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Where Our Interests Lie

Hitler has not yet won the war in Europe. In fact he is a long way from it. But because he has won the first battle and the frontier has been advanced from the Rhine to the Somme, things are taking place in the United States which would have been unthinkable a few months ago. The advance of Nazi legions only a few miles closer to our shores has brought about a complete revolution in the mental attitude of the American people.

Already, even though the British fleet is still intact, and the French army still stands between us and the Germans, whereas we were talking economy and complaining of rising government debts and high taxation a few months ago, we are now appropriating some five billion dollars for national defense, increasing the debt limit by four billions, levying new taxes of one billion.

This is being done with the almost unanimous approval of the American people. The huge defense bill passed both houses of Congress with only a single dissenting vote.

Not quite so unanimous, but nevertheless indicative of the trend, is the proposal to call out the National Guard, the sale of U. S. Navy bombing planes to the Allies, the movement to dispose of much additional war material in a similar manner.

Yesterday the powerful and conservative New York Times brought forth the recommendation that compulsory military training be resorted to in this country. "The time has come," said the Times, "when in the interest of self-protection, the American people should at once adopt a national system of universal compulsory training." This suggestion, President Roosevelt told reporters, he likes very much.

Not yet proposed but clearly envisioned in the event of further German victories would be the fortification of the Mexican and Canadian borders, the construction along this huge expanse of territory of impregnable "Maginot Lines" at a cost of many billions of dollars, and the development of many additional naval and air bases at strategic points in the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans as well as in the Caribbean Sea.

All these things are being done, or will be done, at a tremendous cost to the American people, not because we have become involved in the war in Europe, not because we are planning to enter the war, but solely to protect ourselves against German aggression in event of the defeat of the Allies. They are being done for the most part with the approval of the isolationists as well as everybody else. The feeling that Germany will attack us when she can is almost universal.

If the French should hold on the "Weygand Line," that feeling would subside. If the Germans were driven back to the Belgian border, away from the Channel ports, that feeling would disappear altogether. The tension that has gripped the American people during the last three weeks would be gone. The billions of dollars which are now being spent for national defense could be saved.

That is why our future is inexorably bound up with that of France and England. Try as hard as we can to isolate ourselves from events abroad, we can no more escape the consequences of this great conflict than could Holland and Belgium. Our national self-interest demands a speedy conclusion of this war and an Allied victory.

"Kissed 187 babies—no charge for this but would never do it again. Tried to kiss the mother in one case—and also will never do this again. Kissed 14 kitchen fires and 18 fires in rural schoolmarm's—say \$52. Put up seven stoves—say \$7.

"Walked 4,067 miles—say \$100 for the shoes leather and wear and tear. Shock hands with 9,446 persons—and wouldn't do it again for a dollar apiece. Told 10,000 lies—no charge for this as I am a liar by profession.

"Attended 17 revival meetings, was converted 14 times and baptized three times by immersion and four times some other way—moderate charge for this would be \$30, at an average rate of \$1 each. Contributed \$75 to foreign missions and 15 cents to home missions—total \$75.15.

"Made love to nine gram widows—charge say \$1 each. Hugged 75 old maids—45 each—total \$1125. Got hit by dog 18 times—charge \$5 as damage to pants and nothing for wounds to myself. Was defeated by two votes because my opponent hugged 80 old maids."

Bottlenecks To Rearmament Are Found Important

 that this kind must go through the Chicago yards.

Take airplanes and transportation. Seventy percent of the industry is on the west coast. All the big engine plants are in the heart of the great American industrial belt, with the neck lying in Chicago, and the bottom roughly bounded by Boston and Baltimore. Engines have to be made by the engine plants in the belt, and shipped to the far west for mounting.

So far, so good. But at the same time, this is going on, the uniform makers are drawing their wool through the Chicago bottleneck too. Packers have to get meat for the workers drawn into the bottle. The ammunition makers are trying to get their shells through to the eastern Arsenal. Steel must shuttle back and forth within the bottle, even move up from Birmingham. And that brings up No. 4 Bottleneck. Raw materials.

Ammunition making is the perfect example of the business that runs smack dab into bottlenecks the day Congress votes the money for it. Take a 75 mm. shell for light-field guns.

The parts of that shell are made all over the map. The government ordinarily makes the cases in the only plant of its kind in the country.

Steel companies get contracts for the projectiles. Spark plug makers get the primer job, and a plant that makes the fuses.

Then your auto wheels from shipwrecking turn out the fuses. Smokeless powder is required. The only such plant in the United States could supply only 10 per cent of the needs of an army of a million men. More plants are necessary.

Nearly every step requires more machine tools from an industry that's working night and day, now. The raw materials for the job have to be pulled through the bottlenecks too. Cotton from down south, ether and alcohol from the midwest, nitric and sul-

ITALY DECLARES WAR ON ALLIES

Fascists March Into France On Riviera

Suffocating Chains Will Be Broken, Mussolini Tells Cheering Fascist Mob

GERMAN BOMBER CRASHES ON RECTORY GROUNDS

ROME, June 10.—(AP)—Italy took the plunge into war today at the side of Germany. Mussolini made the announcement in a bombastic speech from the balcony of the Palazzo Venezia before a wildly cheering crowd of Fascists. Italy's declaration of war, Mussolini said, has been handed to the ambassadors of France and England. The fastest step was made after weeks—even months—of hesitation to yield into actual hostilities the end of the long existing axis between Berlin and Rome. It came as Adolf Hitler's Nazi forces were closing in on France and gravely hastening the fall of Paris.

Before making a definite announcement of this war on the Allies, Mussolini called upon the "combatants on land, sea and in the air, the revolution and the revolution and the revolution of Italy, the revolution of the empire and the kingdom of Albania"—to listen. "I wish to declare," he said, "that Italy does not wish to drag into the conflict other peoples—neighboring and friendly people. The neutrality of these nations will be scrupulously maintained."
