

The office of state attorney is one of the most werful and responsible positions in our system of government, for not only is it the prosecutor of all criminal offenses, it is also a watchdog over other public institutions within the circuit.

In this important role, the character motivation and aggressiveness of the state attorney are of nearly equal importance with his legal and administrative abilities. We believe that 39-year-old Democrat Douglas Cheshire scores well in all respects and would give the 18th Circuit (Brevard and

Seminole Counties) the kind of firm and effective prosecutor the people want. The incumbent, Republican Abbott Herring, has served two terms. We think Cheshire's record is a good indication he will keep his promises and Herring's record is more than enough reason to give Cheshire the opportunity.







#### It's Time For Substance

President Ford took the occasion of his news conference Oct. 14 to say what is probably on the minds of a great many Americans. It's time, he said, to get the presidential campaign "onto a level befitting the American people and the American political tradition."

That means talking less about the personal foibles of the candidates, real or imagined, and more about the issues that should be on the minds of voters when they enter the polling booth Nov. 2.

Jimmy Carter's Playboy interview has been done to death, and his views about taxes or unemployment or relations with the Russians are more important than his views about sex. What President Ford has in mind in domestic and foreign policy for the next four years is more important than a list of his golfing partners when he was in

As part of the fourth estate, we have to accept some ressponsibility for the tone of the campaign so far. The Oct. 14 news conference wasn't the finest hour of the White House press corps. Having heard that the special prosecutor had cleared the President of any suspicion in an investigation of political financing in Michigan, the reporters devoted almost half of their questions to that subject and other scuttlebutt issues — even grilling Mr. Ford on how he keeps his checkbook.

The Carter-Ford debates have raised as many questions as they might have answered. What exactly does Carter have in mind in the way of tax reform? What would Mr. Ford propose to do if current "pause" in recovery doesn't end as soon as he expects?

Last spring Mr. Ford said he wanted to stop using the term "detente" to describe our relations with the Communist world and preferred "peace through strength" instead. Carter used the same term in the Oct. 6 debate to describe his policy. Fine, but that's about as meaningful as coming out against sin. How best do we pursue peace with the Soviet Union? How do we guarantee our strength? What position should we take in arms negotiations, in commitments to our allies, and in funding new

weapons programs?

Both candidates are firmly on record for continuing our support of Israel. But what about other aspects of our Middle East policy? How do we handle delicate relations with the Arab nations who are hostile toward Israel and control 40 per cent of the oil we use? And what are the specifics of a Carter or Ford energy policy that would diminish our dangerous dependence on imported oil?

We could fill this column and more with

questions that should be the focal point of campaign dialogue if voters are expected to make an intelligent choice on Nov. 2. There's been enough of image-making, exploring the psyche of the can-didates and raking through the past in search of scandal. Let's get down to the business of discussing what Mr. Ford and Carter would plan to do with the powers of the presidency in the next

Rockefeller, who has been flirting with the presidency itself for two decades, met the test. His appointment by President Ford was an appropriate choice in a time described b Rockefeller as one of "constitutional crisis."

MIAMI (AP) — The federal government, at a cost of \$1.3 million, has added 2,940 acres of coastal wetlands and mangrove islands to the Great White Heron National Wildlife Refuge in the lower Florida Keys.

The purchase, completed Thursday by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, expands the

refuge by more than 30 per cent. The refuge is an important feeding ground for the stately wading birds and is also a wintering home for many other bird species.

The baby's lungs had collapsed, there was an air pocket on his heart, and immediately he was put on oxygen. Shortly thereafter, he was transferred to the reonatal intensive care unit at Jacksonville University

"I just died when I saw him in intensive care," she members. "He had all these needles sticking in hi chest, and wires everywhere, and an oxygen helmet over his face." It was four weeks before she got to hold her haby for the first time.

Mrs. Laubert and her husband, Bill were faced with cospital and doctor bills totaling almost \$10,000 by the time Steven was strong enough to come home. Their medical insurance took care of most of the cost, and they were also helped by the Beta Sigma Phi sorority in Jacksonville, of which Janet was a member.

At six months, Steven had gained five pounds. He was a cheerful, intelligent child but caught cold easily and in January developed pneumonia and was hospitalized in

Sanford, his parents new home. Then on Oct. 10, he returned to Jacksonville University Hospital for a heart catheterisation. His parents haven't received the bill yet, but expect it to be anywhere between \$2,000 and \$5,000. And just as soon as he is strong enough, Steven will have to return for a lung

Some doctors believe he will outgrow the condition; others say he will live with it all his life. Meanwhile, all his parents' medical insurance except for the most basic coverage has been discontinued. Mrs. Laubert has taken a job in an Orlando bank to help meet medical expenses. Her husband works at Palmer Elec-
