

MELLON'S TAX PLAN SCORED ON ALL SIDES

Borah Says Scheme Is Move To Extend Income Taxes To Lower Scale Of Wages

WASHINGTON, May 28. (AP)—Secretary Mellon's discussion of federal tax remedies drew fire yesterday from Senate Republican Independents and Democrats. Senator Borah, Republican, Idaho, saw in Mellon's radio speech Saturday night a move toward extending the income tax to the lower incomes. He declared this to be "on the same principle as the lowering of wages."

### By Another Station

WASHINGTON, May 24 (AP)—The protest of station WTMJ, Milwaukee, against interference with its broadcasting by the Wisconsin State Board of Broadcasters, was today given a radio broadcast on the station in Wisconsin, Maine, and Florida.

Supported by a court of appeals decision directing the commission to provide some relief for interference with its broadcasting, the Wisconsin State Board of Broadcasters had tried in vain to force the station to stop broadcasting. The court's decision, however, is not final, and the station is still in a state of uncertainty.
