It was the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918 when Armistice Day was born. Allied forces halted their drive into Germany, "Doughboys" of the Argonne and "leathernecks' of Belleau Wood stacked their guns and waited.

For this first Veterans Day, in those hopeful days of the young 20th Century, marked what was expected to be the "War To End All Wars." No need to expand on this false dawn.

But now it is 1968, a half-century later. Veterans of all our wars—those who won the Com-bat Infantryman's badge and those who endured the "hurry-up-and-wait" frustrating hours surely have cause to do some wondering on their

own part now. The gigantic struggles on land, sea and air during World War II, the "police action" in Kores which still produces casualties, and the interminable fighting in Vietnam all have left a host of veterans.

The vast majority of these men and women,

whether mustered into the organized ranks of the veteran organizations or cherishing their memories and patriotic convictions deeply and alone know what Veterans Day should mean. So do we. And we would wish that the obscuring overlay of thoughtless disrespect, distortion of the meaning of service in the armed

This is no piec for personal respect for the veteran—although that is his due—but for a re-birth, a re-dedication of all of us to the grand principles of our American Democracy.

Let the honoring of our symbols be evident for all the world to see and know that the American spirit is still bold, brave and dedicated?


