There's Help For Vertigo

DEAR DR. LAMB: I am 75 female in reasonably good health. My problem is vertigo, with accompanying nausea. I have been bothered with this for a couple of years, but as time goes on it becomes more severe.

This week I attended a seminar where suddenly the vertigo hit me; I was on my feet at the time. I staggered to the back of the room to a table, the room and everyone reading around me. After a little while I was helped to another room where I could lie down. Then the nausea started. An ambulance took me to the hospital. The nurse who I stayed in the emergency room. My doctor was with me, prescribed three different kinds of shots, one a prescription. It took a half hour to take effect.

I asked my doctor if there was anything I could take when one of these attacks hit me. He said there wasn't as the only thing they knew about it was that the inner ear swelled, causing poor circulation which caused the dizziness. I know of others who got these attacks as I am not alone.

I have been advised to cut back on my salt, which I have done. Do you know of anything that would be of help? I cannot tolerate most of the tranquilizers or Dramamine.

DEAR READER: You described vertigo correctly. True vertigo as opposed to simple dizziness is accompanied with the sensation of being in motion, or the illusion of things around you being in motion, as happened with the attack you described.

Your sense of position and balance are dependent upon what is happening inside the brain and its ability to integrate information from these body

At Seminole Memorial Hospital County \$\$\$ Sought For Indigent Birth Expense

Seminole Memorial Hospital has lost more than \$68,000 since November if it can't collect its birth expenses from indigent mothers, the hospital's administrator said.

Now the hospital is going to ask the county commission to help defray these costs, but the county's director of human services says he'll recommend the county not go along with the request.

The hospital's trouble began, according to hospital officials, when the county health department last April issued an order prohibiting indigent mothers from receiving care at the hospital's delivery room.

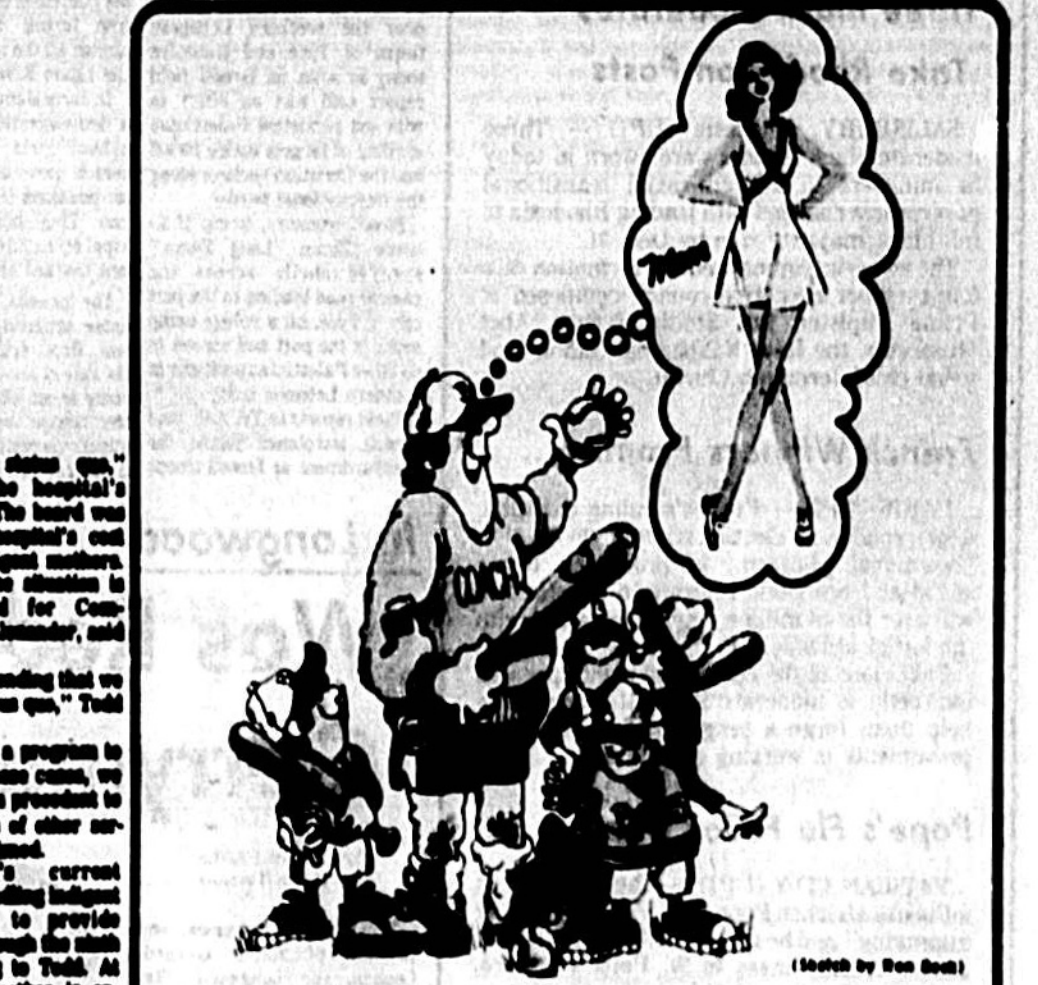
