The City Manager delegates duties to Department Heads who carry out instructions relative to specific projects in the varying divisions of city function and operation. 
New Device Tests Pneumatic Tires BUFFALO, N. Y. - - Cor

nell Aeronautical Laboratory has developed a unique test facility for studying pneumatic tire behavior and design. Called a mobile dynamometer.

the device provides accurate road test data under varying conditions. It was developed here under conract with the U.S. Air Force. The dynamometer is attached to the rear of a truck with a test tire suspended from the device and brought into contact with a road surface during regular runs at up to 60 miles an hour. Such factors as load, side-force and angle can be varied while a tire is being tested. Precision instruments automatically measure each performance.

Through its research, CAL hopes o come up with specifications which will result in safer, highperformance tires for airplanes, trucks and automobiles.
