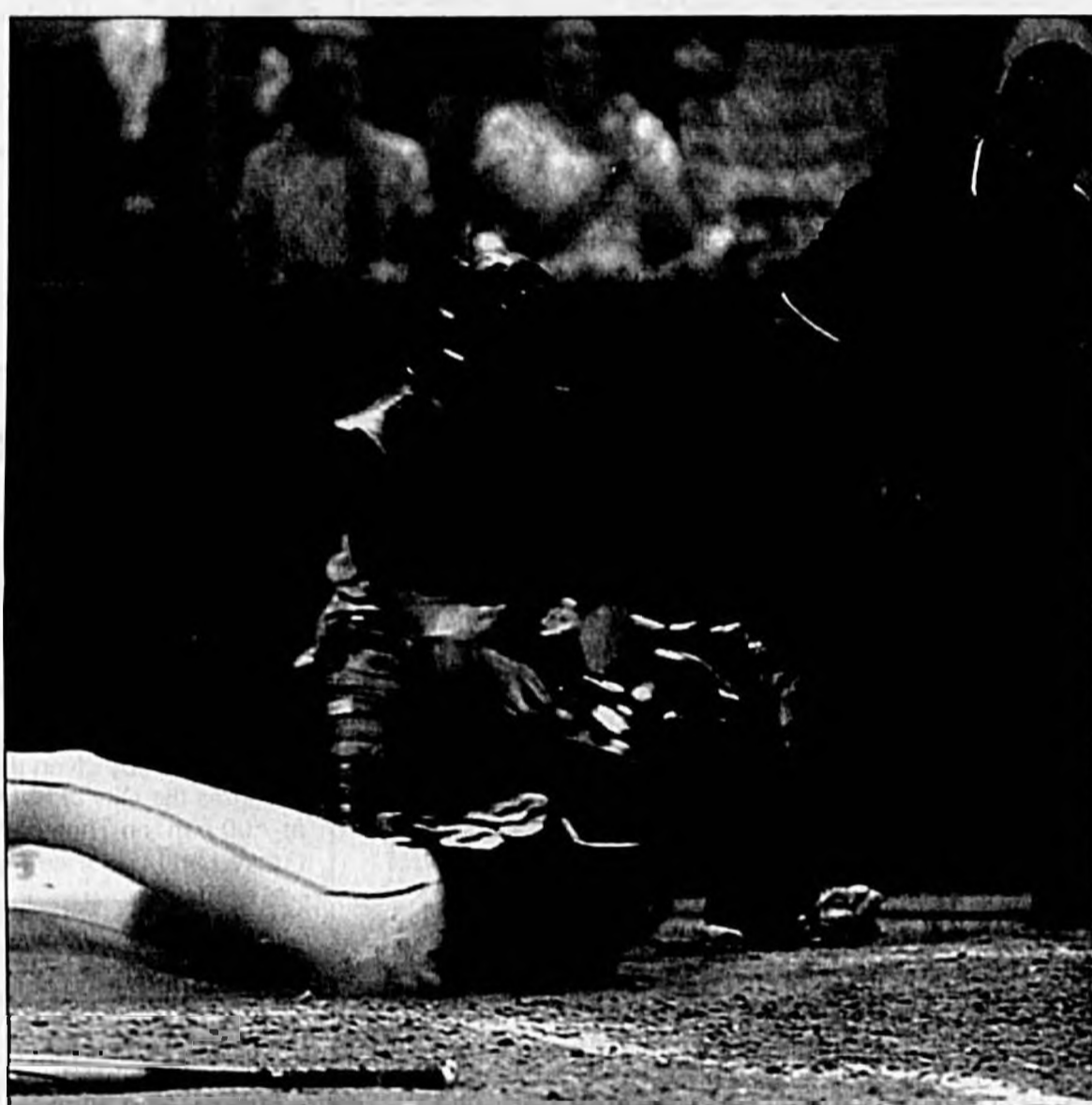
Deltona had jumped on Patriots starter Matt Dobbins for a run in the top of the first when Pugliese's single scored Terrance Littles.

But Lake Brantley answered back with two runs in the bottom of the second on a single by Brett Smith, a bunt single by Guy, a sacrifice by Bush and a two-run by Dietz.

The game remained 2-1 until the top of the fifth when Ricky Littles' liner to center was misjudged and bounced off the outfielder's glove and the speedy Littles raced around the bases to tie the game on a four-base error.

The visitors then regained the lead in the top of the sixth. Pugliese led off with a two-strike single to center and courtesy runner Anthony Francis moved up when Lenny Gabella was hit with a 1-2 pitch. Wesley Gawriluk was also hit by a pitch to load the bases and Frank Cesario fouled with a flair over the drawn-in infield behind short to score

BOY ATTACKED BY ALLIGATOR

A 12-year-old boy was injured by an alligator that attacked him while he was swimming in a Deltona lake Wednesday afternoon. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) Division of Law Enforcement is investigating the attack.

According to Investigator Steve Grigg, Malcolm James Locke, 12, of 96th Avenue Road, Summerfield had gone into Lake Diana in the area of 3640 Lake Diana Drive to cool off after helping his grandmother with some work around the house. While he was swimming he noticed a 4-to 6-foot alligator swimming toward him. As Locke attempted to swim back to the shore, the alligator grabbed him around the head and pulled him under. Locke fought the alligator off and swam to shore unassisted.

A neighbor transported Locke to Florida Hospital in Orange City where he was being treated for non life-threatening cuts and lacerations Wednesday afternoon.

According to Grigg, Locke weighs about 120 pounds and is about 5' 4" inches tall. He was swimming in water that was three to four feet deep when the alligator attacked him.

Alligators six feet or longer are the ones most likely to attack humans. Once attacked, the best thing the victim can do is to fight the alligator - to create as much noise and confusion as possible. Usually the alligator will realize it has made a mistake by attacking a large animal it cannot overpower easily, and it will turn loose and flee.

"This appears to be what happened in this case," said Joy Hill, Public Information

Coordinator for the FWC. "Malcolm did the right thing. He fought the alligator and it let him go."

Normally, a wild alligator under six feet long would avoid someone Malcolm's size - instead of approaching him - unless it had lost its fear of humans. Alligators can be fierce fighters, but they prefer prey that they can overpower easily. The size of the alligator and the size of the prey are the primary factors that determine whether the reptile will attack.

"Alligators are naturally afraid of people, but can lose their fear if they're fed," said Hill. "By tossing food scraps to alligators, people actually teach the reptiles to associate people with food. For that reason, it is illegal to feed wild alligators and crocodiles in Florida."

The FWC has sent a nuisance alligator trapper to trap and remove the alligator from the lake. Prior to this attack the FWC had not received any nuisance alligator complaints from Lake Diana.

Alligators seldom attack humans, and fatalities from such attacks are extremely rare. However, confrontations of various types between the human and alligator populations are increasing. The influx of hundreds of new residents each day results in wildlife habitat loss. As alligators are crowded out of their natural habitat, they become more likely to wander into residential and commercial districts in search of food and nesting space.

The FWC has documented 333 alligator attacks throughout the state (including this one) since it began keeping records in 1948. This is the second attack documented so far this year. Of those attacks, 13 have been fatal. The most recent fatality was Brian Griffin, 12, who was attacked by a 10'4" alligator last June 18 while swimming near a boat ramp in the Dead River in Lake County.

You can take this risk for yourself, your boating guests and family, or you can leave the alcohol at home or corked until you are safely tied up for the night. You can make the right choice.

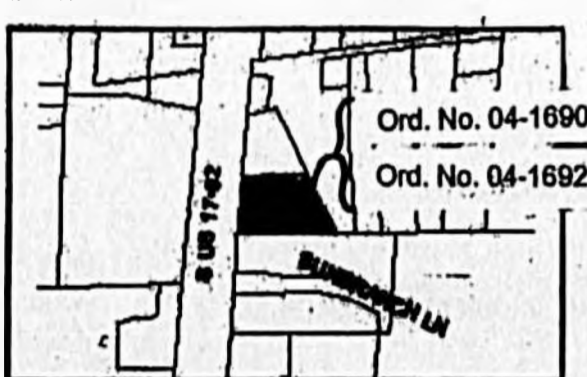

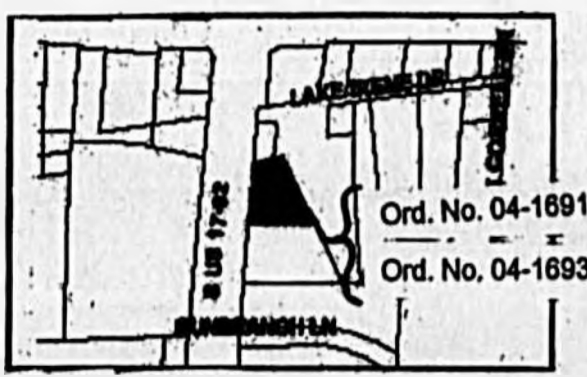

When James Trainor, 48, of Orlando went Tuesday to rob his second Seminole County bank in less than week, he didn't expect the quick work of a Good Samaritan would foil his crime spree.

Seminole County Sheriff's Office deputies responded at about 9:20 a.m. to a bank robbery at the CNL Bank, 1200 S. International Parkway, in unin-

corporated Lake Mary. Trainor had already slipped away, but he couldn't evade Justice — Longwood resident Steven Justice that is.

Shortly after the bank robbery, a deputy approached a blue Jeep Cherokee similar to the one used as a get-a-way vehicle described by witnesses at a Lake Mary bank robbery last Thursday at the First National Bank of Central Florida at 1511 International Parkway, located near the

intersection of County Road 46A.

"Lake Mary (police) provided some very timely information," said Steve Olson, Seminole County Sheriff's Office spokesman.

According to sheriff's office authorities, when Lake Mary police heard the robbery call being dispatched they provided deputies a description of the vehicle and suspect from the

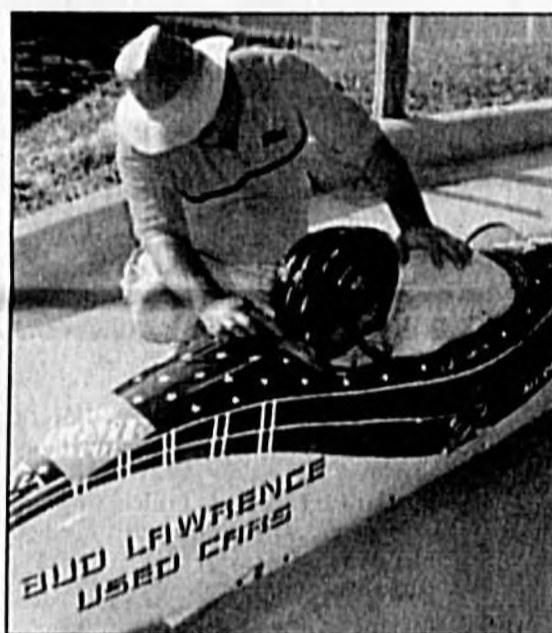
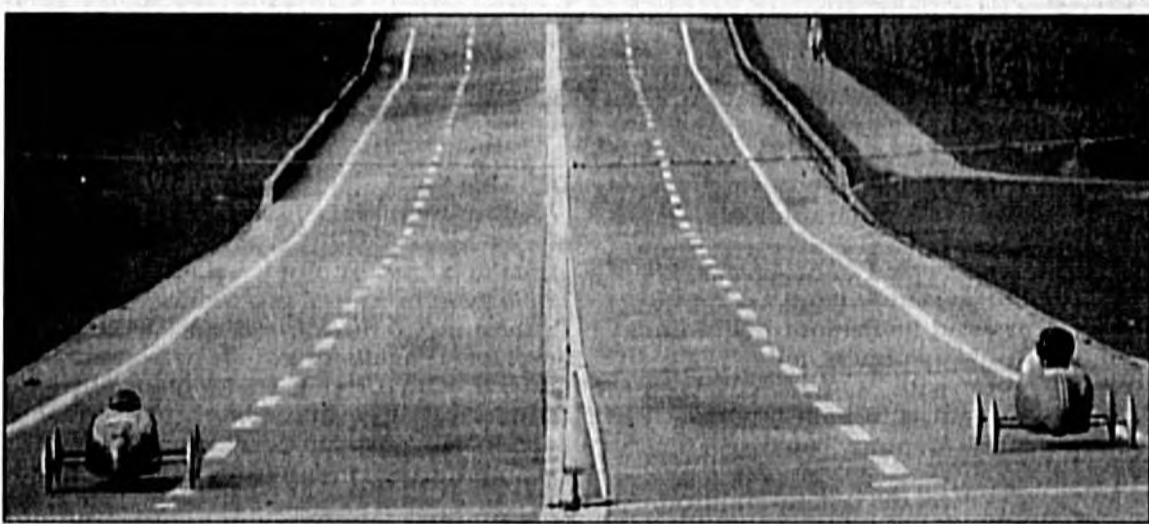

Mica pushes S.R. 417 project

LAKE MARY — A federally subsidized transportation project could make it easier for International Parkway executives to make their way to the east side of Seminole County.

Congressman John Mica (7th District-R) is championing \$5 million in federal assistance for a fourth leg of the GreeneWay (State Road 417). Although the extension would be less than a mile long, Lake Mary Commissioner Gary Brender said the project is key to the developing corridor.

The "Missing Link" of the state road was completed two years ago with new ramps at both Lake Mary Boulevard and U.S. Highway 17-92 and new interchanges at Interstate 4, Rinehart Road and County Road 46A. The \$265 million link was built to ease traffic woes on Interstate 4, but Brender said one more interchange could further reduce congestion on Rinehart Road.

"I think we are really getting ahead of the traffic needs by

Fernando and 15 other students graduated from the Take Stock program May 6 at Lyman High School. Each received a
