-Vihlen Cleared; Mail Probe Pursued-

State Attorney Abbott Herring said Tuesday he is forwarding his investigation file to the Pinellas County state attorney's office for further investigation after he announced that charges against a Seminole County commissioner of using county postage and mailing supplies in a congressional campaign are "unfounded." Herring's office spent four days investigating a complaint filed by George Saunders, campaign manager-

husband of JoAnn Saunders, unannounced Democratic candidate for Florida's fifth congressional district, against an opponent in the party race for the nomination, Sid Vihlen Jr. Saunders said Vihlen had used a county envelope, the county postage meter and a county-paid secretary for campaign purposes.

Saunders in the complaint to Herring's office said campaign literature had been received by a Saunders postage-metered stamped county envelope. He said the documents were turned over to him for appropriate action and he forwarded them to Herring. Vihlen's immediate response last week was that it

was "a frame job" by the JoAnn Saunders campaign. Herring, after receiving sworn testimony of the incident from Akers, the Saunders, Vihlen, a Sanford printer and various county personnel, said Tuesday, "Our investigation exonerates Vihlen of the accusations." He said the investigation establishes that the material alleged to have been mailed in the (Jan. 29) postage





Mail Service Answers Due

When Postmaster Benjamin F. Bailar took to the hustings to campaign for his projected belt tightening the U.S. Postal Service, he also was serving notice that he intends to bring the crisis in U.S. mail delivery home to roost this year.

Among Mr. Bailar's suggestions have been proposals to reduce mail deliveries to as few as three a week, end door to door delivery of letters, relax the promptness of deliveries, end special deliveries and reduce manpower substantially.

The postmaster already has aroused a storm in rural America and in Congress by closing 186 remote post offices to save some \$2 million a year The storm will be remembered as a mere tempesi if he continues to forge ahead with his program. There is no doubt that Americans consider efficient mail delivery as a national birthright - the first article of the Constitution authorizes Congress to establish post offices and p. mads And termingling with the enaction response will be nard economic rebuttais. Postal employes in 100 cities across the United States already are organizing to resist the reduction of jobs that Mr. Bailar proposes.

Congress, smarting from its bumbling efforts over the last five years to improve postal operations, is discussing the need for immense subsidies and increased rates, expressing concern for the inefficiencies of the post office and the high mailing rates, acting to keep rural post offices open and sustain the other inefficiencies that Mr. Bailar would eliminate, talking about regaining direct control of the post office operations again, and authorizing private mail deliveries.

For the moment, the Administration is opposing an increase in subsidies in the hope that Mr. Bailar can wring out postal operations. James Lynn, director of the Office of Management and an "edge of efficiency."

No solid consensus appears to be emerging from all of this confusion and cross purposes in Washington, perhaps because nobody is really willing to champion what is probably obvious to all. When the nature of the staggering increase in postal costs since 1973, and the sagging use of mails is analyzed, the inescapable conclusion is that the post office will never again become self-sufficient

There is no way that streamlining the operations or raising the price of stamps can bring in enough money to pay for deficits that are estimated at \$1.4 billion this year and will be something on the order of \$2.5 billion for each of the next three years. For example, the \$2 million saved by closing rural post offices compares to an HOURLY payroll of \$14.2 million!







A government communique said Owens-Illinois of Toledo, Ohio, violated the law by paying for publication of the kidnapers' statement Tuesday in The New York Times, The Times of London and Le Monde, in Paris. The government said it would pay the American company "fair" indemnities for its properties.

Socialists Threaten Regime

ROME (AP) - Socialist party leader Francesco de Martino is threatening to bring down Premier Aldo Moro's minority Christian Democratic government and force Italy into a general election unless Moro agrees to more liberal provisions in the proposed abortion law. After a meeting Tuesday night with Moro, De Martino said they were still far apart, but he indicated further attempts would be made to reach agreement. The Socialist leader also planned to meet today with Communist chief Enrico Berlinguer.

Village Ownership Changes

QUEBEC (AP) - The Olympic installations board gained ownership of the Olympic Village Tuesday under legislation in the national assembly. Finance Minister Raymond Garneau said negotiations with the builders of the \$95 million dormitory for Olympic athletes and officials had broken down, leaving the government "no other choice." The building was sup-

posed to have cost \$32 million. Under the bill, the board took possession of the structure immediately upon introduction of the legislation.






