First U. S. Paper Of Free China Is Suspended

Censorship Is Blamed Goes Far Beyond Army Security Curbs

CHUNGKING, June 27.—The weekly Chungking edition of "The Shanghai Evening Post and Mercury," the first American newspaper printed in Free China, ceased publication last Saturday. A statement on the front page of Saturday's first edition said publication of an American paper in the traditions of the original "Shanghai Post" had become clearly impossible in China under war time censorship restrictions which go far beyond consideration of military security.

The statement was signed by C. V. Starr, chairman of the board of Handal, Gould, President and Charles S. Miner, Chungking editor. The Chungking Vice Minister of Information, Hollington K. Tong, declared he was astonished at the announcement that the paper was suspending publication because of Chinese censorship.

"In view of the fact censorship has been steadily liberalized during the period in which 'The Post' has been in existence, I find it hard to understand why 'The Post's' announcement should be couched in such terms," he said.

The plant of the Chungking edition, which issued its first paper Oct. 11, 1943, was in a damp and musty dugout. Miner said type was hand set by Chinese printers who knew no English. The paper was run off on antiquated presses. Newsprint and ink were scarce and expensive. Miner said the censorship investigation centered around political stories and that all his military reports were passed. A statement in the final issue which said the Chinese Communist party's boycott of the forthcoming People's Political Council might indicate a similar minority party boycott of the National Assembly Nov. 12, 1945, was deleted.

Censors killed a statement in which Miner wrote that General Chou Enlai, Communist leader, was being lavishly entertained and that if he did not get back to Yenan from Chungking with a settlement he would at least return with a full stomach. Miner said also that a statement by the Communist general had been killed in its entirety for the local edition, although he had been allowed to cable it in full to New York.

Starr and Gould are in New York where an American edition of "The Shanghai Evening Post and Mercury" is published. Gould announced that Miner would remain in Chungking as an accredited war correspondent representative.

Committee Asks For Utility Tax To Improve City

(Continued From Page One)

The committee appointed by the City Planning Commission and consisting of W. A. Laffler, chairman, W. A. Laffler and S. F. Donday. This committee met last Wednesday afternoon.

The Commission turned over to the committee copies of their budgets for the past few years, together with the current monthly balance sheets, with the request that they give a recommendation to the City Commission in regard to methods of raising money for the continuing and improvement of capital investments.

The following explanation of the City's need for additional

revenue was made by Mayor Edward L. Higgins:

"This condition of the City's finances was brought about principally by homestead exemption. Over the past ten years or since the homestead exemption law has been enacted, the City's loss of operating revenue is over \$100,000 and at the present time amounts to approximately \$35,000 a year, and the City Commission, and the City Planning Commission agree that the utility tax should be placed on all utilities to offset this amount of money and this money should be used for capital investment and improvement."

"In laying this tax the City Commission is endeavoring to place it as far as possible where it will affect homesteads which at the present time are not paying any tax for the operation of the City but only for debt service."

"The City Commission could order an ordinance drawn for this purpose at the Monday night meeting. However, as some necessary information was lacking the meeting was adjourned until later this week and further data will be accumulated and the ordinance read."

"In passing this ordinance the Commission will definitely state the purpose to which this money will be used and will endeavor to set up a three year program with definite objectives."

The Commission took under advisement a request by Volie Williams that a franchise be granted to the Sanford Equipment Company of which he is president, to operate all taxicabs in the city.

rehabilitating of veterans, their claims, hospitalization and care of dependents. At the present time there are 80 field secretaries who travel to contact post and city Legion officers in regard to problems of veterans.

During recent time, a long-stagnated widow's pension has been passed, which means that a veteran may obtain benefit from \$15 to \$74 a month depending on the number of children they have, he declared.

These new hospitals for veterans have been proposed for Florida by the asserted one to be in west Florida, one in Miami and the other in north Florida, north of Jacksonville. This is part of the largest hospital system in the world on which \$200,000,000 has been spent and which totals 82,000 beds. President Truman took a cheering final session of the San Francisco conference last night when the people of the United States were "overwhelmingly" in favor of American participation in the new organization for world peace and said the charter would be presented to the Senate immediately for ratification.

The world must give its wholehearted support to the document drawn up by the United Nations after more than a week, the President said, or betray all those who died so that it might be created.

Mr. Truman came to the fluorescent, brilliantly lighted Opera House after watching the members of the American delegation sign the document which he said was the world's hope for permanent peace to be enforced by military power if necessary.

U.S. Behind Party

The people of the United States, which refused to join the League of Nations after the First World War, and their representatives in the Senate are heartily behind American approval of the charter.

W. L. B. Breaks Its Rule, Grants 11.6% Pay Rise

Award For Ship Workers Is In Interest Of 'Winning War'

WASHINGTON, June 27, (AP)—The National Labor Board broke its three-year-old wage rule this week by granting southern California shipyard repair workers a 11.6 per cent wage increase. It said it did so in the interests of "winning the war in the Pacific."

The WLB carefully specified that the higher wage was to be paid only to the 7,000 workers at Los Angeles and San Pedro yards who actually perform repair work and is not to be applied indiscriminately to other employees.

The pay increase is retroactive to an earlier date, and the workers are represented by shipyard unions of the American Federation of Labor and the Congress of Industrial Organizations.

The board and its shipbuilding commission had previously denied the demand for the wage increase in three successive decisions since it was first raised in 1942.

George W. Taylor, chairman of the WLB, said in a statement explaining the unanimous board action that the dominating consideration was the urgent necessity of seeing that ships are repaired and returned to the war in the Pacific with the maximum of speed and efficiency.

"The payment of some added wage for ship repair work is essential throughout the industry, though the amount varies. The amount provided in this case was to conform with that paid in the northern Pacific area. In balancing conflicting claims, the board evolved a solution which reserves equity of all parties, prevents abuses and provides a basis for getting on with the war production program in the Pacific."

The WLB decision followed a public hearing last Wednesday which Senator Wayne L. Morse, Republican of Oregon, and representatives R. J. Welch, Republican of California, and Frank Hasenauer, Democrat of California, urged the wage in-

crease to speed the war against Japan and eliminate discrimination.

Senator Morse charged that the government procurement services were discriminating against San Francisco, Portland and Seattle by sending a disproportionate amount of ship repair work to the Los Angeles area so that they would not have to pay the 11.6 per cent differential prevailing in the northern Pacific ports.

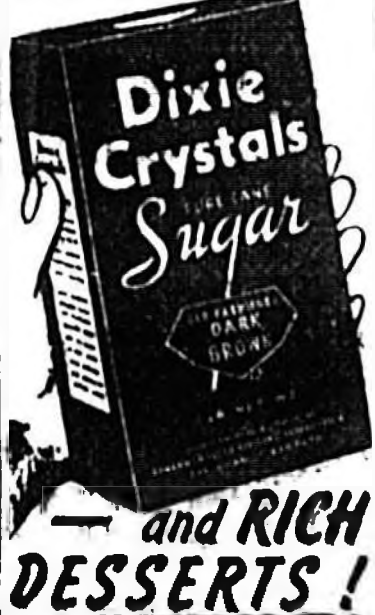

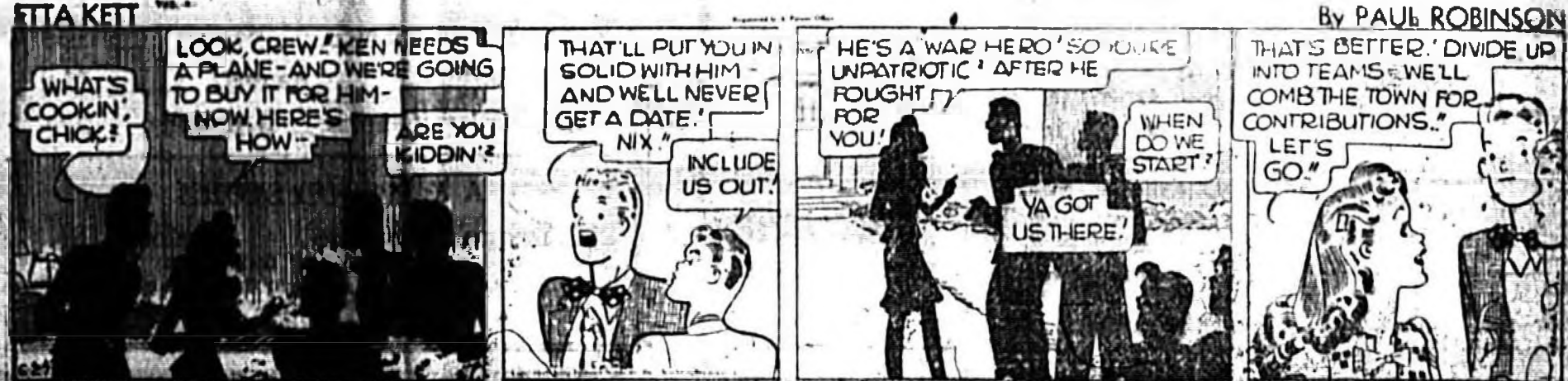
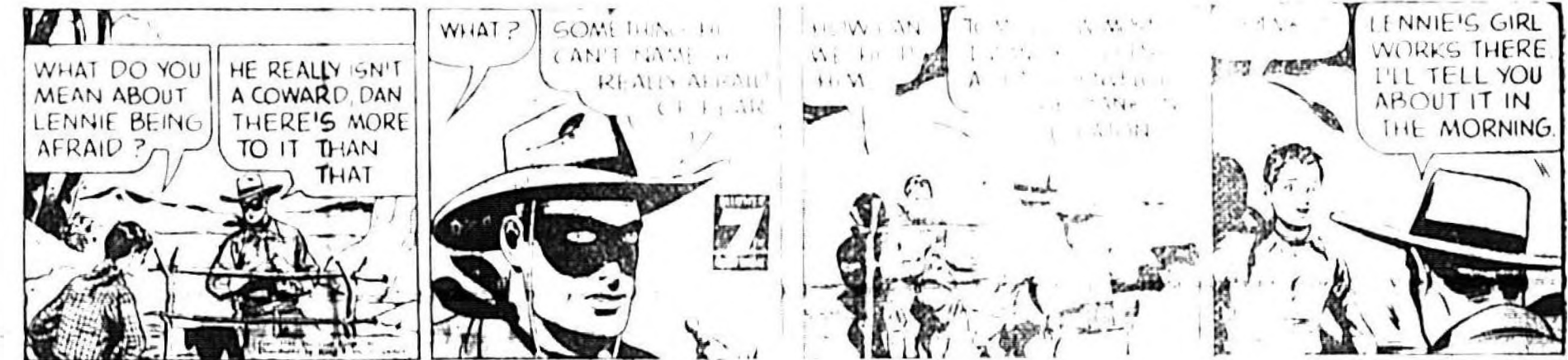
