When you read of the Oakland, California, wo other day who gave birth to a fine seven pound boy by means of a Caesarian operation as she lay dying from a bullet wound in her head, you probably thought, unless you know more about surgery than most of us, that this was one of the modern miracles of our highly advanced civilization. Think of it! A baby taken from its mother after she had been shot through the head, only a moment before she died!

But as a matter of fact any physician can tell you that this particular feat is as old as the hills. Julius Caesar is popularly believed to have been born in this manner, and the name by which the operation is known is sometimes erroniously attributed to this belief. As a matter of fact, it was just the other way around. Caesarian operations were practiced by the Greeks a thousand years before Julius Caesar, and persons born in this manner were known as Caesones, and from this came the family name of Caesar,

Pliny, the ancient Roman historian, records that Scipio Africanus, who lived more than two hundred years before Christ, and who more than once saved Rome from conquest by Hannibal and Hasdrubal, was the product of a Caesarian operation, as was also Manlius, another famous Roman general. And hundreds of years before this there was a Greek legend that Apollo rescued his yet unborn son from the body of Coronis as she lay on a funeral pile after she had been killed by Artemis.

In those early days the operation was performed sole-ly for the purpose of saving the baby's life and only after the life of the mother had been abandoned. At one time Numa Pompilius decreed that any pregnant woman who died should be immediately operated upon by her practitioner in an effort to save the baby, and as late as 1749 the King of Sicily had a physician put to death for failing to

operate on a dying woman advanced in pregnancy. As early as the fifteenth century, however, cases were being recorded where the mother survived such operations as well as the infant, though that was long before , anaes thetics or antiseptics. But it has been only instance list forty or fifty years that the operation has been resorted to except as a desperate means of last resort.

Nowadays thousands of women are giving birth children in this manner, and the death rate," for the niota ers as well as the children, where proper conditions tain, is less than five percent.
