Reds Stepping Up War Effort

GUAM (AP) — President Johnson's avowed intent to focus his Guam conference on the works of peace clashed today into a call by Premier Nguyen Cao Ky for a sharp escalation of the Vietnam war.

Johnson also got a report from his own close advisers that the Communists are doing some escalating of their own. At the first formal conference session, atop the highest hill on this Pacific island, Ky in his opening remarks stated that the United States is planning to send more American troops to Vietnam—above those already planned—on about specific military measures.

Rusk made one announcement to newsmen: He said Johnson will nominate Henry Cabot Lodge, who is resigning as ambassador to Saigon, to be a full-time ambassador at large, a sort of diplomatic troubleshooter. In that position he will change places with Ellsworth Bunker, who is replacing him in Saigon.

Rusk said the emphasis in the first round of talks was on the civilian side — political process, pacification, economic matters. He said talk of military affairs was confined to a brief report. He stressed that, as he sees it, the government of South Vietnam is in full accord with the search for peace.

McNamara said despite the new North Vietnam offensive moves, their efforts have been unsuccessful, their morale suffering and their losses are running 90 per cent higher than a year ago.

Westmoreland said that in the past year, Communist losses from all causes have doubled. The number of prisoners taken has increased fourfold, defectors have doubled, their losses of weapons are two and a half times higher, and only half of their 154 maneuver battalions are fully combat effective.

Johnson had indicated in advance that his main purpose at the Guam conference would be to discuss the works of peace. He told the opening session of the two-nation conference that more effective efforts are required on all fronts — military, social, economic and political.

By responding by rejecting the idea of ever admitting representatives of the National Liberation Front—the political arm of the Viet Cong—to any coalition government that might take power in Saigon after peace talks.

The dapper little premier was equally pointed in a series of questions all in effect calling for a major escalation of the U. S. war effort.

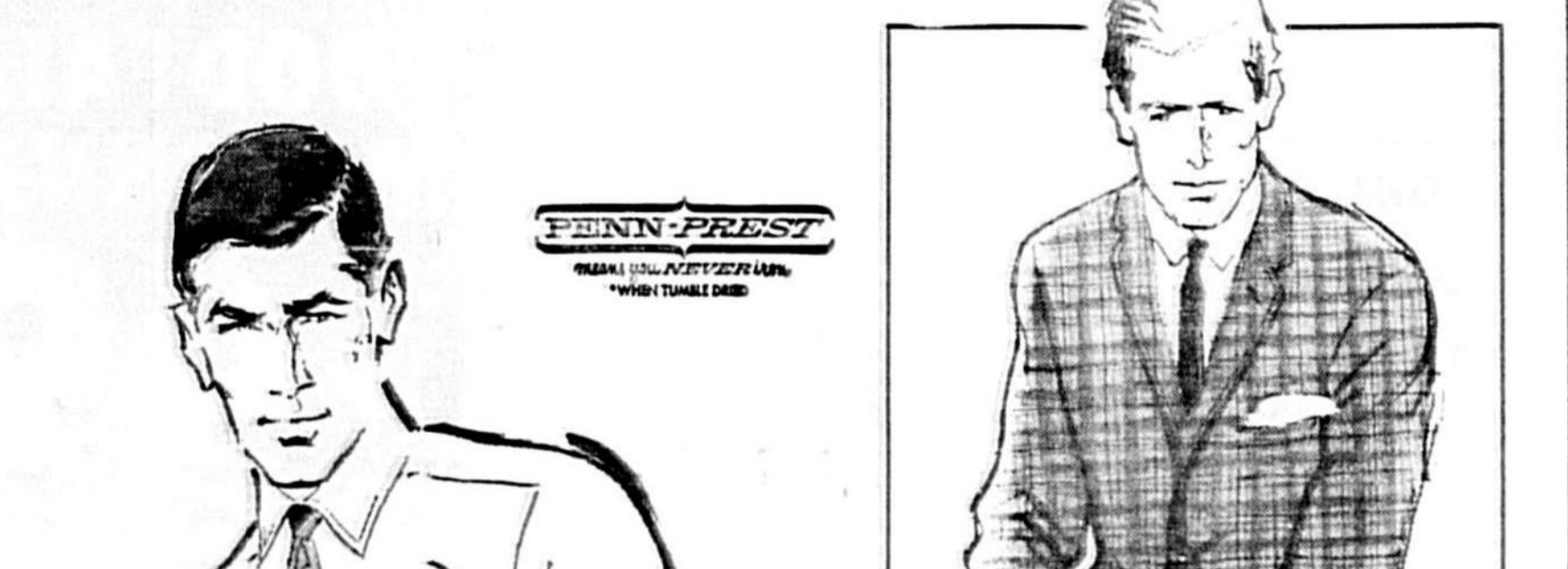

Mental Health Clinic Aims Outlined

A new mental health clinic will be discussed by a guest panel at a meeting of the South Seminole Civic Council at the South Seminole Bank. On the panel were Dr. Frank Leone, director of the County Health Department; Dr. Michael Gutman, clinic psychiatrist, and Mrs. Barbara Dennison, mental health worker.

The importance of catching cases early before permanent damage is done was emphasized. The clinic presently needs \$6,000 a year to continue. Donations have been received from some groups and individuals, as well as some of the patients. Some support is received from the state and the Mental Health Association.

Dr. Leone expressed the hope that the county commission would make some funds available to support the mental health program in the county. He pointed out that approximately 50 per cent of the cases come from Seminole.

Mrs. Dennison told of a heartbreaking case of a young girl, slightly mentally retarded, who was confined in a institution for the lack of anti-social behavior.

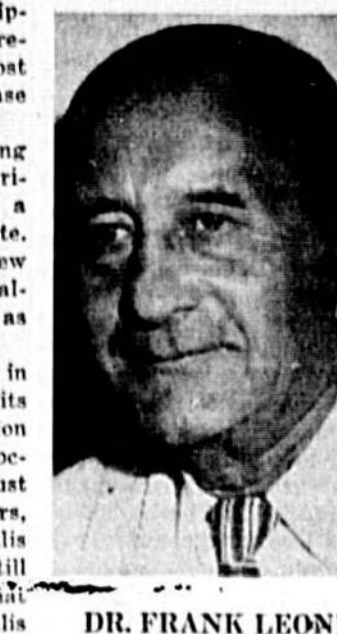
Educate Teenagers About VD - Dr. Leone

Maybe the school board ought to do a little more of that. Meeting behind closed doors? No, soul-searching.

A fact sheet released by Dr. Leone states that at least one of every 250 teenage boys and girls was reported infected with gonorrhea in 1966, while a actually non-reported case would have brought the total four times this figure.

In Florida, in 1966, 20.8 of every 100,000 persons tested had primary or secondary syphilis. The rate was 96.1 in the 15-19 year old bracket.

"Gonorrhea, now truly in epidemic proportions, takes its toll each year in one million new cases, with 80 per cent occurring among teenagers. Just within the past five years, cases of infectious syphilis have almost tripled, yet still more shocking is the fact that the incidence of both syphilis and gonorrhea has increased approximately 200 per cent among teenagers in this same number of years."



"The first obstacle to educating V.D. is not only the public's apathy but its refusal to acknowledge that it can happen here."

"We must strip from V.D. the nurturing wraps of ignorance, indifference and inaction. Just as the delicate but tenacious spirochete causing syphilis thrives best at normal body temperature and cannot survive in the open air, the 'delicate' subject of V.D.'s contamination makes the spread of V.D. all the more tragic. Why do we not screen thoroughly to the child available and relatively inex-

positive treatment? This indifference or unawareness is attributed to ignorance, carelessness and relaxing moral standards.
