Roads Sealed As Battle Dies Down In Lebanon

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) — Christian militancy in the coastal suburb of Ain Hawana today sealed off all major access roads to the metropolitan area with concrete barricades but fighting in the region died down.

Witnesses said only scattered shooting broke out overnight and by mid-morning even died down.

Christian militancy reported 19 people wounded in fighting Thursday between Christians and troops of the Syrian-dominated Arab Revolutionary Front. Police and hospital sources placed the casualty toll above Sunday at 25 dead and more than 300 wounded.

Haig Raps Neutron Bomb Row

CASTEAU, Belgium (UPI) — Gen. Alexander Haig, commander of NATO forces in Europe, warned that any quarrel between the United States and Europe over President Carter's freeze on the nuclear launch would split the heads of the Soviets in their attempt to divide the alliance.

In an exclusive interview, Haig said he was concerned that pointing accusing fingers would only draw attention away from the need to build a NATO against the global threat of Soviet imperialism.

Atom Particles Tracked

BOULDER, Colo. (UPI) — Atomic particles spewed toward Earth by the largest solar flare in four years have been tracked into the plane's magnetic field, but scientists say there's been little impact on communications and the Aurora Borealis has been hidden by cloudy weather.

The new Environment Forecast Center earlier this week said the solar flare could disrupt some communications such as ham radio and telephones and produce Northern Lights visible only in the northern hemisphere.

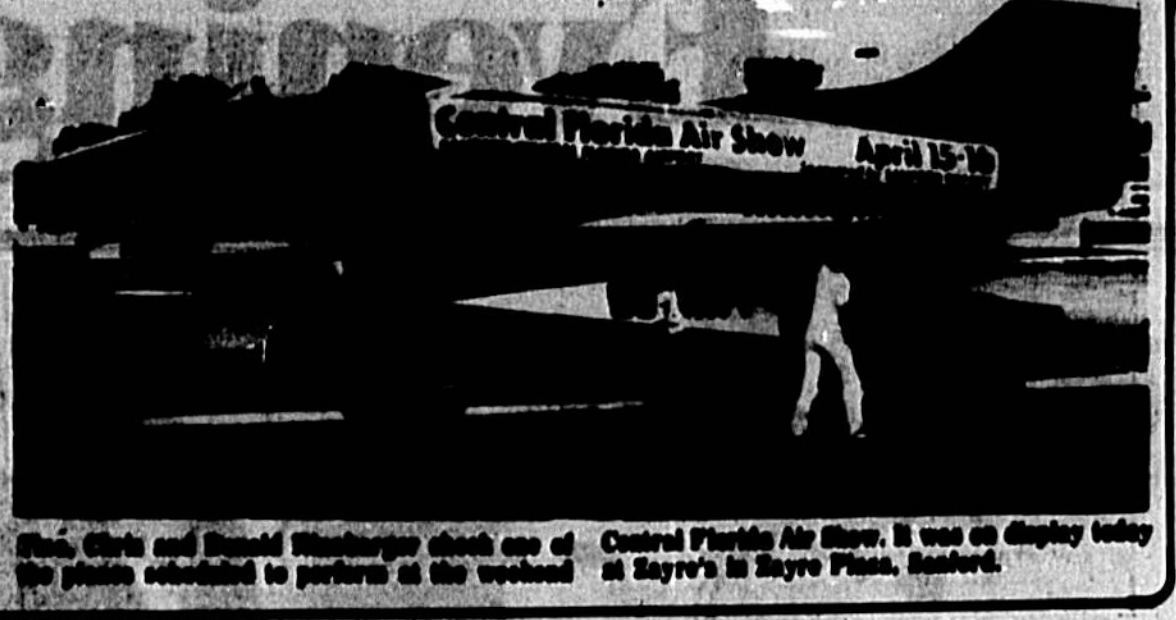

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Most baseball fans have a pitcher they call "the stopper." It's a pitcher in the regular rotation who can stop a hitting streak or pitch with enough authority to make a hitting team frustrated.

There's an actor in Hollywood who has the same sort of reputation in movies. His name is George Wynn. Most people probably pay him \$2,000 a day to play small but key roles that help the movie in its final, crucial moments.

Wynn is building, while he's in Hollywood, a reputation as a character actor who can play anything from a mad scientist to a groupie and everything in between. His current movie is "Frenchie," the 1976 film in a career that covers 40 years. At 40 Wynn is well aware of his deeper reputation. He calls himself a craftsman.

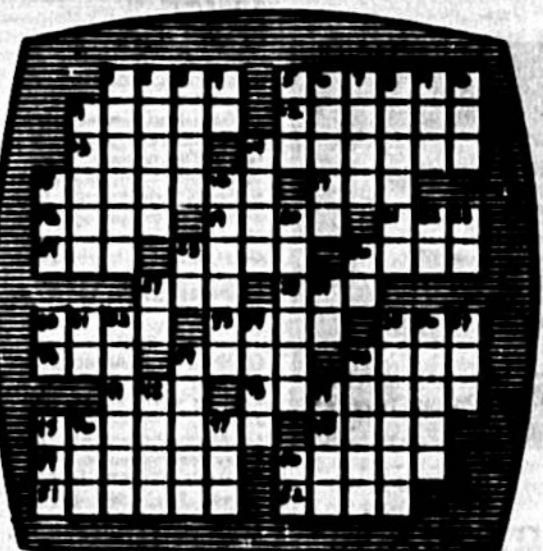
"It's a life-changing experience," he said. "When a producer or a director needs help in a pivotal role that's small but vital, they say, 'Get Wynn, he'll figure out something.'"

"They want something strong from me that they can't get from any other actor," he said. "They're willing to pay \$2,000 a day for that. And that is very well, but it means the question on Wynn play a long part? Well, I've played long roles, too, but not as long as you're asking."

The producers of "The Stopper" are youngsters. They're the kind of people who are usually scheduled for next month. "I read the script, and I said Wynn is the best for four hours work one afternoon."

"One I take a man's money I do the very best I can. Most directors know what they want and know me. But if they tell me I'm too heavy, or too light, I make the change."

Wynn says he's been a character actor for 40 years. He's been in everything from "The Godfather" to "The Untouchables." He's played everything from a mad scientist to a groupie.
