

COOLIDGE FAMILY TREE IS TRACED TO CHARLEMAGNE

Genealogy Of Former President Had Illustrious Beginning

NEW YORK, Jan. 13.—The lineage of the Coolidge family, has been traced to Charlemagne in the book, "Your Family Tree", by David Starr Jordan and Sarah Louise Kimball, published by D. Appleton & Co. in 1923.

John Putnam, baptised at Wingrave, Bucks, 17th of January, 1573-25, who came from Ashton Abbots, Bucks (where his child. en were baptised 1612-27), to New England and d. at Salem, Mass., 29th December, 1662. Another Mandamus Served In Melbourne

MELBOURNE, Jan. 12.—Papers in another mandamus suit, the third of its kind since Nov. 1, were served upon city officials Wednesday afternoon.

It seeks to compel the city to pay a total of \$640 covering amounts claimed to be past due in 22 bond coupons. The suit points out that the city has collected and now holds the money for payment of these coupons and requires the city to show cause on Jan. 16 why a peremptory writ shall not be issued against it.
