News" for letting us know how the planning production and operation of the new Florida Power & Light's plant on the St. Johns River has won distinguished recognition. That it has done so in the presently controversial field of ecological achievement is really not surprising, but it is welcome and we would

share it with our readers. . One of five electric utilities, FPL was cited by the Electrical World magazine for "environmental action." The specific achievement was in guarding against thermal pollution.

Reduced to simple definition this means used for cooling in the plant was recognized and is now dispelled by an ingenious "completely diosed system of cooling."

Key factor is a 950 acre take being created on FPL property, largely of a swamp nature. Not water from the plant goes through a canal the FPL lake, where it is to be dissipated into the atmosphere and the same lake water returns to the plant for a continuous flow of

Sounds simple and it is. But what is hidden in this happy planning is the effort of an important and mammoth electric utility to be in the forefront of a drive, now gathering force, to see that the ecological nature of our Sunshine State remains unimpaired by technological progress which is also essential.
