



vote seems equally indicated. In submitting these comments, however, we do not and would not appear as authoritative on such a technical matter as constitutional revision. But we would let our readers know that these conclusions were arrived at after study and conversations with those who are versed in the legal, political and prac-

tical issues involved. Among those proposals which have already drawn fire is that which would allow two-terms for a governor and create the office of lieutenant-governor. Included in HJR 1-2X also is the appointment of of a county superintendent of schools rather than Then vote.

Seminole County has already rejected the "appointment" process twice. There is also strong sentiment against Article III in HJR 1-2X which would reduce the number of state senators from the 48 now allowed to not less than 30 or more than 40. Seminole County now suffers without direct senatorial representation and any further reduction would be apt to cut this even lower.

Such reduction, we believe, would tend to create larger districts covering more counties and portions of counties. It would result in poorer direct representation for our county and would increase the cost of

Thus we would urge that all citizens pay attention to all discussions on the new constitution. Sift the speeches for nuggets of fact. Assay them in your own furnace of personal and individual knowledge.
