

CLEVELAND, Dec. 17. -

(AP) - A hundred million ment is today's answer of the steel industry to the contention five years ago that it then was already far overbuilt. The biggrat item in the program of new steel mill equipment is that of United States Steel Corporation which has pledged \$40,000,000 worth of modernization in the coming year. Huge plants and new processes had given the industry a capacity five times as great as depression time demands for its products. Dosens of plants were abut down and others were working on a part time basis. Today, the new program shows how far the situation has changed.
