

# City gives chamber \$10K boost

The Sanford Chamber of the city of Senford in the upcoming fiscal year in order to hire additional personnel. Commerce will receive \$35,000 from

During a budget work session Wednesday, city commissioners approved the distribution of funds— a \$10,000 increase from previous years - based on a four-year plan presented by the chamber.

The decision to increase chamber

funding comes after commission eliminated 17 city jobs last month in order to overcome a \$1.65 million deficit in the 2003-2004 budget.

\$35,000 donation comes amid budget cuts, job losses at City Hall Chamber of Commerce. "We want to be a partner with the city and help it

"I think they are doing a good job," said Commissioner Velma Williams. "I feel we needed to increase their funding some..."

Chamber officials had originally requested \$50,000 from the city,

which would have doubled the city's current contribution of \$25,000. Under the proposed fouryear plan, this money would be followed by additional allocations of \$35,000 in 2005 and \$20,000 in 2006. After 2006, the chamber would relin-

quish rights to request funding from

Commission, however, was unable to justify doubling the funding this year, and swiftly settled on the \$35,000. According to Mayor Brady Lessard, the city still wants to hold the chamber to its four-year plan and "wean the chamber from needing city funds."

"This would have given us a big jump start in becoming the biggest chamber in Seminole County," said See Boost, Page 7

Angelia Gordon, president and chief executive officer of the Sanford Chamber of Commerce. "We want to grow during this important time. We think it [the funding] is an excellent

investment for the city.
"We're grateful for what the city has done - especially with their budget constraints," said Gordon. "In the perfect world, we would have received the \$50,000, but this will definitely help."

According to Gordon, the sole purpose for the requested increase was to assist in hiring additional personnel, including an event direc-

# wner of senior home arrested

A phone call to Florida Abuse Hotline shut down an

ted living facility Tuesday.

The owner/operator, Ruth Maria Soto, 58, of Vineland Road in Orlando, was arrested by Seminole County Sheriff's deputies.

Soto is accused of exploitation of an elderly/disabled adult, which is a third-degree felony, but posted \$1,000 bail Wednesday afternoon for release from the Seminole The Eden Park retirement home, located on Eden Park Avenue in Altamonte Springs, has been in business with a

valid state license for several years. However, Soto has been the owner for a little more than a year. During this time, she allegedly used a client's funds, intended for patient case, to purchase time for her own vehicle. In addition, Soto transferred \$23,000 from the vic-

tim's retirement funds to an account she helped the 62-year-old open.

The Sheriff's Office also believes Soto used the money to purchase a John Deere riding lawn mower, worth over \$2,000, and a pressure washer to maintain the Eden Park

Because of the victim's age and mental condition, the offense is punishable by up to five years in prison.

Pive other residents, four of which lack the capacity to care for themselves, were transferred to other facilities.

Over the past year, the home has been cited numerous times by state inspectors. Offenses include improper storage of medication, improper dispensing of medication and inadequate staff training. The Florida Agency for Health Case Administration will decide whether the facility will keep its license to operate.

### Seminole prosecutor is tops in Florida





Vile vandalism: Five weeks. That's how long it took for some misguided "artists" to deface the new Vigilante Memorial Park dedicated May 30 out at the airport.

Patty Mahany, vice president of the Airport Memorial Committee which created the park, said Friday that vandals had left their mark during the past week. She doesn't think the damage will be too difficult to clean up. Any vandalism is a slap in the face to those who worked so hard in



building a beautiful Around the Clock park. It also doesn't say much for the respect these petty Picassos have for the men and women the park is intended to remember.

would restrict access to those who would like to visit the park. It also means the committee has to spend money and security measures when those funds could be better spent on future amenities.





tremendous to know you can make a positive difference in a community. I'm gratified to be able to do my part to make our communi-

ties safer," Hastings said.
Hastings, 47, heads the
Repeat Offender Division in Wolfinger's Seminole County office where he has been the division chief for the past 13 years. He is one of the most successful prosecutors on Wolfinger's staff, with a 95 percent trial conviction rate for the past 10

years. His record with murder cases is even more impressive. Of the 21 defendants charged with first-degree murder to which he has been assigned, six have been found guilty at trial and 15 have entered guilty pleas, making for a 100 percent conviction rate.

"Despite his incredible record as a prosecutor in the courtroom, it's not just his outstanding trial record that Tom is being recognized for. It is his combination of integrity, community serv-ice, and dedication to excellence in everything he does that has brought him this honor," said Wolfinger, adding that all the while, Hastings remains a humble public servant.

The Gene Berry Award is given annually to a Florida prosecutor for "outstanding prosecutorial service" in pursuit of justice. The award is presented in honor of Assistant State Attorney Eugene Berry who, in 1982, was mortally shot by the wife of a man Gene sent to prison on drug charges.

A plaque bearing the names of the yearly recipients hangs in the governor's office.

Since 1989, Hastings, working with Lake Brantley High School, has spearheaded a mentoring program that leads students through a study of the judicial system, culminating with a mock trial. Fast . IF . nominos!

I received a magazine in the mail this week - it was a cooking publication. With it was a nice and friendly letter thanking me for ordering it, and telling me this would be the first issue in my subscription. On the back was a "special offer." If I would increase my subscription from one to two years and pay in advance, I could save approximately 14 cents.

Of course they wanted me to send in at least the first year's subscription payment immediately whether or not I wanted that second year. They even supplied me with an addressed envelope. Of course I would have to supply the stamp - they weren't that gen-

There was also a statement included that this publication does not accept advertise-ment, that it is strictly published through the generosity of subscribers like me.

No advertisements? There were no ads as appear in other publications, but each article certainly had its share of commercial products included.

Don't tell me these product names were put in these stories out of the kindness of that publisher's heart.

There were also a number of articles which were not fully complete - suggesting the reader send in a subscription to another publication for further information.

How did they get my name and address? I found references to another publication which I do subscribe to, so it must be from their mailing list.

My point here is - how many unsuspecting people are going to get this letter and automatically send in a year's subscription - possibly two year's worth if they want to save that 14 cents. They are clearly being duped - lied to - scammed robbed of their money.

Even if that magazine they sent me would help me win the lottery, I wouldn't subscribe to it. Yes, I sent their letter requesting immediate payment back to them - and you can bet I did-n't send any payment. What I did send, I'll leave to your imag-

But WATCH IT folks. This, no doubt, isn't the only publisher out there trying to fool you into thinking someone ordered this subscription.

Before you send anyone even one single penny - check what it is for - and if you are not certain, ask someone else to advise you. It's a dog-eat-dog world out there and this is one dog you don't need.









# Equal treatment for Florida taxpayers

By Rep. Tom Feeney (R-Oviedo)

While toting up your federal income deductions, you'll notice that state and local income taxes are deductible. But that's worthless information since Florida - like seven other states - shuns a state income tax.

Instead, we rely on a sales tax to fund our state government. So you search in vain for a similar deduction for your sales tax burden. "What gives?" you wonder, "After all a tax is a tax.

Good question! Why don't you ask your two U.S. senators?

Academics and politicians debate about whether a tax system should tax a person's income through

an income tax or consumption through a sales tax. If you're interested in economic growth and job creation, you should favor a consumption tax that rewards savings and investment.

America has 50 experiments in this tax debate as each state designs its tax system. Forty-two states impose a state income tax - some incredibly onerous and prompting many to flee to Florida. Eight bastions of sanity refuse to impose an income tax. Florida's choice seems well-grounded. We lead the nation in job creation during this time of uncertain economic growth.

The federal government should respect this deci-sion and allow you to deduct your share of

Florida's sales tax - again, a tax is a tax. But you can't deduct your state tax burden while your brotherin-law living in New York

As a freshman congressman, I'm working to remove this fundamental disparity that unfairly penalizes Floridians. I've teamed up with 75 other republican and democrat colleagues to cosponsor H.R. 720, the Sales Tax Equity Act of 2003, which would restore a sales tax deduction to federal taxpayers residing in states without a state income tax. And I, along with 15 other Florida congressmen, have urged Florida House Speaker Byrd and Florida Senate President King to pass a resolution urging

Restoring this needed fairness in state tax deductibility would relieve stress on Florida family budgets. A family of four making \$55,000 would gain an additional \$1081 deduction resulting in over \$300 of tax savings. A single mother with one child and a \$35,000 income could deduct an additional \$641.

Currently, members of the U.S. Senate and House are meeting in a conference committee to settle differences in proposed family tax relief. Senators negotiating this issue are waiting for a signal from Florida's two senators. But so far, senators Graham and Nelson are still studying the issue. I've taken a stand. Your voice can help educate them.

### Blacks must speak out against Mbeki's intransigence on AIDS'

South Africa, a success by standards of the continent, nevertheless struggles with one of the world's largest

populations of people infected with HIV - 4.7 million, or nearly a tenth of its popula-tion. If not curbed, the disease will wreck the country's chances for prosper-ity and stability.

During his visit this week, President Bush highlighted his pledge of \$15 billion over five years to fight the disease. But it will take more than money to beat

the epidemic in South Africa. It will also require exorcising the demons of denial that have overwhelmed common sense in President Thabo Mbeki. For reasons that remain

unfathomable, Mbeki, a Western-educated economist, refuses to fight the disease vigorously. Instead, over the years, he has expressed doubt that HIV causes AIDS, cast aspersions on Western medical practices, courted know-nothings who claim AIDS doesn't exist, and castigated whites for allegedly spreading false stereotypes about South Africans' sexual

just a few years ago, Mbeki's curious refusal to face medical facts was little more than a distraction -

fodder for gossip among ...... global public healt advocates and Africa experts. Since the price of AIDS medicines a then exor there was little chance South Africa could have afforded to treat its infected population,

> But that has changed. Under intense international pressure, major pharmaceutical

companies have essentially allowed their patents to be copied by generic manufacturers, making AIDS drugs available in impoverished countries at a fraction of the cost here. One generic manufacturer offers anti-retrovirals for about 55 cents a day. With help from Western donors, including the United States, South Africa could provide drugs

to most of its HIV patients.
Inexplicably, Mbeki continues to dawdle, allowing bureaucratic hurdles to interfere with widespread dissem-ination of AIDS drugs. Last year, Mbeki's Cabinet finally lifted a ban on giving antiretrovirals to rape victims

and pledged to provide the drugs to pregnant women, which would curb transmission from mother to child. But he has done little to provide drugs to others infected with HIV.

congress to act now.

Inside the country, Mbeki's intransigence has prompte civil disobedience. Even Nelson Mandela has chided Mbeki for his irresponsible

approach to AIDS.
Some AIDS activists were disappointed that Bush didn't publicly criticise Mbeki's reluctance to confront the epidemic.

"There's no evidence that President Bush's visit advanced the South African government's thinking," Mark Heywood, an official of Treatment Action Campaign, a prominent anti-AIDS group, told The New York Times. "We are still stuck with a government policy that is at odds with medical thinking universally.

But this is a lobbying effort more appropriately taken up by black American activists, groups such as TransAfrica Forum and Africa Action. Those organizations, among others, were prominent in the battle to end apartheid, so they have credibility on issues affecting South Africa. They ought to denounce

Mbeki's willfully dangerous

intransigence.
By African standards,
South Africa has a relatively well-developed infrastructure. Its government could deliver AIDS medications throughout the country, even to rural areas. And a broadat network of radio and television could readily transmit a broad public health campaign encouraging condom use. The country ought to lead the fight against AIDS in Africa.

Instead, an estimated 600 South Africans die of AIDS every day. If their deaths were caused by a racist white government, black Americans would be marching in the streets of Washington, D.C., demand-ing action. Instead, Mbeld's foolishness has drawn only

muted criticism. In his refusal to use the tools at hand to rescue his people, Mbeki's behavior is tantamount to genocide. It's time for black American activists to say so.

Americans will gladly support their president when he attacks nations that sponsor or harbor terrorists. We will even back him in a preemptive war against a country that might attack us., But when we start sending troops around the world to stabilize nations that, if left to disintegrate, might become breeding grounds for terror, it's a step too far for most Americans.

Why are we suddenly sending troops to Africa?

The Bush administration is is touring the continent and wants to have something to offer the leaders he meets?

Does the desire to satisfy global public opinion play a

Or do his nostrils smell oil in West Africa?

None of the above is justification for sending American troops to yet another foreign venue. Bush will need all the patience we can extend to him as he asks us to put up with troops dying in Iraq while other units fight in Afghanistan, the

Philippines and other places where terrorism threatens. It is foolish to use up our tolerance with an adventure in Liberia.

Nor should Bush put his trust in limitations on the mission in Liberia. One good fire-fight and the United States is committed. Remember the reply of French Marshal Foch to British general who asked, in 1914, what was the minimum British military contribution that could effectively assist France at the start of World War

"One British soldier," he is reputed to have answered. And we will see to it that he

Africa is a quagmire if ever there was one. The civil wars there are eternal and unending.

They have no start and no finish. The cycles of revenge make any assessment of right and wrong, good or evil, almost

It is not our fight, and we are unwise to, in the words of John Quincy Adams, "go abroad in search of dragons to destroy."

Besides, the U.S. Army is not the only force in the world. We should let the African nations and European powers take the lead while we husband our resources to fight in heavy combat or where our presence alone can do the trick.

The growing potential of West Africa as a source of oil should not tempt us into military action. We must make sure never to do what the left accuses us of doing each day - trad-

ing blood for oil. The sudden interest in this oil-producing region might leave many skeptical and troubled.

Bush must remember that a large minority of Americans, on both the left and right, are isolationists. In a survey for President Clinton, I found the exact percentage to be upwards of 35, evenly divided between

Bush will need Americans to stay focused and alert as we face the common danger of terror and work together in far flung corners of the globe to counter

He does himself and his cause no service by asking us to invest in conflicts remote from our vital interests and far from our national mission.
