Nixon And Other Tasks After Vietnam

WASHINGTON — At home and abroad this is the in-between time for President Nixon.

In between war and peace in Vietnam, in between the present and the restructured government he hopes to create, in between an unbalanced and balanced full employment

He is even in between two worlds - the coldwar world of the past and the emerging new post cold-war world that is still only dimly perceived Ronald Ziegler, White House press

secretary, has called it a period of transition. In essence it is much like the time the President spent after election in 1968 when his first administration was planned from a suite atop the Hotel Pierre overlooking Central Park in New York City.

This time his favorite vantage point is the presidential retreat at Camp David in Maryland's Catoctin Mountains.

There White House aides, top advisers and special guests converge daily, clattering in by helicopter or driving up the winding trail on the mountaintop roost where goals, priorities and blueprints for the next four years are being laid

The full outline of what those plans call for is far from clear but some mountaintops are pushing through the fog.

One obviously is a much leaner government Mr. Nixon has left little doubt that with or without cooperation from Congress he is going to cut back federal employment - perhaps 10 per cent across the board. He is also hoping to combine agencies, bureaus and functions; rework federal programs and restructure the decision-making process for both foreign and domestic policy.

In foreign affairs this is going to mean fewer American troops abroad. U.S. force strength in

Puerto Ricans Like Ties With U.S.

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico - Puerto Ricans want to keep their ties with the United States. They do not want to become another one of the mininations that stud the Caribbean and other less-developed regions of the world.

The voters made that clear in the recent elections when they gave the opposition Popular Democratic Party an upset victory over the New Progressive Party. The Popular Democrats support Puerto Rico's existing

commonwealth status and the New Progressives, statehood within the American Union. The three pro-independence parties that were on the Nov. 7 ballot, together, managed to poll less than four per

cent of the vote. Puerto Rico has a special relationship with the United States. Reference books describe Puerto Rico as a selfgoverning territory or a semiautonomous territory of the United States. Puerto Ricans are fond of using the word

state of U.S. citizens, not a territory or a possession." Rafael Hernandez Colon, governor-elect and head of the Popular Democrats, has promised to ask the Congress of the United States to make some changes in the somewhat vaguely defined commonwealth status, and that apparently appealed to more people than either statehood or in-

The federal government in Washington is in charge of foreign affairs and defense of this island, otherwise Puerto Rico has a wider latitude in runnung its own affairs than is enjoyed by states. Puerto Ricans enjoy all the rights and obligations of U.S. citizenship, except that they do not pay federal income taxes, nor do they have a voting representative in Congress, nor vote in presidential elections. The commonwealth income tax is equivalent to the

federal tax, and must be paid to the commonwealth govern-

ment. The island also enjoys tax benefits and other fiscal advantages that have nourished industrialization and attracted many factories. These benefits would vanish with statehood or independence. The U.S. Congress has taken the position that Puerto Ricans are free to adopt the status they like and has

promised to grant that status supported by the majority of The last plebiscite, in 1967, gave statehood 38.9 per cent of the vote and commonwealth 60.5 per cent.

In the 1972 elections, pro-independence leaders hoped to attract enough voters to make a good showing at the polls. But the three pro-independence parties got a total of only about 3.5 per cent of the popular vote.

PGA rivalries. He has yet to be fined or even admonished publicly. Yet Trevino was fined \$700 for guitting after nine holes of the third round of the Sahara Invitational last Oct. 28 and another \$150 for noting that tournament officials were not enforcing the rules preventing a delay of play

The least Dey could have done was to look the other way, especially since Trevino apologized to the PGA and Sahara tournament officials for his behavior Trevino deserved something more

considerate than a public spanking from Dey. The little Mexican-American since 1968 has given pro golf a new dimension by closing the communication gap between player and gallery. Trevino came along about the time American sportsgoers were

tiring of the haughtiness of Jack Nicklaus, and the woodenness of most pros as they strode down the fairways, apparently unaware that anybody was within a mile of them. Trevino works hard at his trade, despite all the aura of a gay

himself. Lee competed in 31 tournaments this year up to late October-more than any of the socalled superstars and more than many of the lean-and-hungry pros who must play every week they can

For his efforts he earned \$214,805 Nicklaus, with \$290,542. Trevino won three tour trournaments and the British Open and averaged about \$7,000 in winnings per tournament. Pro golf has been good to Trevino. But only because he has been good to it and played well enough to win or be up close to the top week after

Nixon, Kissinger Meet Again On Stalled Talks

By FRANK CORMIER Associated Press Writer

CAMP DAVID, Md. (AP) - President Nixon scheduled his third meeting in as many days with Henry A. Kissinger today, possibly as a prelude to a showdown with the South Vietnamese on terms of a proposed Vietnam ceasefire.

Nixon, who flew to his Maryland mountain retreat here Sunday night after spending the weekend in New York City, arranged to confer during the afternoon with Kissinger, his chief negotiator to the secret Vietnam peace talks in

The meetings came amid speculation by administration sources that an interruption in the Paris peace talks may mean the United States has decided to tell South Vietnam that no more concessions can be won from North Vietnam in a ceasefire agreement.

Administration officials had said as late as Friday that Nixon would not meet Duc, and the apparent change of mind was regarded by other sources as significant.

Some observers suspected that a decision by Le Duc Tho, Hanoi's chief negotiator, to remain in Paris while Kissinger returned here for consultations indicated the main negotiating problem is between the United States and

Administration sources said that if the talks between Kissinger and Tho had reached an insurmountable barrier, the negotiations would have been broken off indefinitely as in the past, rather than being rescheduled for Dec. 4.

Nixon is expected to spend most, if not all, of the week at Camp David, dealing with the Vietnam negotiations and his plans for reorganizing the federal bureaucracy.
