Ford Ready To Sign Trade Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Ford, nursing a stiff "football knee" after skiing holiday, is planning to sign the trade bill and confer with advisers on the CIA controversy and energy problems.

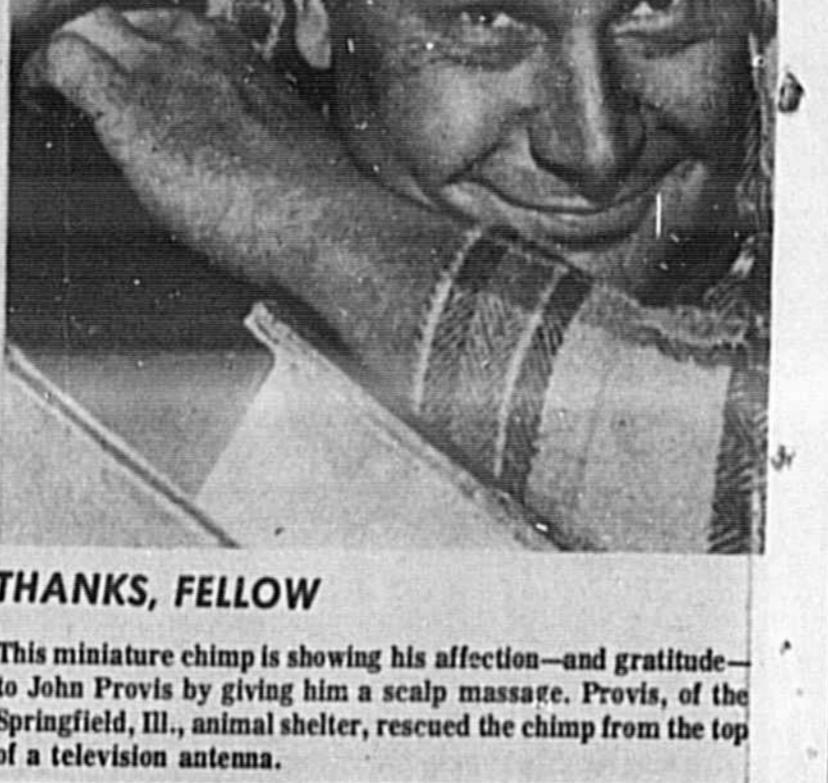

Endangered Lands Issue Looms As Major Struggle

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Agriculture Commissioner Doyle Conner is calling for a moratorium on state acquisition of endangered lands, setting up a major policy test for two incoming Cabinet officers.

Conner said Thursday that he will seek a six-month moratorium on environmental land purchases at next Thursday's meeting of the Cabinet.

Conner, a vigorous opponent of restricting land use without compensating owners, has been in a Cabinet minority on the issue.

His closest ally on the issue, Comptroller Fred Dickinson, was voted out of office and will be replaced Tuesday by Comptroller-elect Gerald Lewis.

FLORIDA IN BRIEF

Power Outages Seen In Rate Hike Hassle

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (AP) — The failure of the Public Service Commission to grant the Florida Power Corp. a \$34.7-million interim rate hike and a \$65.6-million overall increase could lead to power outages, the company says.

Knight Missed Arrest Despite Print Report

MIAMI (AP) — A Miami man who escaped from jail after being charged in the abduction-slaying of a Miami couple spent 17 days in an Arkansas jail on a trespassing charge without being recognized, authorities said.

Thomas Otis Knight, 23, charged with two counts of first-degree murder, false imprisonment and using a weapon to commit a felony, was the object of a nationwide search after he and 10 other prisoners escaped Sept. 19 from the Dade County jail.

Askew Is Urged To Share Power

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Aide Henry Dean proposes that Gov. Reubin Askew share some of his power over Cabinet agendas in an effort to answer objections to proposed Cabinet-rule revisions.

Cabinet aides scheduled a meeting today to consider Dean's proposal. The rules issue arose Thursday, when several aides protested that the rules would give Askew too much power by making him the only person who could defer items on the Cabinet agenda.

Retail Sales Good Despite Slow Holiday

NEW YORK (AP) — Retail sales figures for December have shown better than expected results but not good enough to offset slack buying activity at Christmas, according to the nation's largest retail chains.

In the face of 12 per cent inflation and recession-inspired layoffs in November and early December, buying lagged until retailers took the unusual step of offering pre-Christmas bargains to entice customers into stores.

Auto Makers Hint At More Layoffs

DETROIT (AP) — The nation's auto makers have closed the books on their most tumultuous year since World War II and opened 1975 with announcements of new production cutbacks and hints of more to come.

It was the lowest output since 1963, with the exception of 1970, when General Motors was hit by a 67-day national strike. December production was 357,429 units, or 31 per cent below the 520,000 units of the same month in 1974.

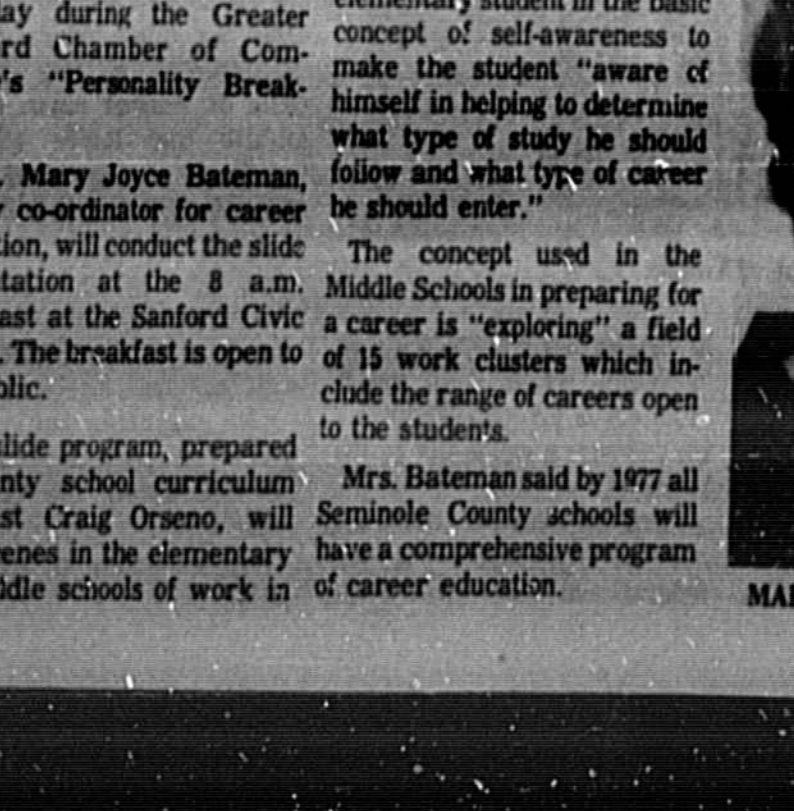

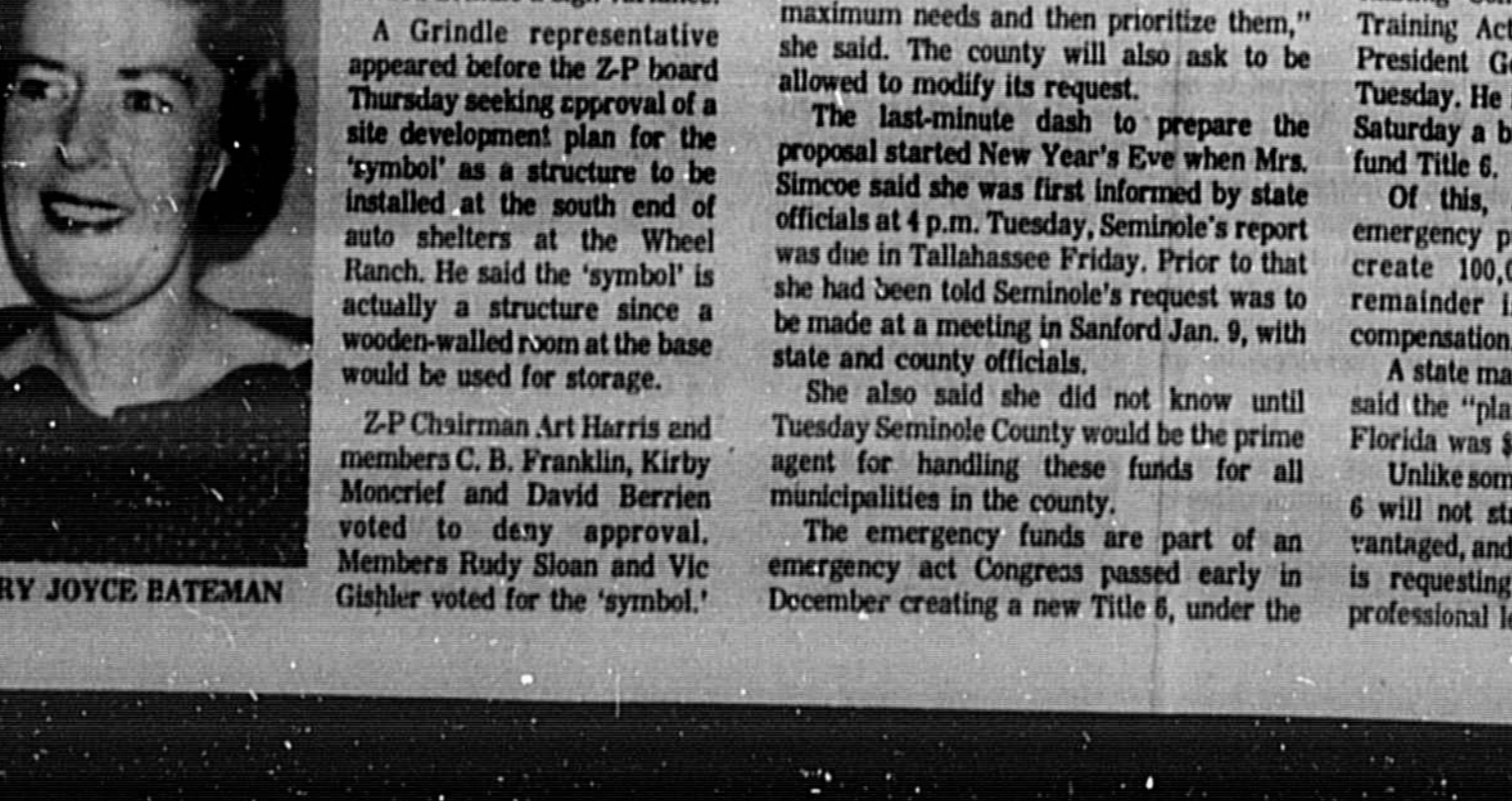
