WASHINGTON, D. C., March 17.—I gladly avail myself of the opportunity of the invitation tendered to me by the International News Service to attend my greetings and those of my government, in the city of the United States on the occasion of the National Festival of Ireland—St. Patrick's Day.

This is a happy occasion when those of the Irish race throughout the world join together in expressing their attachment to their mother country, the downy land, which is the wellspring of their life and their affection of the ideals and traditions that she has maintained throughout the centuries.

It is in this devotion on the part of Americans of the Irish race and sympathy with the Irish people's struggle for freedom that is largely due to the newly found freedom that the Irish Free State has achieved, a freedom by which she hopes to develop further her civilization along the lines of her ancient culture and to blend in other civilizations that she has inherited from the past.

Wisner's main fault was his inability to locate the plate and each inning saw men on the bases with hitters coming up.

Louis Koupal relieved Wisner in the fifth and went through the rest of the game. Three runs were scored off him and a walk, two safe smashes and an error.

From the Indians' standpoint, the game did lots of good. It showed the club is yet in need of training, that batting practice will be longer each day from now on and that in Warstler, the aforementioned, the club has a lad who will probably be with them during the coming season.

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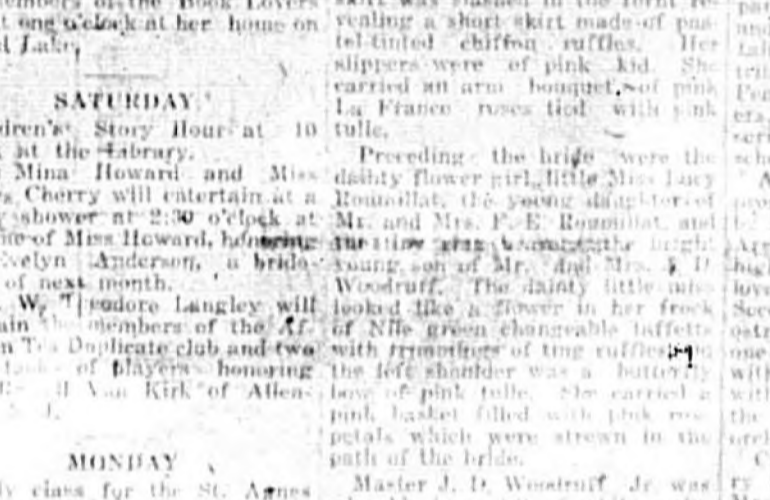
