# Lake Mary again pursues Paradise Park project

New proposal calls for a 'preserve' rather than a 'park'

LAKE MARY — City officials are once again considering a public green area on a parcel of land adjacent to Big Lake Mary.

The city is submitting a proposal to the Florida Communities Trust's Preservation 2000 Program for a 5-acre piece of property located on the southside of Lake Mary Boulevard. The proposal includes creating the Lake Mary intrusive boardwalk, picnic tables and an experimental yard area.

The experimental yard area, a new concept for park systems in Florida, will be used to demonstrate alternatives on caring for yards and landscapes, Lake Mary Mayor David Mealor said. The preserve will only allow for visual access to Big Lake Mary, and the boardwalk will be constructed next to, but not over,

Three months ago, Commission voted to halt plans for Paradise Park, a green space on the same parcel of land now being considered for the preserve, following weeks of debate from residents. Opponents of the park were. concerned about their privacy, possible public lake access and what could happen if

# Porter house is auctioned

SANFORD — It was a typical bot day in Sanford Saturday, with no rain to mar the event. Karlin Daniel & Associates of Stuart, conducted an auction of the Porter Home, 2118 S. Park Avenue. In addition to the historic four bedroom two and a half bath home plus carriage house, all antiques and furnishings were also put up for

The bidding got underway at 10 a.m. and concluded by 1 p.m.

'It was a very hot day," commented auctioneer Alan Frenkel, "but everything went smoothly." He said there were a total of 15 prospective. buyers bidding on the house. "We required." \$5,000 proof of cash on hand to register bidders," Frenkel explained. Karlin Daniel said there were originally 38 persons investigating the possibility

The sale price was \$201,850, "But with the additional charges involved, the total selling price was approximately \$210,000," Frenkel said. Daniel reported the buyer was Royal Heritage Company, Inc., in Orlando. H. Alexander

Broumand, Senior Vice President of the company, did the bidding. Daniel said Broumand indicated Heritage had future plans for the building but did not reveal any details.

In addition to the house, all the furnishings left by the owners were also sold. While Daniel said he could not reveal any exact figure, "It was over-\$10,000," he said, "much more than we had anticipated.

The house was originally built in 1923 with the carriage house added in 1926. It was designed by prominent Central Florida architect, Elton J. Moughton, Sr. The structures are located on two city lots, with the major home, on a number of occasions, featured as one of the homes in the Sanford Parade of Homes tour.

Historically, the home has been one of the city's gems. The original cost of construction was reported at \$50,000. It was one of the first houses in the city with a telephone, equipped in 1927. A great deal of the house is original, including extra-large windows with hand-pressed glass, beveled glass in French doors, cut-glass doorknobs, chandeliers and other fixtures

Paul and Jone owned the hone, and it is one of the few in Sanford with a basement.

# D-Day kids — we were right on target that day

On June 6, 1944 my cousin Ed and I did what we could to help the Allied Invasion. Ed was 6, I was 4. Together

dropped bombs (darts) on German strongholds on a World War II battlefield board.

Carefully, we flew over the target with our bombs loaded in a

military aircraft that was actually a tissue box with a rearview mirror. We took each mission seriously, especially our D-Day bombing assignments.

Not far away from where we played our war game, President Franklin D. Roosevelt held a mid-after poon press conference with nearly 200 reporters crammed into the executive office at the White House. He was at his deak in shirtsleeves, wearing a dark bow tie. He smoked a cigarette stuck into a yellow amber holder.

"The invasion is up to schedule," the president said. Roosevelt said the early reports from General Dwight D Eisenhower indicated that two destroyers and at least one LST had been sunk and

that losses among fliers were

less than one percent. Ed and I were having success, also. We had destroyed a number of German strongholds but had had to take responsibility, also, for bombing a church and coming close to hitting a Red Cross

facility. [13] turns throwing hand grenades (bean bags) at handsome cutouts of Hitler, Tojo and Mussolini. We had some Navy signal flags and military model planes, too.

There was no TV in those days - only radio, Being 4, 1. couldn't appreciate the significance of D-Day. I do recall the black curtains that were pulled down each night in the Washington area. Wewould pray for our military men and that the enemy not reach our shores.

From what I later learned, spring 1944 was a bustling. time for many people. Broadway, for instance, enjoyed a smash spring season, Oklahomal by Richard, Rodgers and Oscar Ma nimerately was the top hit. Othello with Paul Robeson and The Ziegfeld Follies with Milton Berle produced sellouts, also

However, on June 6, 1944. Broadway shut down. The actors went to the Stage Door Canteen to perform for servicemen. Stores shut down. Macy's closed at noon, Still, there were large crows around it because the store set up a loudspeaker that carried radio programs:

The New York Daily News threw out its lead articles

and printed in their place the Lord's Prayer. The New York Daily Mirror eliminated its advertising to have room for news of the invasion.

.When an announcer read a Mispatth that warned Residence, against repoting, a reporter for the New York Times wrote, "The faces of those who stood listening were grim and subdued.

In another nine years, my cousin Ed enlisted in the Navy and 13 years after D-Day it was my turn to join. After we were both through with our Navy tours, Ed and I frequently reminisced about our childhood war efforts. Freedom fighters in short pants. D-Day kids.



LONGWOOD — A request by Longwood City Commissioner Butch Bundy that the city honor a resolution it passed two years ago literally hit a brick in the road Monday night.

Bundy asked fellow commissioners to support an expenditure of about \$150 for the engraving of bricks with the names of Founder's Day Committee members to be installed on streets in Longwood's Historic District. His request to implement the two-year old resolution was defeated by a vote of 4-1. The remainder of the commission felt if the city were to recognize some volunteer board members while neglecting others it could become problematic.

Bundy was attempting to formally recognize the contributions and funds raised by members of the Founder's Day Committee, abolished by the commission earlier this year, for their contributions to the Historic District.

"In making this request, I'm simply asking that city staff carry out what was approved

ago," said Bundy.

The bricks have already been purchased and the installation will be at no charge. because I'll do it," said Bundy, who owns and operates United Tile and Marble in Longwood.

This is a small price to pay and it encourages people to get involved in our volunteer boards," Bundy said, "We need to say thank you."

Commissioner Steve Miller said he felt resurrecting the resolution was a nice idea, but didn't address fair treatment for other Longwood volunteer board members

"In this case, I don't see a public purpose connected with the expenditure," said Miller. "Are we going to do this for all other board members? The bricks should be used to raise money for the Historic District, not for glorifying anyone."

Commissioner John Maingot agreed, casting one of the four negative votes against Bundy's

"We can't do it for one group of volunteer board members and not for others," said Maingot, "It's not the dollars, it's the principle of the matter. We have seven other volunteer

boards in the city that all do good service for Longwood."

"The public purpose is that these volunteers put in a lot of hard work and effort and deserve the recognition," countered Bundy.

Mayor Paul Lovestrand tried to tie some historical perspective to the defeated motion.

I've seen this issue come full circle," said Lovestrand. "At one time in Longwood there was consideration of paying board members. Then we had a controversy about board members ordering pizza at the city's expense because they felt they deserved it. We can't do for one committee and not do for another. It opens up a l'andora's

We should stick with the system of what we are already doing," he said.

Through May, there have been 391 auto thefts reported in Seminole County this year, more than double the 166 auto thefts over the same period last

The increase could be exaggerated, because about 50 cases may have been reported twice by different law enforcement agencies. The final tally for the number of auto thefts so far this year is not yet available.

Meanwhile, law enforcement agencies are cracking down on auto theft. So far this year, 144 people have been arrested in Seminole County for grand theft auto. This represents a 40 percent increase over the same period last year. North Seminole County has

the highest number of autothefts, with Sanford leading the pack. Unincorporated Seminole County ranks second Altamonte Springs ranks third in the county in auto thefts, followed by Camelberry Oviedo

and Winter Springs have relatively few auto thefts.

The Senford Police Department is asking city residents to get anti-theft devices for their cars because of an increase in auto thefts. Chrysler models have been especially popular with car thirves.

The Seminole and Brevard County sheriff's offices formed a joint City-County Auto Theft Task Force five years ago, and over the last two years the task force shifted its primary focus from raining awareness to crime enforcement. Similar auto theft task forces are active statewide.

In Bervard and Seminole countries, the number of auto thefts increased by only two over the last year, from 2,714 in 1998 to 2,716 in 1999. The number of auto thefts in Seminole County increased by only 1.8 percent, from 1,457 in 1998 to 1,464 in 1999

The number of people arrest ed in 1999 for grand theft auto in Seminole County increased 22 percent over the previous year, to 251



### Officer offers motorists suggestions on what to do if pulled over by police

DEAR ABBY: I'd like to respond to the recent letter from the woman with three

college age children. all of whom drive She said she was concerned about their responses should they get pulled over by police

As a police officer for 15 years, I recommend the following guidelines for any one who is pulled

over by the police: (1) Shut off the engine and remain inside your car. unless the officer

requests that you exit. (2) Have your license, registration and insurance card in a convenient location so they are easily accessible. Fumbling around inside your car for "lost or missing" paperwork should be kept to a nunimum

(3) Keep your hands on the steering wheel and avoid making moves that could be interpreted as sudden or threaten-

(4) In the event other paysengers are riding with you, ask them to refrain from making comments.

(5) If the stop is at night and it's possible, pull over in a well-lighted area. Remember, we are humans, and we get nervous, too!

(6) Turn on the interior light and keep it on in order for the officer to see inside your car. It shows that you are concerned for your safety as well as ours.

(7) Do not argue with the officer. If you are treated unfairly, get the officer's name and badge number. You can follow up by notifying the officer's superior and filing a complaint against him or her.



the use of the park in the future. However, Mealor said opponents and proponents of Paradise Park approached city officials after the vote and asked them to reconsider a green area for the property.

"Initially, people based their opposition on what was in the application," Lake Mayor City Manager John Litton said. "The amenities included in the application caused some intrusion on their privacy.

The grant was funded on what was in the application and there was reason for concern," he said. "This time around, the application includes a whole different

Deleted from the initial proposal are tennis courts, restroom facilities and a designated picnic area, Litton said. Picnic tables will be scattered within the preserve, and there will be an enhanced buffer area of trees to ensure privacy for the surrounding property

The preserve will give people a place to walk and a place to get back to nature," Litton said

Also included in the proposal is a "reverter clause" which guarantees the preserve will remain the same in the future or it will revert back to its original use, Litton said.

The city is submitting the application for \$800,000 to fund the preserve during the new funding cycle of the Preservation 2000 Grant

Program, which deadline is this Friday. And, Litton believes the city has a good chance to receive funding for the project.

It depends on who submits an application and how much funding is available," he said. "Our application meets the intent of the program requirements."

Grants awarded through the program are commonly used to acquire land for natural resource conservation, outdoor recreation and urban green space.

The city's application, which is being submitted at no cost to the city, is contingent on one very important thing - public input.

"Commission wanted to gather public input before the application was submitted, but there was no way to get it before the deadline," Litton said. "I think this application gives the residents a higher level of confidence that the area will remain passive. However, if they decide they want residential development, the opportunity is still there."

Litton said a special-called meeting may be scheduled in June for the public to ask questions and voice concerns or comments about the proposal.

A quick second shot locked him to the ground.

"I have traveled across the Midwest in pursuit of monster white-tails," Stovall said. "And I ended up finding one about 19 miles from my home."
