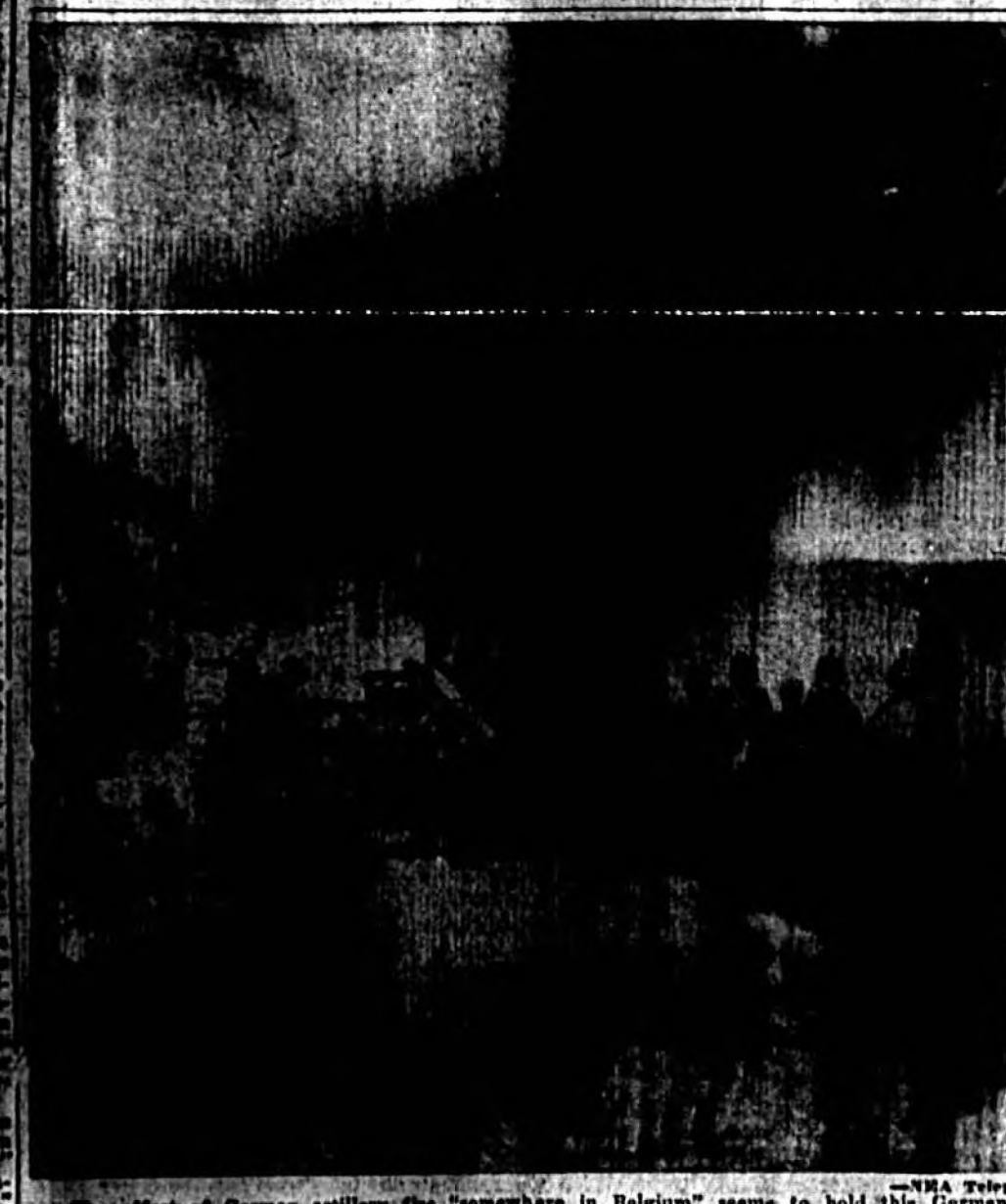

Florida Voters Show Preference For Roosevelt

TALLAHASSEE, May 16.—(AP)—Roosevelt third-termers won 12-12 of Florida's 14 Democratic national convention presidential votes in the recent State-wide primary.

Official returns to the State Canvassing Board here disclosed that Vice President John N. Garner won half a vote, while one vote to be cast by R. A. Henderson, Jr. of Fort Myers, definitely against a third term.

Most of the 100 candidates for the 14 delegate places announced before the primary they favored Roosevelt, but some leaned toward Garner, Secretary of State Cordell Hull, and others, while some did not express their preferences.

Three men and four women delegates from the State at large, who each, however, had some local support, were elected to the State-wide man delegate is for Garner.

In the district races, where one man and one woman from each Congressional district will cast one vote each, Roosevelt supporters won nine of the 10 places, while the tenth went to Henderson whose big vote in his home county, Lee, enabled him to nose out George P. Raney of Tampa, a Roosevelt supporter, 21,233 to 20,286.

Robert H. Anderson of Miami is the elected State-wide delegate who announced he favored Garner for President. Three other men favoring Roosevelt, who won are Sidney J. Catta, Jr. of West Palm Beach, John (Red) Davis of Lake City and George Hoffman of Pensacola. Thirty-one candidates ran.

The vote received by the leaders was Catta 87,644, Davis 70,740, Anderson 67,342 and Hoffman 55,842. John R. Gurtler of Jacksonville, a Roosevelt supporter, was fifth with 48,476 votes.

Women delegates from the State at large, all supporting Roosevelt, with the exception of one, were elected. The elected woman delegate was Mary W. Drane of Miami, with 12,128, and two others ran.

Other district winners, all supporting Roosevelt, with the exception of one, were: Second District (man) Ernest E. Anders of Jacksonville, 18,342, and J. Mahlon McKinney of Cross City, 12,141; (woman) Mrs. Robert H. Hill, Jacksonville, 20,990, and Norma Fitch Kent, Jacksonville, 17,224.

Third (man) John M. Adams of Pensacola, 10,411, and F. M. Turner of Pensacola 6,620; (woman) Miss Kate Inman of Tallahassee, 20,464, and Mrs. O. A. Lund of Pensacola, 11,077.

Fourth (man) Thomas S. Ferguson of Miami, 19,058, and J. J. Parish of Titusville, 10,490; (woman) Louisa W. McGregor of Daytona Beach, 20,194, and Mrs. Cliff P. Hannum, 15,586.

BRITISH MACHINE GUNNERS AWAIT ENEMY

PARIS, May 11.—(AP)—British machine gunners waited in a trench for the German advance on the night of May 10, but the enemy did not appear.

They had been ordered to be ready in the case the French army had been fighting its way through since 5 a. m. of the German blitz drive in northern France. German troops were supposed to be pocketed from 30 to 40 miles deep, extending to within 100 miles southeast of Paris.

By midnight French Germany's lightning mechanized troops have smashed to a point about 100 miles from Paris, the French high command admitted today.

Paris itself was placed under field military control.

Authorized German sources reported that Nazi sledge-hammer blows had splintered Premier Winston Churchill "in a manner even the German optimists believed impossible."

The Germans mean the "Hitler Magnot Line" on the French Belgian frontier.
