WASHINGTON, Sept. 11.—A new route for the flight of the army world fliers from Washington to Seattle, announced Wednesday by the war department, includes the following itinerary for the world fliers: Washington, Dayton, Ohio; Chicago, Ill.; Omaha, Neb.; St. Joseph, Mo.; Muskogee, Okla.; Dallas, Texas; El Paso, Texas; Tucson, Arizona; San Diego, Los Angeles, and San Francisco, Eugene, Oregon; and Seattle, Wash.

Mayor Forrest Lake, speaking at a recent meeting of the Chamber of Commerce, urged a whole-hearted support of the bond issue which will be before the voters on Sept. 22. He pointed out that passage of the issue by a big majority will have a big influence on the sale of the bonds besides adding moral support to the commissioners in their action in ordering the election, two weeks away, for providing funds to extend the present sewerage system, to acquire a city cemetery, to build a jail, to continue paving program and add more money to the refunding fund.

BUSINESS MAN TAKES ISSUE WITH PEARMAN

Raffield Declares Secretary Either Trying to Fan Flame of Prejudice or to Prove It is Daytime When Sun Shines

Speaks To Kiwanis Club On Wednesday

In a tall before the Kiwanis Club at its weekly luncheon at the Montezuma Hotel Wednesday, A. Raffield, took issue with R. W. Pearnman, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, in regard to a statement published by the latter last week in which it was pointed out that Sanford is a distinct American city, free from foreign influence.

"The secretary either tried to prove that when the sun shines it is daytime or he gives his energies to fanning the flame of prejudice," declared Mr. Raffield in his talk.

Mr. Raffield then pointed out that America is composed of all nations that all its citizens, foreign or native born, have the right to enjoy its advantages and to shape its history.

When asked to make a reply to Mr. Pearnman's statement, Mr. Pearnman stated that he would have one ready for Friday's issue.

Mr. Raffield remarks in part were as follows: "Fellow Kiwanians, I believe that in the midst of our daily strife, rushing events and turmoil, it is well to stop for a while and subject ourselves to a self-examination to endeavor to find out the cause behind the vital problems that confront us today."

"We have today some 2,000,000,000 people in the great human family; we are divided into about 70 nations. Each is working out its own form of government, according to its own ideals of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

"Here in America we have set up a plan of life based upon the principle of giving to every man, woman and child the largest possible degree of opportunity for success. The great world struggle in which the United States of America was involved ended a few years ago, and instead of returning to normalcy, as was the slogan of our late President Harding, we find ourselves drifting on an ever-increasing tide of class distinction, distrust, prejudice and hatred."

Last week I read in The Sanford Herald a statement by the secretary of the local Chamber of Commerce, that Sanford is a distinct American city, free from foreign influence. The secretary's effort to prove that when the sun shines it is daytime or he gives his energies to fanning the flame of prejudice."

"What is America? It is a great composite people molded out of all the races of the earth and down on the map of the United States on the globe. Here we have come from 200 years ago, or whether our ship be the May-Lapland or yesterday to work out our destiny on a vast continent with natural resources sufficient to solve the whole human problem."

Fifty-two Englishmen can be put down on the map of the United States. Ireland and Switzerland combined would be lost in New York state; Scotland and Belgium combined would just about cover Ohio; (Continued on Page 3)

Formal Opening New Sanford Athletic Field Is Held This Afternoon

Declared To Be Best Equipped Field In State And Includes Modern Features

Seating Capacity Grandstand 1,000

Cost of Tract of Land And Construction Is Given at \$35,000

Sanford's new municipal baseball park and athletic field constructed at a cost of approximately \$35,000, is declared by those who have had its construction in charge, to be the most modern and best equipped in the state of Florida.

At a cost of \$15,000 the City Commission purchased two tracts of land totaling approximately 16 acres, 10 of which have been enclosed by a fence eight feet high. This gives ample room within the enclosure for the baseball diamond, football field, under track and play ground for children.

The new field is situated about a mile from the business section and is bordered by Celery and Melonville Avenues. Two paved highways lead to it from the city making it accessible by automobile in a few minutes.

The entire field has been thoroughly leveled, three-inch tile, running north and south have been laid at intervals of 25 feet for the entire length of the field. The system insures the whole park of perfect drainage, it is declared by the engineers in charge.

Baseball Diamond. The baseball diamond, constructed under the supervision of Bert E. Chapman, former major league ball player, is equipped not only with the drainage system but also with an irrigation system. The irrigation system has been contained and both are connected with a 12-inch pipe which leads to a drain pipe on Celery Avenue. At the connection with the drain, this pipe has a foot pocket which has a valve in it that may be opened or closed, making it possible to drain or irrigate the diamond at any time. It is declared that the field may be drained in 15 minutes time after a brief rain.

The diamond is of standard dimensions, having been modeled after National League playing fields. It has a six-foot circle, elevated five inches with clay above the grass infield, which serves as a pitcher's box. The infield is sown heavily with Bermuda grass to the base lines. Three foot clay base flanks the diamond on the home to first and home to third base lines. Just back of the infield averaging about 25 feet is surfaced with red clay. The outfield and the remainder of the field is sown in Bermuda grass.

The diamond has been laid off with foul lines and coaching lines marked by clay paths. Persons visiting the field within the past few weeks, since its completion have marveled at its construction and many words of praise have been spoken upon the enterprise of the commissioners and of the skilled workers, who had charge of its construction. The women also are called on to register for it is said that if this country ever engages in another war, the women will be asked to volunteer for nurses, etc.

"At 4 o'clock tomorrow afternoon every able-bodied man and woman in this county is requested to meet at the armory where they may register and to take part in the exercises," said the mayor. Officers of the local Florida National Guard units have announced that the guardsmen will muster at the armory at 3:45 p. m., where they will form an important part of the parade and will take part in the exercises. Sanford Shrine Club Arranges Program For Day Including Ball Game, Dance

Addresses Will Feature Exercises

Parade Will Form To Drive To Ball Park Early In Afternoon

The formal opening of Sanford's new \$35,000 municipal athletic field will be held this afternoon when a picked local baseball team will clash with an independent Orlando Club in the first of a three or five game series. The ball game forms part of the program of the opening celebration of the field which is being sponsored by the Sanford Shrine Club.

Due to the fact that this afternoon is a half holiday, it is expected by the Shrine Club that the number of people attending the celebration this afternoon will be the largest ever assembled at an athletic contest in this city.

The club states that it has arranged for a gala celebration and that plenty of entertainment will be furnished for everyone. They have prepared, it is said, to take care of the large crowd and give the people their "money's worth."

A large number of people will come from Orlando to attend the ball game. Some have stated definitely that they will be here. Residents of Eustis, Tavares, Mt. Dora, Leesburg, Deland, Daytona, New Smyrna and people from a number of other cities in this section of the state have declared that their presence can be counted on.

In the several meetings held by the Shrine Club recently, committees have been appointed to look after the various aspects of the day's program so that nothing important has been left out, declared President E. F. Lane of the organization to a representative of The Herald a few days ago.

The program will begin with a parade, headed by the Globe Trotters' Orchestra, which will form at the corner by the First National Bank Building this afternoon at 2:15 o'clock. All Nobles are requested to be on hand at this time with their automobiles to fall in for the parade, stated Mr. Lane.

From the bank the parade will go up Park Avenue to Tenth Street to Sanford Avenue, south on Sanford Avenue to Celery Avenue and then east on Celery Avenue to the athletic field, it was learned.

The ball game will begin promptly at 3 o'clock, it is announced. Managers of both teams promise a good and interesting game and declare that those who attend will not be disappointed.

Mr. Lane stated that the game has been advertised widely in all of the counties adjoining Seminole and that a record crowd is expected to gather at the opening celebration of the athletic field. He says that many of the Orlando people who ordinarily go to the beaches, on picnics, etc., have expressed intention of attending the ball game this afternoon and staying over for the Shrine dance at Lako Mary tonight. Many Sanford people also will remain in town for the game.

Old baseball enthusiasts of this city have declared that they believe the opening activities in the national pastime between Orlando and Sanford is having more influence in drawing a large crowd for the celebration than anything else. They state that the people here and in Orlando remember the rivalry that existed in all ball games during the two years Sanford was in the Florida State League and for that reason are looking forward to this afternoon's (Continued on Page 3)

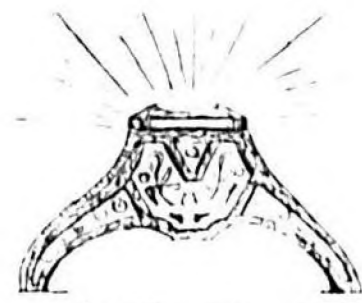

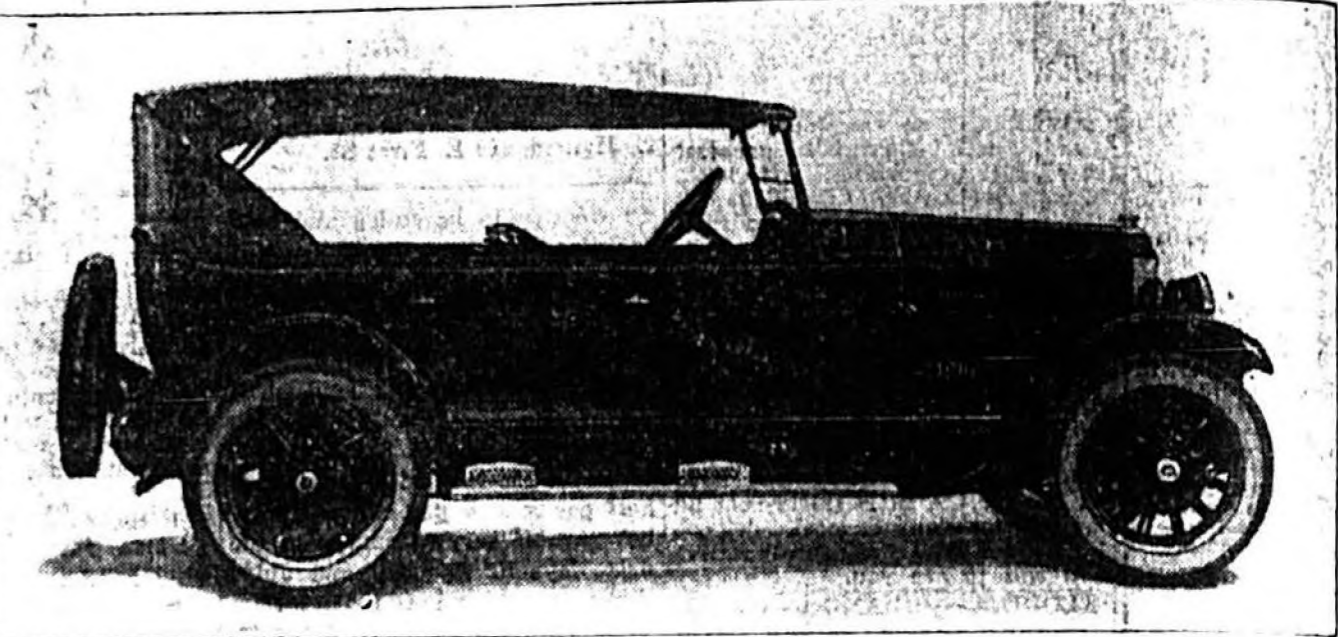
